DEAR MR. WOLF:

THE NEWSPAPERS REPORT THAT A SYMPOSIUM IS TO BE CONDUCTED AT THE TEMPLE AND THAT ONE OF THE SPEAKERS LISTED FOR DECEMBER 7, IS BISHOP FRANCIS J. MCCONNELL OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH OF NEW YORK. THIS MAN IS SUCH A NOTORIOUS BRED BREED OF A COMMUNIST ACTUAL MEMBER, OF THE COMMUNISTS THAT IF YOU WANT TO KNOW AS A SPEAKER IT MAY HAVE SERIOUS REPERCUSSIONS WHICH WILL ADD FUEL TO THE PRESENT CONTROVERSY.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION, I AM RECEIVING SOME FACTS TO SUPPORT THE CONTENTION THAT THIS MAN IS AT LEAST A COMMUNIST SYMPATHIZER. BROOKWOOD COLLEGE AT KATONAH, NEW YORK, WAS FOUNDED AS A LABOR COLLEGE AND FOR MANY YEARS WAS SUPPORTED BY THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF LABOR AND INDIVIDUAL LABOR LEADERS. THE A.F. OF L. RECENTLY MADE AN INVESTIGATION AND FOUND THIS COLLEGE TO BE TEACHING COMMUNISTIC PROPAGANDA AND WITHDREW ITS SUPPORT. IT POINTED OUT THAT MANY OF THE OFFICIALS WERE COMMUNISTS AND THAT PRACTICALLY ALL OF THE TEACHERS WERE COMMUNISTS. BISHOP FRANCIS J. MCCONNELL IS LISTED AS A MEMBER OF ITS BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

THE NORTH AMERICAN COMMITTEE TO AID SPANISH DEMOCRACY IS A COMMITTEE ORGANIZED AND FOSTERED BY, AND RESPONSIBLE TO THE COMMUNIST PARTY. ITS PRINCIPLE FUNCTION IS TO RAISE FUNDS IN THIS COUNTRY FOR PROPAGANDA SUPPORTING THE COMMUNIST, SO CALLED Loyalist, GOVERNMENT IN SPAIN, AND TO FURTHER OTHER COMMUNIST OBJECTIVES. BISHOP

FRANCIS J. MCCONNELL IS LISTED AS ITS NATIONAL CHAIRMAN.

THE AMERICAN COMMITTEE FOR PROTECTION OF FOREIGN BORN IS ANOTHER COMMUNIST OUTFIT WHOSE ANNOUNCED PURPOSE IS TO "COMBAT ALL DISCRIMINATION AGAINST FOREIGN BORN HELD FOR DEPORTATION BECAUSE OF POLITICAL OPINION OR TRADE UNION ACTIVITIES". PART OF ITS PROGRAM IS "TO REESTABLISH BY LAW THE RIGHT OF ASYLUM IN AMERICA FOR POLITICAL AND RELIGIOUS REFUGEES" AND "TO REPEAL THE LAWS REQUIRING DEPORTATION FOR POLITICAL OPINION" AND "TO ULTIMATELY REPEAL ALL DEPORTATION LAWS." THE RECORDS PROVE THAT THIS COMMITTEE HAS OPPOSED DEPORTATION OF SOME OF THE MOST NOTORIOUS AND DANGEROUS COMMUNISTS WHO WERE EVER IN THIS COUNTRY. IT DEFENDS THE COMMUNIST PARTY AS A "LEGAL" PARTY. IT HAS CLOSE AFFILIATIONS WITH THE MOST NOTORIOUS OF COMMUNISTIC ORGANIZATIONS IN THIS COUNTRY. A MEMBER OF ITS ADVISORY BOARD IS BISHOP FRANCIS J. MCCONNELL.

MANY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE METHODIST CHURCH BELIEVE THOROUGHLY IN THE COMMUNISTIC FORM OF GOVERNMENT FOR THIS COUNTRY AND ARE DOING THEIR UTMOST TO PROMOTE AND ADVOCATE IT. THEIR IDEAL OF A COMMUNIST FORM OF GOVERNMENT WOULD NOT, HOWEVER, LIMIT ON ATHEISM AND WOULD PERMIT SOME RELIGIOUS FREEDOM. BISHOP FRANCIS J. MCCONNELL IS THE LEADER OF THIS GROUP.

