I also received communications from Mrs. Eva Kook and a note, also, from my own father. Rabbi Krislow was in to see me this morning and we talked the matter over in great detail. The crux of the matter seems to be that he faels in all justice that he be permitted to divorce his wife. Under present conditions he cannot make a real home for himself or his four children. He feels that an unjust sacrifice is being demanded of him and his children. He is willing to bind himself legally to send his wife, after she is divorced, a minimum of \$20 a month (which, at the present rate of exchange, is equal to about five pounds) for as long as she will live. He is prepared to have that amount consigned directly from the congregation where he is no performing some rabbinical duties to you in Jerusalem, or through me, to you. He stated







Levinson, for two years a student at the Hebrew Union College and a resident of Cincinnati, Ohio. Mr. Levinson gives your name as a reference and I need not tell you how influential will be your judgment of his qualifications and his suitability. The tremendous pressure of work upon the League will make it necessary for us to add one or two very good men. While Mr. Levinson intimates that his leaning is toward the research end, I am not at the moment interested in a research worker. We have two very excellent men doing this for us now, not to mention a Dr. Sereno of the University of Chicago faculty, who is a part time research worker for the League, with particular respect to the Italian phase of our work. What we really want, Dr. Silver, is a man who within a period of three or six months could well represent us in conference groups. It should be a person whose appearance is good and who is sufficiently matured intellectually, to speak with that degree of authority calculated to inspire confidence. The demands upon me are multifarious. I should like to be able to assign with confidence, some of the responsibility of meeting community leaders on occasion, and of going into important aspects of the larger problem. I have some hesitancy in considering too youthful a person for this particular position, though the talents of Mr. Levinson might be employed by us in some other department.
