



At a luncheon in honor of Max Reinhardt at the Ambassador Hotel in New York . . . Professor Albert Einstein scheduled as main speaker, runs up to toastmaster ex-Ambassador Gerard and pleads with him not to forget to call on him as he has something very important to say . . . This naivete and modesty of Einstein are genuine . . . Max Reinhardt in a speech written by himself, proclaims Meyer W. Weigal the strong man of the theatre because Weigal cured him of his fright of air travel . . . Mrs. Reinhardt whispering to us that the reason why Reinhardt has a prejudice against flying is that last year he was scheduled to fly from Italy to Austria in company with Max Pallenberg who was killed in a crash on that trip . . . And that Reinhardt cancelled his ticket at the last moment . . . David A. Brown on the dais next to Maurice Samuel and apparently enjoying the conversation, although not very long ago these two gentlemen banged at each other in an editorial controversy at the time of Samuel's book, "Jews on Approval" . . . Bernard S. Deutsch interrupting the last and all-important meeting of the board of estimate just to shake hands with Reinhardt and welcome him officially in the name of the City of New York . . . Being so much in a hurry that he donates his ice cream to Meyer W. Weigal who is so nervous that he can't even look at it . . . Mrs. Eugene Meyer, Jr., wife of the former head of the Federal Reserve Bank, discussing with Reinhardt the stage debut of her daughter in the forthcoming Franz Werfel-Reinhardt production. . . All the ladies present staring at the new Mrs. Max Reinhardt and finding her most charming and unassuming . . . The Zionist convention was a wash-out from a dramatic point of view because, although few people knew it, a deal between Rothenberg and Lipsky had been concluded a few days previous . . . But what is more interesting is that 100 delegates out of 258 did not vote for Rothenberg as a delegate to the Congress . . . Best looking lady at the convention was Mrs. Ezra Shapiro of Cleveland . . .

Most boring speaker of the convention was Rabbi Joseph Shubow of Massachusetts . . . Best dressed man at the convention was Meyer F. Steinglass, managing editor of the New Palestine . . . Best oratory was by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, vociferously applauded by Meyer W. Weigal . . . Judge William M. Lewis of Philadelphia did not speak once . . . Most intelligent address by Maurice Samuel at the Monday afternoon session . . . Ludwig Lewisohn did not attend the convention for a reason known to the Zionist office . . . Reuben Brainin was in Atlantic City during the convention but never once went to the convention hall, afraid to be disappointed with the low intellectual level of the discussions. . .

Sport Parade

The Maccabi motorcycle squad from Palestine now touring the United States makes a very athletic impression . . . They all speak Hebrew and refused personal donations from a group of delegates who wanted to hand them money for a good time . . . Detroit is betting that Hank Greenberg will clout more than 50 home runs this season . . . At this writing he leads both big leagues with 23 in 64 games . . . Benny Friedman, former Michigan all-American quarterback and now coach of the City College eleven, is studying law at Brooklyn Law School . . . Leo Weiss won the national championship with his gasoline-powered model airplane which stayed in the air for 64 minutes and 12 seconds . . . Barney Ross made more money betting on Joe Louis against Carnera than on his last fight with Jimmy McLarnin . . . Incidentally, there are whisperings that Barney's heart is beating for Marion Callahan, a chorus girl, but that his mother is not very happy about Barney's Irish Marion . . . Col. M. Robert Guggenheim the horse fancier wears an African sun helmet even when he goes to the theatre during the hot weather . . .



Enclosed please find check for \$20.00, which you will kindly apply on my annual membership due's account. - Appreciating your most wonderful successful system of collection I sincerely believe that if your dear friends would give your personal service in distributing your funds instead of directing your burden of faithful distribution to a most alarming growing powerful influential staff of charity promoters, fifty per cent of your collections could be applied in checking developments of anti-semitic propaganda,

The enclosed letters tells its own story; be kind enough to see to it that Mr. Edward Lankin and family are provided with transportation fare. Mr. Lankin is apt to die here if not humanely aided to save his life when the family will become a permanent charge of our community.

It took me two years to place two neglected orphan children with our Jewish Orphan Asylum. Their recently adopted scientific res-tape mockery turned their Board of Directors into a rubber stamp. They had to follow the direction and decision of their over-paid advisers, which I challenged with most categorical evidences of their errors.

A student of respectable parents was in need of an educational loan of \$150.00 to finish his education. He was refused by your Treasurer, Mr. Meyer, because the educational fund was impounded. - Our sainted President, Henry Baker, of the Educational Alliance, who left an adopted daughter of high culture and education in my charge, was refused employment by Miss Schott, while all the devoted members of the Alliance sang the praises of tribute in his memory at the recent bequeath of Henry Baker's Camp. With all the other institutions closed against her, I secured for her a moderate paying position with the May Company.

Anti-semitism would never have reached the present alarming stage of persecution in Germany, had we judiciously applied our funds for depending Jews and non-Jews, here and elsewhere; had we followed the sublime principals of the Richman Brothers industry where three thousand of their employees rendered religious requiem in the Catholic Cathedral, presided by Bishop Schrembs, in memory of the Jewish messenger of God that made them selfsupporting.

Instead of turning all the millions of dollars into the hands of pious fraud charity promoters, the Hebrew Free Loan Association located in all industrial cities in Europe to make loans to Jews and non-Jews without interest charge, will counter-act all destructive parasitic anti-semitic leaders from stone-age tyrannical crimes.


