Dear Doctor Silver:-

I enclose some sheets bearing the names of Rabbis of American congregations and the faculty of the Hebrew Union College. As a member of the Senate of the Society representing this group I wish you would indicate on these sheets those persons whom you would recommend for membership in the Society.






Referring to our yesterday's conversation, I hope you returned to your home safely and I now want to bring up the question which I put before you last night.

Years ago a German-Jew made it possible for millions of Eastern European Jews to find a haven in America. I refer to Mr. Jacob Schiff, who made a contract with the Czar of Russia and the State Department in Washington to the effect that he would guarantee none of the immigrants would become a charge of the state. It looks to me that a similar arrangement could be made by the Jews of America today with the State Department in Washington to let such German-Jews who want to come to America, enter. Offhand, you replied last night that the American Jews should make efforts to bring their relatives over here. A great many are doing this today, and a great many are not able to do so on their own account. It is my opinion that of the 500,000 Jews left in Germany, half are opposed, or not willing to go to Palestine. They prefer coming to America. This is only a handful of people and I think it better to let them settle here than put money out in Germany for relief, thus indirectly help Hitler.

I shall be glad to hear from you on this subject. In the meantime, I beg to hand you enclosure which might be of interest to you.



Dear Rabbi Silver:

This year the Palestine Economic Corporation will complete ten years of work in Palestine. During this decade the Jewish population in Palestine has trebled and the economic foundations of agriculture, industry and commerce have been laid.

The tragic situation of the Jews in Germany, the intensification of the distress among Jews in Poland, Roumania and other countries, have resulted in a great stream of immigrants to Palestine, hopeful that they can create a new life for themselves and children. During 1935, over 61,000 Jews emigrated to Palestine and the urgent need of additional tens of thousands of Jews to find a haven and a home still remains unsatisfied.

My dear Dr. Silber

The most interesting conversation with you gave me to think and I feel that it may be right to say to you a word more on the subject. In as much as I agree with you in principle I can not accept your opinion in practice. And there where suffering people are in question, we have to deal first of all with facts and are not permitted to be carried away by theories may they be as right as it can be.

We have two kinds of Jews in Germany the wealthy and the poor, the first wish to protect their fortune, the second their lives. As it is the representatives of German Jews as they are to be found in the Reichsausschuss fuer Hilfe und Schutz are controlled by the wealthy class. It is therefore that the poor Jew can not find the consideration they deserve. These suffering desperate Jews, who have no means and ways do not ask if it is a shame to beg for aid, clothes, they need them, need them badly and can not get them in Germany, so they send us letters to give them some. As long as we can not change the administration here of the "Joint" and there from the Reichsausschuss I am inclined to say that we should decentralize the work as much as possible, for not only the good children who are thankful whatever the Reichsausschuss will ^{should be regarded} give them, but ^{at home} the help also those who are not willing to bow their head and lend the knee for the ruler of the almighty King - money.

As it is with the regime in Germany, we can not do a thing. Those men are accepted by Hitler and no one else will. How long it will take to end this dark page in the history of Germany I can not say but I know that with the end of the Hitler regime goes the end of our Jewish leaders, who are now the "Baal Rabbim" in whose hands rests the empty stomach of a few hundred thousands Jews.

Here you have the facts against all theory is, "Inshallah und Reueh." Enclosed I send you a few excerpts of the letters I received, if you can send us some material it would be very nice. I hope you will forgive me, if I have been too outspoken, as it is, I suffer very much at the situation and I must say it, when I see a man of whom I feel that he understands. In this regard, I am with personal regards from Malina.

There is only one thing to do, as you state, we should concentrate every ounce of energy in fighting them and there is nothing doing the amount of good that the boycott is doing.

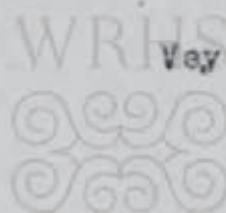

It may interest you to learn that the price of this volume in Germany is now double that at which we offer it. So far, we have no information as to subsequent volumes, but due to conditions in Germany the entire project has been temporarily abandoned.

As to the Hebrew edition, it so happens that we have in stock one set of the first two volumes which have appeared. If you wish, we can send you Vol. 2 and, in this instance, will allow you the original price of \$15.00 net. Please advise.



My dear Mr. Cohn:

I was pleased to receive your letter of January 9. The question of what to do with German-Jewish emigration will receive a thorough airing in the next few weeks in a series of conferences and conventions which will be held in St. Louis, Washington and elsewhere in connection with the coming to these shores of the delegation of British Jews, including Sir Herbert Samuel, Simon Marx and Lord Bearsted. No one, of course, is settling all the German-Jewish emigrants in Palestine. On the other hand, it would be quite impossible under present conditions to get the Government of the United States to approve of a very large immigration of German Jews to this country at a time when we have our own ten million unemployed. Our Government has been, generally, cooperative and sympathetic. I understand that some fifteen hundred Jews have already come to this country. Others are on the way. A mass immigration is, I believe, out of the question.

In this connection, you might be interested in reading an article of mine which will be published in the Jewish press of America and which was printed in my Temple Bulletin, a copy of which I am enclosing herewith.



Dear Rabbi Silver:

You are no doubt familiar with the movement for the creation of the World Jewish Congress and with the recent decision of the American Jewish Congress definitely to convene such a congress in the summer of 1936.

