Disease in Milk—The Remedy: Pasteurization

By LINA GUTHERZ STRAUS

*The following references are taken from this book, published 1917 by E. P. Dutton & Co.
Copies of this book are found in all the Public Libraries throughout the United States.*

There is a MILK PROBLEM because milk is the only animal food used in its raw state (page 28). There are six diseases—typhoid fever, diphtheria, scarlet fever, septic sore throat, tuberculosis and the summer complaints of children—that may be transmitted by raw milk (page 345).

PASTEURIZATION destroys all the germs of disease that may be in the milk, but does not greatly impair the taste, nor at all affect the digestibility or nutritive qualities of the milk (page 31). PASTEURIZATION consists of heating milk to a temperature of 145 degrees Fahrenheit and holding it at that temperature for half an hour.

In the former Nathan Straus Laboratory, since 1920 conducted by the New York City Health Department, the best certified milk is used. It is modified in five different mixtures according to formulas prescribed by eminent physicians. These formulas are adapted to babies of various ages and conditions. The milk is then Pasteurized in the bottle and quickly cooled to below 50 degrees Fahrenheit (pages 33-39).

Coincident with the development of this work the death rate among children under five years of age has dropped from 96.2 per thousand per annum in 1892 to 24.7 per thousand in 1922, the mortality statistics of the City Health Department recording the saving of 367,666 lives in these 30 years.

The efficacy of PASTEURIZATION was clearly demonstrated at Randall's Island, where the death rate among the City's foundlings was cut from 41.8% to 21.75% by Pasteurizing the same milk, which had previously been used in its raw state. Similar favorable results were attained in Washington and in many cities in this country and in Europe. "And wherever Pasteurized milk is introduced, the death rate falls as if by magic."

In the fight against Tuberculosis, PASTEURIZATION is nowadays considered a most important factor. Dr. E. C. Schroeder of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, proved that "one of the chief, if not the most important source of infection is the tuberculous dairy cow" (page 219).

The first Infant Milk Depot was founded by Mr. Straus in New York City in 1893. By the year 1920 there were 297—distributed over 36 cities.

PASTEURIZATION has been endorsed by The American Medical Association, The National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis, The American Public Health Association, The U. S. Public Health Service, The National Commission on Milk Standards, and by Officers of Health Departments all over the United States.

In order that no baby may be deprived of properly PASTEURIZED MILK, Mr. Straus in 1909 perfected a "fool-proof" HOME PASTEURIZER, which any tinsmith can make and any mother can operate. The plans and directions for manufacturing and for use are supplied free to anyone who applies (pages 85-88).

All that has been said for PASTEURIZATION applies with equal force to cream, butter, ice cream and cheese. All cream, including that used for ice cream and butter, should be properly Pasteurized to be safe. Cold does not kill germs; only by heat (PASTEURIZATION) can they be destroyed (pages 109-110).

Under the caption, "PASTEURIZE AND THEREBY PREVENT," Dr. Park, the celebrated bacteriologist and at one time Dean of the Bellevue Hospital Medical College, made known the results of experiments conducted in cooperation with the Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research. The cases of 500 babies were watched, and the results of feeding them with different kinds of milk were observed. Dr. Park reported: "The observations proved that mother's milk is the best milk for a baby, and that *Pasteurized milk* is the next best. One group of fifty babies had been given Pasteurized milk for three weeks; then half of them were changed to the same milk not Pasteurized. Eleven of the twenty-five became ill, which proved conclusively the good effect of Pasteurization. We discovered that it wasn't the chemical combination that hurt, but the amount of noxious bacteria in the milk."

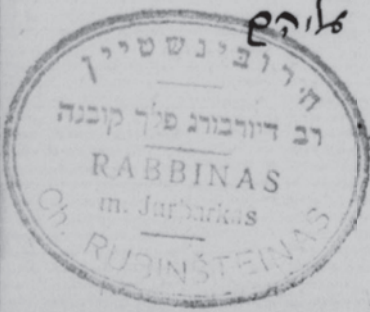

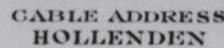

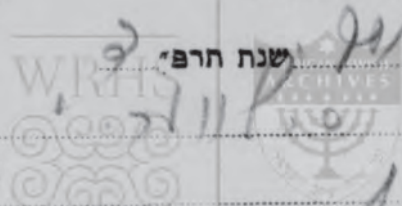
