



A MESSAGE

from

Judge Bernard A. Rosenblatt



The American Zion Commonwealth (Inc.)

New York

September 30, 1921

It is just seven years and twenty days since the American Zion Commonwealth (Inc.) was organized as a corporation under the Laws of the State of New York, and you will find enclosed a financial statement which better than any words from me will give you a picture of its present status. I feel that the time has come for me to give an account of my stewardship as President of the American Zion Commonwealth (Inc.), since its organization, in view of the fact that the recent Zionist Congress, held at Carlsbad, selected me as a member of the World Zionist Executive, which may require my presence in Palestine for some time to come, and therefore, make it impossible for me to give the same close attention, in the future, to the American Zion Commonwealth in this country, as I have given in the past.

The real growth of the American Zion Commonwealth dates back to only about two and one-half years ago, for before that time, our attention was concentrated on the preliminary stages of developing our plans and purposes. In fact, until January, 1919, the total cash assets of the American Zion Commonwealth were less than \$27,000—today it is more than twelve times that amount, and with outstanding contracts amounting to over two and one-half million dollars. Such a progress, in a period of two and one-half years, can be accounted for only on the theory that we have offered something to the Jewish public, which was immediately recognized as a real contribution towards the upbuilding of Palestine. In August 1919, we organized Balfouria—the first American Jewish settlement in Palestine, and the first new colony since the beginning of the great war. We were the first to introduce in Palestine the best and most improved American agricultural machinery, and because of our plan of co-operation with the workmen in Balfouria, we were able to offer to Palestine something of value from the point of view both of business efficiency and a better standard of living for the individual worker. The reports of every returned visitor from Palestine give glowing accounts of our work at Balfouria, which has become a center in Northern Palestine for those who want to study modern agricultural methods.

With our success, we must also regard the difficulties which have beset us throughout, and the obstacles which we must still overcome. It is impossible for an American to grasp the situation in Palestine with regard to land purchase. Indeed, only eleven months ago, it was impossible to purchase any land in Palestine—and we were able to secure Balfouria only because of a contract which was made by the Palestine Land Development Company before the war. Therefore, in spite of the fact that our treasury was growing, and our cash reserve was more than ample, until a relatively short time ago, we were in the position of a rich man who has money to invest, but who cannot take possession of any land (besides Balfouria) because of legal difficulties that have arisen out of the war. But even during the last eleven months, those difficulties have not been entirely cleared. While the Government permits the purchase of land, under certain conditions, the economic situation in the Near East complicates matters to a very large degree. The Arab does not approach a land transaction in the same way as an American who deals in real estate, and who practically buys and sells land and buildings on the same basis as merchandise. On the contrary, the Arabs are willing to sell their land only at exorbitant prices. If our organization were a small Achooza, it might be advisable to purchase the land from Jewish colonists. But since we are a larger organization, representing over five thousand members, it is incumbent upon us to support a much

larger program. It would hardly be of advantage to Palestine if we were to purchase land from Jewish owners—since there is no particular advantage in changing the ownership from Jews who already hold possession to Jews who happen to reside now in America. Our Directors have therefore been steadfast in the purpose that we should “redeem the land”—buy it from non-Jewish hands. At this point we were met with the difficulty that the Arabs ask exorbitant prices for their lands. Again if we were a small Achooza, we might have been willing to pay these exorbitant prices, and notify our members that this is the best we could do—although even this is hardly possible since most of the land is held in large stretches, and requires large sums of money in order to secure any purchase. But we carry a responsibility far beyond the limits even of our membership of over five thousand. Our efforts and our plan of work have been endorsed time and again by the Zionists of America in Convention assembled. Practically every leader of note, both of the past administration of the Zionist Organization of America and of the present World Zionist Organization, have commended our activities. I do not believe it is putting it too strongly to say that if we were to purchase land at the high prices demanded by the Arab land owners, we would not be true to our duties as Directors of the American Zion Commonwealth and as officials of the Zionist Organization. For the effect of paying such high prices would go far beyond any individual purchase. It would immediately have the effect of raising land prices throughout Palestine, and every Jewish settler in Palestine—coming from the war-beridden and poverty-stricken districts of Eastern Europe,—would pay an extra tax to the Arab landlords in the shape of higher rents and higher prices for land because we, in America, were not farsighted.