As a Zionist and one who is deeply interested in Jewish affairs generally, I am trying to ascertain the opinion of the active Zionists throughout the country and also the opinion of a number of men who are generally active in Jewish communal affairs as to the desirability of holding such a congress at this time.

As an American Jew I am chiefly concerned with this problem on two grounds:

1. A World Jewish Congress meeting in 1936 will no doubt take up the question of Palestine. Certainly no world Jewish assembly could afford to ignore this all-important consideration. Yet the proposal for a legislative council, the problems raised by an enlarged German-Jewish immigration into Palestine, and the economic circumstances which are now beginning to make themselves apparent in Palestine should make it obvious that this is no time for the intrusion of still another world Jewish organization. For the good of Palestine's development it is now more essential than ever, in my opinion, that platform pronouncements and resolutions without power or authority yield to more definite constructive efforts. I can only foresee a confusion of the Jewish and of world public opinion by the intrusion in the Palestine problem of still another Jewish world agency which, by its very name and scope, would assume to speak for all the Jews of the world. Indeed, I gravely fear that there may not be the most serious repercussions to the existence of the World Zionist Organization and the Jewish Agency, repercussions which would have the most tragic consequences at a time when all Jewish groups should be united for the development of Palestine.


2. I am also gravely concerned on another account, namely that the convening of a World Jewish Congress in 1936 may not have an unfavorable effect upon us American Jews. The year 1936 is one in which a national election will be held. There is every indication that the political campaign this year will be one of the most bitter, acrimonious, and violent in American history. Partisan feeling runs so high that the campaign is bound to be one in which every emotion will be stirred; in which the basest passions will be utilized in whispering campaigns, insinuations, and public charges. I do not believe that they will be stirred up deliberately by the national political leaders, but the likelihood is that in every locality, in every section of the country where partisan bigotry, including anti-Semitism, can be turned to political advantage, it will be so used.

With this in mind, I am apprehensive as to the consequences of a widely publicized meeting of a World Jewish Congress. I am all the more grievously concerned because while no particular advantage can accrue, the convening of such a world congress at this time will only serve to direct further attacks upon us American Jews.

Because of these immediate considerations (as well as of the profounder objections that I have commented upon in several articles and interviews), I venture to ask you as a distinguished American Zionist leader for your opinion on this subject. Will you be good enough to answer the attached questionnaire and to write me at greater length if you feel so disposed? There is nothing so sadly needed as a clarification of issues and a real understanding of just where American leaders stand on this important question.

Dear Rabbi Silver,

I have regretted not being able to see you lately for reasons that related particularly to myself, but also in behalf of a view that is contrary to one you expressed in one of your lectures on "Home", though I thought the main and essential points of both very fine indeed.

I do not think that the acceptable position for the Jew is one of conformity with the industrial, mass production and uniform standard era; that he must look to his home life for what may perhaps be called the reformation of his personality. I believe the contrary to be the acceptable ground, i.e. that the Jew must look to his home life and traditions to provide him with a center from which he may derive the means to sustain his individual outlook in the face of the opposition of the world that surrounds him, and regardless of the expediency for industrialists of training mankind to be appendages of their machines and systems.

Leaving for a moment the Jewish aspect of this matter, it need not be the lost cause for individual personality that it

seems to be if we put our minds to carefully considering the factors of modern life and its new instrumentalities, whose margin of liberating facilities may be found on the side of sustained individuality if, the distinctions made, we avoid the pitfalls that lead to "comparatively innocuous desuetude".

For the Jew to oppose his being drawn into the maelstrom of standardization may bring him in conflict with the world, it must be admitted, but the solution for this, I believe, must be found in other means than those of conformity.

I suspect that the Jew in Germany did advance himself at the expense of the people of that country, albeit at the expense of their proneness to self-indulgence, a self-indulgence not compensated for by physical hardihood or scientific advancement. The materialistic viewpoint of Americans may land the Jew in this country into similar difficulties, as you pointed out. What then should be the role of the Jew? Should he sustain his position, possibly an embattled one, by defensive and mutual support tactics as in the past, or should he accept his full share in the responsibilities of American life and devote his preponderance of acumen, assuming that he has it, to the solution of American problems?

The latter suggestion is not, I know, a new one, but I think the belief I hold

is new, i.e. that so far from such an attitude militating against the Jew, it will on the contrary strengthen him in his relations. Moreover it will not detract from the essential Jewishness of the individual, but it will enhance that Jewishness, making more apparent its distinction. Since the survival of the distinct personality is also the fight in which Americans are engaged; since it is the prize in the war between the greed of capitalism and the rights of employees as human beings, Jews in this conflict will join forces with powerful allies.

I believe that if this struggle for the survival of personality is given up, if the ground is left unhalloved from which may spring the great figures of the world what other decisions may be gained will hardly be worth the having. The home should be a pattern for the world, not a sanctuary from it.

Since your subject as announced by Rabbi Harris for next Sunday deals with the Jew and his relative position this letter which I have delayed sending you seems a pro pos.

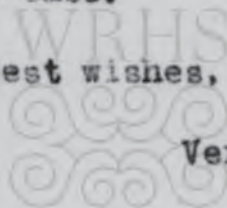


