My dear Dr. Herzog:

I received your kind letter of September 3rd with reference to Rabbi Krislow. I also received communications from Mrs. Eva Kook and a note, also, from my own father.

Rabbi Krislow was in to see me this morning and we talked the matter over in great detail. The crux of the matter seems to be that he feels in all justice that he be permitted to divorce his wife. Under present conditions he cannot make a real home for himself or his four children. He feels that an unjust sacrifice is being demanded of him and his children. He is willing to bind himself legally to send his wife, after she is divorced, a minimum of \$20 a month (which, at the present rate of exchange, is equal to about five pounds) for as long as she will live. He is prepared to have that amount consigned directly from the congregation where he is now performing some rabbinical duties to you in Jerusalem, or through me, to you. He stated that he would send you \$20 a month for the next three months for Mrs. Krislow in the thought that you would take the preliminary steps necessary for the solution which he offers. I presume that he will write you direct. If there is any further thing that I can do in this matter, please feel free to call upon me.

I trust that you are well and that the trying conditions under which you must find yourself at present due to the war are not putting too many burdens upon you. I recall with keen pleasure my last visit to your home in Jerusalem, and I am looking forward eagerly to another such opportunity in the not too far distant future.


Dear Dr. Silver:

Please pardon the delay in answering your kind letter. The Holiday season and its manifold activities have made it impossible for me to answer all my correspondence promptly.

I think you need have no hesitancy in designating the Hebrew University in Jerusalem as a beneficiary of any bequest you would like to make in your will. There is no likelihood of an Arab state being established in Palestine in eight or ten years; nor need you hesitate about the Joint Distribution Committee, particularly if you will specify in your will the exact purposes for which you wish your bequest to be used. The Zionist Organization of America which has been in existence for a great number of years and which is likely to continue for many years to come, may also be entrusted with the administration of any funds which you might care to bequeath unto it. The offices of the Zionist Organization of America are at 111 Fifth Avenue, New York.

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

Dear Mr. Rabbi Silver:

One year ago I arrived with my wife from Vienna, Austria in this country and ten weeks ago we moved from Elizabeth N. J. to Cleveland. -

In Vienna I have been working in the mens and ladies clothing line and have had my own factory and very good reputation.

I was also travelling in many parts of the world, selling my production, especially in Sports-wear, and have good experience in this line for the last 25 years.

But after I came in this country
I saw that all my experiences are
not enough to satisfy the
manufacturer in this country and
to get a steady job.

I did my best to find any
kind of work during this time, but
all my exertions have been without
success!

I run from morning till evening
every day asking for work in
factories, retail stores etc., telling
everybody that I am willing to do
anything, but I got only promises
and no job.

I am 39 years of age, strong and
healthy, dear Mr. Rabbi, and for

the last 12 months compelled to
go idle.

I am really desperate and do not
know, what to do.

I speak, write and read english
very well and I thought that it
may be perhaps much easier for
me to get a job in this territory,
which was the reason that we moved
to Cleveland.

But also here it is very, very hard
to get a job without recommendation
and so I ask you dear Mr. Rabbi
to help me.

I am also related to Mr. Rabbi
Dr. Taglicht from Vienna and was
also member of many jewish

organisations in Vienna for the last 20 years. -

I have heard your speech last Sunday and I am confident, that only such a man like you dear Mr. Rabbi, could be able in this city to recommend me for any kind of work to your friends.

I am sure that, if you would be so kind to take interest on my fate, I could get work! - If you would ask anybody to give me work, I know that "nobody" could say, "no" to such a man like you dear Rabbi! -

at present we get relief from the Jewish Social Service Bureau, but I would be more than happy to find work, than to take the relief. -

Kindly please give me dear Mr. Rabbi the opportunity to speak with you personally and never in my life I will forget to thank you, if you would help me.

I know him quite well and he always was a trouble-maker. He worked in every knitting plant in town that has or had rachel machines, and this, in itself, is not a very good recommendation for him because a rachel operator, as a rule, stays put even when it's slack for a good rachel man is very scarce in the U. S.

Of course, I appreciate very much the attitude of the Rabbi and yourself in helping him, but it is my duty to see that you know the truth. He was always very glib of tongue and this letter bears this out. There has never been anyone in this mill in our rachel department who has approved the principles of Hitler and they are practically all 100% Germans. When that time comes here, there will be a very fine rachel plant for sale.

Please convey my kindest regards to the Rabbi as well as yourself.

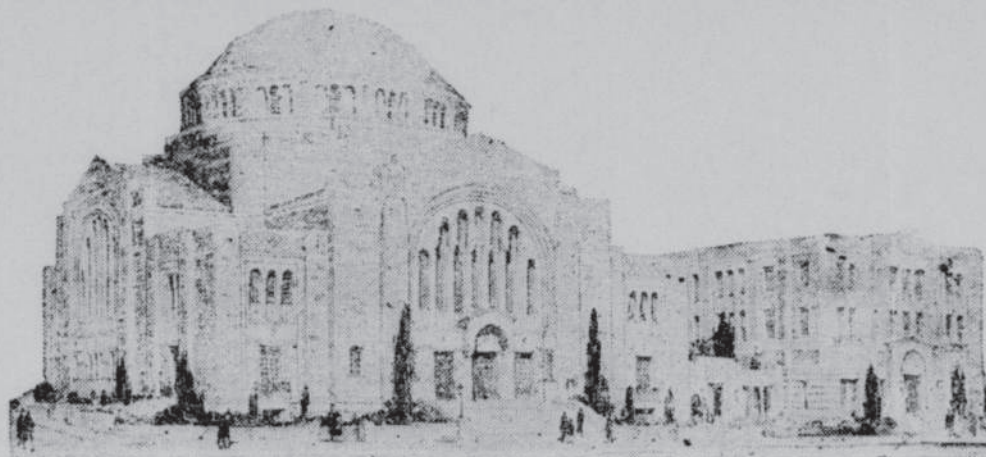