During the last six months or more, the Directors have felt that it was their duty to hold out against high prices and we believe that that policy will justify itself in the immediate future. Our representative in Palestine at the present time, Mr. Emanuel N. Mohl, is using every effort to secure land at reasonable prices, and probably at the time this letter reaches you, he will have succeeded in securing, together with the Jewish National Fund and the Palestine Land Development Company, a large tract of land in Emek Israel. (In this connection it might be interesting to point out that the Jewish National Fund was enabled to secure the land in Emek Israel largely because the Directors of the Jewish National Fund were wise enough to accumulate a large sum of money over a period of years, so that at the proper time they might be able to secure it on a just and fair basis. Had they wasted their money on small efforts in land purchase and colonization, they never would have had the money for a large land purchase.)

Our cash reserve in this country of nearly two hundred thousand dollars is the best guaranty that we shall secure land at the best of terms to our members and for the greatest benefit of the Jews of Palestine. It is also important to point out that under our contract with our members the earliest time at which we are to deliver land is on October 1, 1923—or two years from date; while most of the contracts as a matter of fact require that the land shall be handed over at a much later date. Therefore, as a legal matter, the members really ought to allow the Directors to exercise their discretion as to when to purchase land as long as every contract will be fulfilled to the letter on the due date. For example, it would be a mistake to overpay at the present time when we can secure the same land after a little delay—and particularly so when we will be in a position to deliver the land to our members at the time specified in our contracts.

This brings up a matter that I would like to put before all our members, since it is only an example of the difficulties which sometimes bring us undeserved criticism. Two members of the American Zion Commonwealth (Inc.) left for Palestine several months ago from Connecticut. Each one of them had paid in for one Land Certificate, or a total value for both of \$500.00. They came to Palestine, and demanded "land" from our representative, when if they had examined their own contracts, they would have seen that our obligation to deliver land has more than two years to run. They then made demands on our representative to give them "jobs" at Balfouria. If we were to undertake to give jobs to every one who gave us \$250.00, we might be able, in the present unemployment situation in the United States, to export a population equivalent to the whole State of Connecticut to Palestine. But the only result would be that we would lose the money which our members have entrusted to us, and then the same people would have to come back to America. We must achieve our results in Palestine on a business basis. Our first obligation is to our members, and we intend to perform that, no matter what criticism may be leveled against us by people who do not take the trouble to understand and study the situation.

The American Zion Commonwealth was not organized to give people jobs nor to buy land at speculative prices merely in order to satisfy the natural desire for land purchase in Palestine. We are virtually the Trustees of the money of our members and it is our business to safeguard their funds in the same way—although for a different purpose—as the funds of a life insurance company. Of one thing you may be sure. *We shall secure for every member at the maturity of his contract land in Palestine of far greater value than he could have secured unaided and by haphazard land purchases in Palestine.*

I have devoted a great deal of time during the last seven years to the American Zion Commonwealth. I have never directly or indirectly received one dollar of compensation. Besides the actual and necessary office expenses, the money as collected will go to Palestine for land purchase and development. Recently, the Board of Directors have decided to reduce the actual cost of development to a minimum, so that every member shall receive a larger share of the land. Under such a program, we shall be in the position to purchase much larger tracts of land and become what we have set out to be—one of the largest agencies for the redemption of the soil of Palestine.

In accordance with the advice that we have received from many of those who have returned from Palestine, and who see the necessity for a Land and Mortgage Bank, the Directors have recently resolved that the American Zion Commonwealth (Inc.) act as agency for the sale of stock of the First Palestine Mortgage Bank, soon to be organized in Palestine. (Further announcement in regard to this matter will be made in the public press.) Such a bank will be of tremendous value in the plans of the American Zion Commonwealth itself, and will enable us to do a work far greater than that which we have accomplished to date. I expect to go to Palestine in the near future, largely for the purpose of launching this Mortgage Bank. I feel certain that our participation in its upbuilding will be not only of indirect value for our work in Palestine, but will also have a direct bearing in our larger work after the Palestine Mortgage Bank is established.

