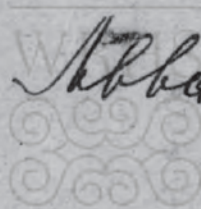

Dear and Esteemed Bretheren may God grant you peace and prosperity Amen.

A great cry of distress reached the great Hungarian old Rabbi Dr. Phillip Klein of the Hungarian congregation Ohab Zedek 16-20 W 116th Street near 5th Ave. New York, N.Y. The cry S. O. S. came with a thunderstorm of Sinai , old Hungary which unfortunately is socalled Versailles peace treaty split their great cultural center to fragments and in its trail is nothing but misery darkness, poverty and hatred and all the rascality that follows in the trail of militarism . The Budapest Jewish Seminary of which those two great twinkling stars have been the leaders and guide for years namely Dr. Ignatz Goldzier and the great Professor Wilhelm Bacher and we may as well mention the great David Kaufman of Blessed memory.

This instituon of the modern school as well as all the old Jeshiboth for which Hungary has been famous for over 4 centuries. As you will readily see in the encyolopedia about Pressburg and the two families of scholars Rabbi Akiba Eger and his great uncles of Bresslau , Rotterdam Halberstadt and Leipnick and the equal famous families the Rabbi Moses Sofer and his children and grandchildren and great grandchildren who are a line of golden period of a an Augustan or Victorian age as English culture is called. Their electric sparks have brought light and lit up the whole of the Dispora .

This appeal is signed by 150 Rabbis and scholars of central Europe for an American aid. It is the first appeal that Hungary ever sent out to Foreign countries like in the days of the great Babylonian shhool and aid must come at once , if you care to see Hungarian Jewish

cultural centers to flourish and furnish to our own shores men of the calibre of Dr. Alexander Kohut or Adolph Hubsch or Benjamin Szold or Bernard Felsenthal or Jastrow and Aaron Weiss, father of Stephen Weiss and Rabbi Illoway and Gotthrd Deutsch who all drank from that fine fountain of the Hungarian Well. Adolph Neubauer or the president of the Jews College in London Adolph Buchler or the late Maybaum in Berlin . It is hardly needed for me to say much to men of your calibre who do so much research work in the Hebrew culture to tell you that all Western Europe lives of the bounty of the wisdom of these great schools. Now the time has reached to save these centers from utter collapse as the Jews in Hungary are to-day in the condition of a poor prisoner who can't free himself, as the prophet Ezekiel says Chapter 15 "Two ends the fire has already devoured, the remaining part is scorched." That is just the condition of Israel among the nations. One part is lost or about to be lost by the mechanization of the radical wing that to our sorrow has entered so deep into the masses of the laboring class, the other part is lost by indifference and strive hard to run away from Judiasm . As we see to our sorrow families of the type of Schiff and the Straus's of R. H. Macy who are descendants of the great Rabbinical families of centuries scholarly attainments, by intermarriage in a most treacherous way and betray Judiasm in a most foolhardy manner inviting a Christian Bishop to be the Rabbi at their weddings. I conclude and say to you Rabbis as well as the congregations rise and sound the alarm and

ANNOUNCING CAMP STRONGHEART

A camp for boys from 6 to 18

"**H**OW will my Boy spend his summer vacation?"
A problem more vital today than ever before and uppermost in the minds of thoughtful parents the country over.

What is the answer?

Seeking solution, a group of Chicago's prominent Jewish men found the perfect answer in the formulation of a plan—a plan to offer to our sons a real boys' vacation—a vacation chock full of all the things that boys love, under the best conditions for development both of body and character. So, the lake region of northern Wisconsin has been chosen; a country of sunny days and cool nights; of blue skies, clear air and bracing pine-laden breezes; a country still close to the wild life of the forest and rich in Indian tradition, fought over as it was by warring tribes of three great Indian nations; and here in the heart of the North Woods a summer camp for boys has been established.

The idea of boys' summer camps is in no sense new, but in making this announcement of Camp Strongheart it is desired to stress particularly that this Camp will be *different*—different in its ideas, its ideals and its practical aims from anything before available in this part of the country.