THE AMERICAN LEAGUE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS IS ANOTHER COMMUNIST CONTROLLED ORGANIZATION WHICH HAS BEEN WELL ESTABLISHED, BUT THAT RUSSIA BE PERMITTED FULL FREEDOM. ITS BOARD IS COMPOSED OF SUCH NOTORIOUS COMMUNISTS AS: EDWARD BRENNAN, EDITH ETR GURLEY FLYNN, AL HYMAN, JAMES FORD, BEN GOLD, HENRIETTA CONNOR, HARRY F. WARE, ROBERT MORSE LOVETT, AND ANGELO HERNDON. BIRNTHY MCCONNELL, DAUGHTER OF BISHOP FRANCIS J. MCCONNELL, IS A MEMBER OF ITS PROGRAM COMMITTEE.

FOR VERIFICATION OF THE ABOVE STATEMENTS I CAN REFER YOU TO VARIOUS OFFICIAL COMMUNIST PUBLICATIONS, BUT PARTICULARLY TO THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES ("DIES COMMITTEE") AND SPECIFICALLY TO PAGES 462, 470, 566, 569, 579, 574, 690, AND 703.

A GREAT MANY INFLUENTIAL AND OTHERWISE WELL-INFORMED CITIZENS HONESTLY BELIEVE THAT THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT THROUGHOUT THE WORLD, AND PARTICULARLY IN THIS COUNTRY, IS CONTROLLED BY JEWS. AND FATHER COUGHLIN RECENTLY DID NOT DO ANYTHING TO MODIFY THIS BELIEF. WE HAVE PERSONALLY DISCUSSED THAT MATTER AND YOU ARE FAMILIAR WITH MY VIEWS, BUT CONSIDERING THIS MASS OF EVIDENCE DON'T YOU THINK IT WOULD BE FOLLY TO FEED THE FLAME BY HAVING BISHOP FRANCIS J. MCCONNELL SPEAK UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE TEMPLE?

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

As your batch of 12 checks for 1938 for the folks has by now been used up, may I remind you to please forward to me a similar batch for 1939.



May I offer you my heartfelt thanks for the report of your address "A Tribute to President Roosevelt" in the Plain Dealer of 5 December. I breathed a solemn AMEN as I finished reading, knowing as I do how much it was needed.

I have never understood why so many wealthy Jews are against Roosevelt, only the other day Jay Franklin wrote that it was Jewish money that elected Taft in Ohio and defeated Bulkley.

I believe that in order to survive at all, — Jews, — cannot afford to be anything less than noble. Upon American Jews rests the burden of showing a whole world that Jews practice only the highest principles of living.

For that reason — if you agree — may I ask you whether you think as I do that the constant ridicule of the Jew over the radio should be stopped. A subtle propaganda against the Jew is being piped into American homes during the daytime hours by means of stupid daytime serials that represent Jews as something different from Americans, they speak with unlovely accents, a veritable Ghetto lingo, that day by day, has the effect of making unthinking people believe that a Jew is an alien.

The Columbia Broadcasting System offends oftener than N.B.C. The serials I refer to are

The Goldbergs ----- 1 P.M.
Life is Beautiful---- 1.15 P.M.
Nancy James----- 12.15 P.M.

and there are also others, indeed, every time a theatrical producer is portrayed, he is always played with a thick, Jewish accent. I know the effect of all this is dangerous as well as untrue. Even Eddie Cantor and others offend.

If you agree, may I enquire is there anything a prominent and influential man like you can do — if you lead — how should we follow?

I realize such stupid serials are far beneath your notice, but if one hammers daily on dynamite, it may explode.



