



THE MAN JESUS

OR

JESUS THE GREAT TEACHER

The Great Instructor in All that is Good,  
for the Guidance, and Uplift of All of God's  
Children here Imbedded upon the Earth.

The Man Jesus, the Man of Power, and Meek in Sympathy, and Loving in Disposition, and Imbued with the Charitable feeling, and Impulse that springs from the human heart, was All kind, good, and serene, and led the Life that is in keeping with Natures Laws of perfection in All Things, in so far as it is compatible, and fully possible to live our existence here upon the Earth plane. But while Jesus was of Divine Attribute, and would be more perfect than most ordinary Individuals, and yet He did not possess much more of the Divine than what it is possible to attain to today, in this very day, and age in which we are now living, and if we will but make up our Minds to do so, and to conform our Acts, and our Desires in Accordance with it, or the good Life, and then the same power will be added unto you as well, as God is no respecter of persons, and tries to, and wishes to see all of His Children treated alike, in kindness, and in good Works, as in this way He knows that we are at least serving Humanity, and Glorifying Him as Well.

Jesus the great Teacher, the All sublime, and Holy One, was truly, and really a Man among Men, and one of which, who could see, and catch the Vision of things Incarnate, and to hold to that

of which gave to Him the power Divine, and to thus Unfold Himself in Accordance with those Teachings and Principles as laid down by God, the Father, for the Children of Earth to conform to in All its entirety, and perfection of which it is known, and fully possible to Attain to.

The Man Jesus taught with a Master Hand, and a Master Stroke, in the ways of Life that were in conformity with God's ways, and in which He wished to see us excel, and understand the Divine prerogatives of perfection, in order that we too might become as such as He, and to wish to live a good Life, and the Life that is truly, and really worth while.

Jesus saw, and foretold of the things that were to be, and that of which is to Come, because He was imbued with the Divine Power, and Inspiration from on High, which makes All things possible to those who but have the Faith, and are willing to live the Life that is necessary to Attain to that state of Life that it is necessary to reach to such Attainment. - Some may say, yes, but is it fully possible to reach such a state of Perfection today, as was implanted by the Man Jesus, but Two Thousand Years ago, and we will Answer, Yes it is fully possible if we will but only obey the Commands, and live up to the Designs of the great God principle of the Universe, wherein All things are made perfect, and in keeping with God's great Rule of Life, and Conduct, and Right living.

Jesus was never really of a Dominant Nature, and even less so than what we Are, but that He humbly submitted to that of which He knew was pleasing in the sight of God, and He wished to Obey His Will, and which gave to Christ the power that He possessed, and of

which He fully knew, and was Conscious of at All times, and in which He also knew that He could at best obey, and follow out the Divine Commands, as He was directed, because He had first of All made Himself ready, and accepted, and held fast to that of which gave to Him the Power Everlasting, and the Divine Attribute, and Perfection in All Things.

Jesus all fully knew that if the Principles that He taught were to save the World, that He first of All had to, and that it was necessary for Him to live within Himself, and to set the great example before the World of His Divine Goodness, and to resist Temptation, and to excel in Spiritual things, and in the things that made for Holiness, and Divine Right, and to Wish to be as the Father wished Him to be, and that this was all the more expressed, and emphasized by the Divine Will, when at the time of the Baptism of the "Saviour," that the very Heavens were Opened, and an Angel Voice explained, "This Is My Beloved Son In Whom I Am Well Pleased," and which expressed the Will of God to do the things of which He was wanted, and required to do.

Jesus never foresook anything of that which He knew to be Right, and would not even think of bartering principle for gain, because this looked by far too small before His Eyes, and that of God's as well, but that He always adhered to the Right, and that which gave to Him the greatest Power, and Influence among Men, and among the people living in that day in which He lived, and Taught, and Thought out the Work of which He left to the World, and the greatest by far, of anything that had yet been given to the World, and which represented the full, and complete Work, and Desire of

God, that the World might be made more perfect, and that the complete Whole in All Things, should be the Rule of Conduct in All Things.

Jesus never had a desire to betray anyone, or to do them any harm, or a miss-turn, as He always wished to strictly follow out the Principle of the "Golden Rule," "To Do Unto Others, as Ye Would that they Should Do Unto You," and how much more would our World today be better off, and the Crime would decrease, if more of us living today would only practice at least a part of what Christ Taught, by precept, and the example of His Life, that others could see, and to wish to follow.