Brought into being by the call of these "Sponsor-parents," backed by the experience and active co-operation of a group of highly successful eastern camp directors and dedicated in a spirit of sincere and earnest service to the boy himself, Camp Strongheart will offer everything conceivable in the way of wholesome environment to help the boy in his development to a good clean manhood.

It is with this ambition that Camp Strongheart is born. It is to the practical fulfillment of this ambition that I, as Director, earnestly pledge my utmost in thought and effort.

What Camp Strongheart Brings to Your Boy

Location The Camp site is a high wooded point on Lake Minocqua, one of the most beautiful of Wisconsin's clear water lakes, right in the heart of the great North Woods, and in the center of the Tomahawk River and chain lakes canoeing region. The tract we have purchased consists of twenty-seven acres, ample cleared and wooded land, with over a quarter mile shore line of gradually sloping sandy beach. It is on the main highway, one mile from the railroad station, and within easy access to numerous good hotels on Lake Minocqua; an advantage to visiting parents.

Buildings The Camp will consist of a large Recreation Hall (40'x80'), a Dining Hall and Kitchen (40'x100'), two Wash Houses with hot and cold water, showers, enameled basins and flushing toilets, a Camp Hospital Building, Administration Building, Ice House, Storehouses, Help Quarters, two "Midget" Buildings for the little boys, and twenty-five tent Bungalows with raised wood floors, screened sides and doors and water-tight roofs. Our Camp will have its own water and electric lighting system. Camp Strongheart has been laid out and the buildings designed by Mr. E. Tupper White of the office of Alfred S. Alschuler, Architect, and along the lines of the best eastern camps.

Sanitation Special emphasis will be placed on sanitary features which will be installed under the supervision of the Wisconsin State Sanitary Department, with modern sewage disposal system. The water in this region is pure and healthful, as shown by chemical analysis.

Activities Swimming, fishing, canoeing, boating, aquaplaning, horseback riding, tennis, basketball, baseball and handball, with excellent facilities for each; woodcraft, photography, motorboat building and radio building for the mechanically inclined boy. The councillors will give professional instruction. A library of carefully chosen books for boys, a stage, open fire places, games and contests of all kinds. There will be roaring camp fires, with corn roasts, hikes and trips to the Indian Reservation, State Fisheries and other places of interest.

Commissary The menus will be planned to give the boys a carefully balanced diet with plenty of fresh fruit and vegetables, eggs, milk, butter, cream, and fowl, and to this end we have arranged for the entire output of a nearby farm. The boys will get all there is of the best, in unstinted quantity. The kitchen will be presided over by a competent dietician.

Personnel and Practical Management Camp Strongheart is affiliated with Raquette Lake Boys' Club, Raquette Lake Girls' Club and Cedar Island Girls' Camp in the Adirondacks, and will have the benefit of the many years experience of their directors and owners, Max Berg, Ray K. Phillips and Ruth A. West. These successful camp builders are part owners of Camp Strongheart, and from their experienced and most efficient organization will come the working personnel of the new camp, bringing the high standard and fine traditions of the Adirondack Camps. The Director in charge will be Nathan Herzog, past president of Isaiah Temple, Honorary President of "The Temple," active on the Jewish Welfare Board, and member of the Chicago Rotary Club.

Capacity and Personal Attention Camp Strongheart is planned to accommodate 100 boys from the ages of 6 to 18—these boys to be divided into groups with a councillor to each group. All our councillors will be college men trained to the work in one of the eastern camps, and they in turn will be presided over by the Head Councillor of our eastern associates. There will be a graduate doctor, a trained nurse always in attendance, and a Camp Mother who will preside over the comforts of the boys.

Tutoring All our councillors are college men. Where tutoring is desired, special arrangements can be made without extra charge.

Religious Services Held regularly with short talks to the boys by visiting rabbis, councillors or the director.

Here we have planned a way for your boy to be safe, healthy and happy, developing in body, mind and spirit—a vacation from the last of June to the first of September.