Dear Rabbi,

After listening to your broadcast, I quite agree with you that neither Coughlin or his church have said anything about Fascism or the rape of Ethiopia or the help given by Italy to the Spanish rebels, against a legally constituted government. To my mind there is just one man who is the most responsible for the persecution of the Jews in Germany. And that is Rev. Coughlin. It was he who had his stooges showered the congressmen with telegrams to prevent the U. S. from joining the World Court. I firmly believe if the U. S. had joined that body, the prestige of this powerful country would

over

have stopped Hitler and saved the Czechs. However I feel certain that Coughlin's mouthings will prove a boomerang, and that after Hitler has bled the Jews white, he will then bleed the Church that Coughlin represents, Coughlin talks of tolerance. The Pope in his encyclical a few years ago, said that the three enemies of Catholicism were Communism, Socialism and Protestantism, and the worst of the three was Protestantism. If that is tolerance I don't know the meaning of the word. How any Christian can call a priest 'Father' after reading Matthew-23:9 is beyond me. Pardon this rambling letter. If the Protestants and Jews had flooded the Congress with telegrams to join the war effort the persecutions might have been avoided.

My dear Dr. Piepkorn:

In reply to your kind inquiry, permit me to say that there are numerous editions of the Babylonian Talmud from the first edition of Bomberg in the middle of the Sixteenth Century to the more recent ones of Berlin (1862-66), Stettin (1862) and Wilna (1896). Two good editions of the Yerushalmi Talmud are the Kroteschin (1866) and Jitomir (1860-67). The most recent English translation of the Babylonian Talmud is the one of the Soncino Press-London, begun three years ago. Already twenty-four volumes have been printed and the whole translation, it is indicated, will be completed within the year. Twenty treatises of it were translated into Latin (Blasio Ugolino in his Thesaurus Antiquitatum Sacrarum xvii (1755) xxx (1785). The entire text of the Yerushalmi was rendered into French by Professor Schwab, Paris (1871-1889).

The entire Mishna was recently translated by and published by Dr. Herbert Danby (Oxford 1933). An abridged translation of the Babylonian Talmud into English was made by Mr. M. L. Rodkinson (1904) - rather unscholarly.

There is a complete translation of the Babylonian Talmud into German by Professor L. Goldschmidt (Berlin, 1898, et seq.).

Some of the above mentioned translations are in the library of The Temple. You may also be interested in the enclosed pamphlet, "What Is the Talmud?", by Rabbi Max Reichler.



Dear Friend:

This letter,-- a Holiday message to you,-- is a simple record of my thoughts, here in my office, at the silent end of a hurried day, a week before Christmas, 1938.

One week from today you and I will celebrate a Birthday. So will everyone else in all of the so-called Christian nations. We are all part of it, even though we pause only long enough to observe the ceremonies and festivities.

This day we celebrate is the Birthday of a Man called Christ,-- even if we should forget about Him the other eleven months of the year. This Man and His Birthday and His faith, have persisted for centuries, and "proved a mightier power than all the edicts of the Roman Emperors".

As we prepare for Christmas, and consider what it is all about, it might be well to stop and think of this:--

The Man called Christ was a Jew.

I am sure that my attitude of mind has never been described as exactly religious, but I do believe that I have enough clarity of vision to see that whatever of good I have enjoyed or been able to pass along to others has had a definite relation to this Man's incredible Faith, and to His antecedents.

These are distressing days. Intolerance and even hatred are abroad everywhere. Even in this country of traditional freedom and fairness, a disquieting murmur of prejudice has become distinctly audible.

Intolerance toward any minority group, religious or political, is just essentially wrong; and if such intolerance toward any particular minority group, (as, for example, the Jewish group today), is condoned or even permitted, there is an ever present danger of a similar injustice breaking into flames at any time.

The most terrifying moments of history have had their origin in misjudgments made without the facts. So when I hear erroneous statements and false reports offered as authentic,--well I am afraid.

Shall I annoy you if I recite a thing or two that are facts, and that to my notion reflect a few experiences which have helped me to view a distorted picture with clear eyes?