Jesus always knew that by expressing the Divine Will, that He assured by living, and acting in full accordance with God's Divine Will, and that there was a similarity for Coordination between the Two, if the greatest Results were to be Attained, and the Life, and Work that He left to the World might have its Influence, and to be felt as a great Power in the World, and that the World might be fully Ben efitted, and Uplifted, and that Progress should be Our's, unhampered by the trials of the Hour, or by the shortcomings of not only Himself, but of Others, and which Work could not even for one instance stop, or that there should be a lull for a moment, but that it was necessary that the Work should go on uninterrupted for All time, and that it should by far Transcend anything else in which He knew How, and then this would be expressed back to Him many fold, and that as the way was prepared for the Saviour of the World, by the Ascension into the other World, for the deeds that were done in the Body of Christ, as will also the same proper care, and watchfulness be given to Us, if we will but live the Life, and

live up to the Commandments of God, and to try to be as such as much as possible in the way that God would Have us live, and then we will get more out of Life, and will want to see Others do the same, because All will be expressing that of which is the most pleasing to the Will of God, and that All of the Children of Earth should have plenty, and that their existenc e might be at best furthered, and maintained Here upon the Earth, an d that then when all of Life's cares, trials, and tribulations are at an end, that we will reach the pinnac le of Perfection, wherein we may All be Tran scended into Glory, because it is the better way for us to follow.



## GLEANINGS FROM THE CHRIST LIFE

The subject that is before us today upon this beautiful Christmas Day - Gleanings from the Christ Life, as nothing else before us today would seem to be more appropriate upon a Day such as this, because today is the Day that we Celebrate the Birth of the Christ, or the Saviour as He is most commonly called; and which Birth gave to the World a new Conception of Life, and the full measure of the All Glorified One, the Son of God, and the Saviour of the Human Race.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

The Plain Dealer report of your sermon under the headline "Man can't live on fact" makes me want to ask you whether you have read Dr. E. S. Ames' new book, "Religion." I have known Dr. Ames as teacher and pastor for some twenty years and am intensely interested in this book.

A discussion class of which I am a member, and which is lead by Dr. F. G. Blanchard, is studying the book this winter, and Dr. Blanchard finds himself at variance with the attitude of Dr. Ames' book.

If you should at any time refer to this book in your sermons or in writing I hope the papers will make a note of it; for I am anxious to know your views upon it.

Being a member of Dr. Blanchard's church I seldom find time to attend your services, - which I consider the most beautiful I have ever attended.

In his chapter on "Religion and Art" Dr. Ames says, "At times the stage effects overwhelm the theme and draw attention to themselves" (That is my reaction to the Episcopal service). Then Dr. Ames adds, "This principle is nowhere more important than in the use of art in religious ceremonies. The requirement here is called "serenity."

I have always felt that the service in the Temple is the embodiment of truest art.

There is another subject upon which I have wished to talk with you. Do you know George Segal, 10107 Detend Avenue, who was the valedictorian and President of the June 1928 class at Glenville High School? I have suggested to George that he talk with you, and I wonder whether he has done so. George is a boy with a brilliant

mind, highest ideals, and splendid leadership. Yet he has been unable to decide what his life work shall be. He leans toward studying to be a rabbi; yet his family has not trained him in the Jewish ritual.

Do you see his problem? A brilliant mind, - freed from orthodoxy, yet seeking expression along religious lines! Just now he is a Freshman at Case School of Science. I do not believe he will find satisfaction in business or in engineering; - though his brilliant mind will make him succeed in any line to which he applies himself.

I hope that he may have a talk with you if he has not already done so.

My dear Dr. Rauch:

Through the kindly reference by two of your members to the coming of Dr. Silver, and the public announcements that it was to be a free lecture, I found my way to the Temple last evening. Had I known that the lecture was to be addressed to Jewish hearers only, I should not have felt free to venture in.

Since it was my good fortune to hear, "What is going on in the American Home", may I not take the further liberty of telling you, though a non-Jew, how deeply I was moved by the force and the spirit of what I heard. Though discovering early that Dr. Silver's message was particularly addressed to his own people, I could not help but take a keen interest in what he was saying, for there is not, it seems, any great difference in what is going on in all the homes of our present day and times. And so I soon found myself applying everything Dr. Silver said to my own self and to my own home, and to the homes of others whom I knew.

Never before had I heard anything more impressive or stirring, than this profound message of Dr. Silver's! It was like a clarion call of old to the people to once again rally 'round the altars and to rekindle the altar fires. ~~as of old~~ So scholarly was the presentation of the subject and so superb the oratory through which it was given, that I have since endeavored to recall when I might have heard anything to equal it.

While I listened, I could not help but wish that every family in our city, Jewish or non-Jewish, might have heard this magnificent and revivifying address. To me it was an outstanding occasion for reflection and introspection. For is there not in all the homes of the land today, a crying need for the restoration of ~~the~~ family altar and of family worship? And with-out it, <sup>can we ever hope to</sup> reap those rewards that come only from a close observance of and adherence to, religious principles, and ideals?

What a great hope was inspired by Dr. Silver's prophetic utterances and solemn injunctions, his promises and warnings! How fortunate if we can take them to heart and coin them into values which endure!

As so I consider myself deeply indebted for the great benefit which I received from hearing this masterful address given with such power, and such devotion, to such a wonderful cause.