"At an exhibition and contest of tractors and tractor plows held in Balfouria, the American Zion Commonwealth colony, two of that colony's tractors and two of its plows got all the first and second prizes. The test was to plow a few acres of Balfouria's land.

"The Governor of Nazareth, the head of the Palestine Agricultural Department and other officers, many Arab Sheiks, and other local representatives were present at the contest."



Excerpts from letter received by one of our members from his nephew who is a worker in Balfouria.

"Work on the farm (Balfouria) is going on as usual. We are now sowing our Summer seed. You should see the field, all green with wheat, barley, and all that we have sown. The weather is glorious. At present, we do not know what snow is in these parts, although we can see in the distance Har Hermon, snow-peaked and glistening in the sun".

"Two days after Purim was the opening of the Girls' Palestine Conference held at Balfouria. There were at least one hundred delegates, besides the friends who came. Balfouria was packed with visitors causing some excitement. This conference lasted from Saturday evening until Tuesday morning at 4:30 A. M."

Dear Member:

Reference is herewith made to the agreement or agreements specified in attached statement between AMERICAN ZION COMMONWEALTH, Inc., (Zion Commonwealth, Inc.), a New York corporation, party of the first part, and yourself as member, party of the second part. Under the terms of the aforesaid contract, it is provided that if the member shall fail to perform any of the terms or conditions of the said contract, or the fines against his account shall be equal to (or be in excess of) the instalments actually paid in by him, the shares of the corporation held by the member and deposited with the corporation as collateral security, shall be declared forfeited to the Company, and the agreement shall become null and void.

You are hereby notified that as of July 1, 1921, the fines against your account for non-payment of the quarterly instalments due, are equal to the instalments actually paid by you, and your agreement with the Corporation is hereby declared null and void, and your shares in the Corporation are declared forfeited to the Corporation.

This action has been taken in justice to the shareholders and members of the Corporation who have scrupulously adhered to the terms of their contracts and who are entitled to the benefits thereunder without the burden of in any manner sharing such benefits with members and shareholders who have permitted their contracts to lapse and become null and void, and for the further reason that the Corporation cannot continue to properly function and protect the interests of its members and shareholders in good standing in the face of the failure by other members and shareholders to comply with the terms of their contracts.

The foregoing action has been taken by the Board of Directors of the Corporation with sincere regret and not without serious consideration as to what steps could possibly be taken to permit delinquent members and shareholders in some manner to reinstate themselves, and yet do justice to the members in good standing.

In order that the sums which you originally paid on your shares and instalments may not be entirely lost to you, the Corporation is prepared on the receipt from you of contract or contracts now in your possession which are now null and void and under which you have no further rights, to issue to you the contract currently issued, known as Series "F", in the principal amount as your old contract, on the payment by you of all quarterly instalments on which you are in arrears. In the event that you determine to avail yourself of this privilege, the fines against your account will be cancelled and written off with the exception of six per cent (6%) simple interest on the unpaid instalments from the respective due dates, plus a small sum to cover cost of reinstatement.

A statement of your account giving the amount payable by you to the Corporation prior to the issuance of the new contract is enclosed herewith. If you desire to avail yourself of the privilege of reinstatement hereby given, fill out the enclosed notice and mail same together with your Land Certificate Agreement to the Corporation, using self-addressed envelope enclosed.

THE FOREGOING PRIVILEGE MUST BE EXERCISED BY YOU WITHIN THIRTY DAYS by forwarding your old Contract to the Corporation within that period of time, together with the enclosed slip properly signed by you.

In the event of your failure to forward to the Corporation, within such period of time, the enclosed slip, together with your old contract, your name will be stricken from the books of the Corporation both as a shareholder and member, without further notice, and your contract declared null and void, and all rights thereunder will cease and determine.