In my work, extending for more than thirty years over a rather large area, I have known many Jews, some of them very intimately. I have sold to Jewish merchants in New York and Chicago where the Jewish characteristics are presumed to be most accentuated. I have bought from Jewish manufacturers. I have extended important credits to Jews, and I have borrowed substantial amounts from Jews. I have performed professional work for dozens of Jewish firms, large and small. I have worked closely with Jews in many activities, and I have had a number of Jewish employees and associates. I have lived for months in a Jewish household, and I never expect to see anywhere a more admirable family relationship than I found there, nor more sympathetic cordiality for myself. I have never seen the equal of a Jew for loyalty, once his commitment is made. As for friendship,--well, a Jewish friend once did a favor for me that has never been surpassed, and cannot be.

Yes, of course, there are some distasteful Jews; and there are also many others besides Jews equally displeasing. In my opinion, you can line up a hundred Jews and a hundred Gentiles, picked at random, and you will find the same percentages of desirables and undesirables in both groups; --and the chances are that a good many undesirable traits of the Jews have been developed by Gentile malevolence.

Whenever I hear unkind whispers against a race that has given so much to the world's progress, I always wonder if the accuser has ever traced the Hebrew path from its Desert origin up to now. It is illuminating to go back to the time when Hebrew slaves worked in the Egyptian brickyards; then were led by Moses into Asia; the struggle in Palestine; the formation of the two Jewish Kingdoms, Israel and Judah; the sermons of Amos; the destruction of the Hebrew Kingdoms by Assyria and Chadea; the orations of Isaiah; the exile to Babylon; the deliverance by Cyrus, the Persian King;--and on and on, a continuous chronicle of oppression and rejuvenation, from that time until now. It must be a great people that can survive such misery and persecution.

As I grow older, I realize more and more how easy it is to be unjust and how hard it is to be fair. And it seems particularly fitting, at this Christmas Season, in the midst of so much unkindness, to oppose it and acknowledge what we must see is the truth, if we are ever to have Peace on Earth and Goodwill Toward Men that we all talk so much but never do anything about.

What is the Christmas Spirit? Is it the Christian Spirit? Sometimes I wonder.

My dear Lou:

In my address "What Is Behind the Effort to Link Jews with Communism?" I stressed the following thoughts:

Jews are being linked with Communism because that is the easiest way to fight Communism. Instead of making a frontal attack upon it, you discredit it by branding it with an unpopular label. You arouse an immediate resistance to it by suggesting that it is something alien, Jewish, part of a sinister conspiracy on the part of Jews, radicals and bankers alike to destroy Christian civilization which presumably is linked up with the capitalist system.

Under the term Communism they of course include not only Marxism but every political and economic measure which they do not happen to like. They are really fighting not Communism, of which they are not afraid, but economic democracy and all progressive legislation.

Anti-Semitism has now become the classical tactic of all Fascist adventurers.

I trust that you will forgive me if I ask a favor of you, which I hope you will grant without delay.

I want to solicit your interest in a young man who is a European fugitive of nearly three years' standing. Were you to write to me under similar conditions, your request would be regarded by me a command. The facts are these:

I would like to have you contact Dr. Floyd S. Meck, of Cleveland, who is the President of the Ohio State Medical Committee. And should you be acquainted with any of the other members of the Committee, I would be more than grateful if you would write to them in behalf of the young man to whom this letter refers. The other members of the Committee are:

Dr. L. T. Franklin, Chillicothe, Ohio (Vice-President)
Dr. Carl W. Dewey, Conneaut, Ohio (Treasurer)
Dr. J.H.J. Upham, Columbus, Ohio
Dr. Roy C. Hunter, Wapakoneta, Ohio
Dr. C. W. Waggoner, Toledo, Ohio
Dr. Lee Humphree, Malta, Ohio

The young man in question is Dr. Max Krakauer, originally of Breslau, Germany, who graduated from the medical school of that city and interned in the Breslau local Jewish hospital. He came to America on January 5, 1936 and immediately obtained a position in the dispensary of the Sydenham Hospital, New York. A few months later he was appointed interne at the Jewish Hospital in Louisville, Ky. During the year 1937-38 he was interne at the Jewish Hospital in Cincinnati, and at this time is Resident in Medicine at that institution.

A few months after his arrival in America, Dr. Krakauer passed a perfect language examination, and three or four months later passed the New York State Board Examination licensing him to practice medicine in the State of New York. For fully half of the year he has been endeavoring to obtain a license to practice medicine in the State of Ohio, applying for such license to the State Medical Committee. Several of the members of the board of the Jewish hospital in Cincinnati and also some of the physicians at that institution have made efforts to help him in obtaining such license, but without avail. Dr. Krakauer has appeared before the State Medical Committee and they received him cordially and were well impressed with him. The only objection seems



Dear Friend:

This letter - a Holiday message to you - is a simple record of my thoughts, here in my office, at the silent end of a hurried day, a week before Christmas, 1938.

One week from today, you and I will celebrate a Birthday. So will everyone else in all of the so-called Christian nations. We are all a part of it, even though we pause only long enough to observe the ceremonies and festivities.

This day we celebrate is the Birthday of a Man called Christ -- even if we should forget about Him the other eleven months of the year. This Man and His Birthday and His Faith, have persisted for centuries, and "proved a mightier power than all the edicts of the Roman Emperors".

As we prepare for Christmas, and consider what it is all about, it might be well to stop and think of this:-

The Man called Christ was a Jew.

I am sure that my attitude of mind has never been described as exactly religious, but I do believe that I have enough clarity of vision to see that whatever of good I have enjoyed or been able to pass along to others has had a definite relation to this Man's incredible Faith, and to His antecedents.

These are distressing days. Intolerance and even hatred are abroad everywhere. Even in this country of traditional freedom and fairness, a disquieting murmur of prejudice has become distinctly audible.

Intolerance toward any minority group, religious or political, is just essentially wrong, and if such intolerance toward any particular minority group, (as, for example, the Jewish group today), is condoned or even permitted, there is an ever present danger of a similar injustice breaking into flames at any time.

The most terrifying moments of history have had their origin in mis-judgments made without the facts. So when I hear erroneous statements and false reports offered as authentic, -- well, I am afraid.

Shall I annoy you if I recite a thing or two that are facts, and that to my notion reflect a few experiences which have helped me to view a distorted picture with clear eyes?

In my work, extending for more than thirty years over a rather large area, I have known many Jews, some of them very intimately. I have sold to Jewish merchants in New York and Chicago where the Jewish characteristics are presumed to most accentuated. I have bought from Jewish manufacturers. I

have extended important credits to Jews, and I have borrowed substantial amounts from Jews. I have performed professional work for dozens of Jewish firms, large and small. I have worked closely with Jews in many activities, and I have had a number of Jewish employees and associates. I have lived for months in a Jewish household, and I never expect to see anywhere a more admirable family relationship than I found there, nor more sympathetic cordiality for myself. I have never seen the equal of a Jew for loyalty, once his commitment is made. As for friendship -- well, a Jewish friend once did a favor for me that has never been surpassed, and cannot be.

Yes, of course, there are some distasteful Jews, and there are also many others besides Jews equally displeasing. In my opinion, you can line up a hundred Jews, and a hundred Gentiles, picked at random, and you will find the same percentages of desirables and undesirables in both groups -- and the chances are that a good many undesirable traits of the Jews have been developed by Gentile malevolence.

Whenever I hear unkind whispers against a race that has given so much to the world's progress, I always wonder if the accuser has ever traced the Hebrew path from its Desert origin up to now. It is illuminating to go back to the time when Hebrew slaves worked in the Egyptian brickyards; then were led by Moses into Asia; the struggle in Palestine; the formation of the two Jewish Kingdoms, Israel and Judah; the sermons of Amos, the destruction of the Hebrew Kingdoms by Assyria and Chaldea, the orations of Isaiah; the exile to Babylon; the deliverance by Cyrus, the Persian King, -- and on and on, a continuous chronicle of oppression and rejuvenation, from that time until now. It must be a great people that can survive such misery and persecution.

As I grow older, I realize more and more how easy it is to be unjust and how hard it is to be fair. And it seems particularly fitting, at this Christmas Season, in the midst of so much unkindness, to oppose it and acknowledge what we must see is the truth, if we are ever to have Peace on Earth and Goodwill Toward Men that we all talk so much but never do anything about.

What is the Christmas Spirit? Is it the Christian Spirit? Sometimes I wonder.
