ISRAEL ABRAMOFSKY

Born and brought up in Southern Russia, Israel Abramofsky was exiled to Siberia as a young man for attending a Zionist meeting. Although released after two years, he continued to experience hardships which were perhaps the inevitable consequence of his determination to become an artist. He was obliged to train himself under conditions of unusual selfsacrifice. He came to Toledo, Ohio, in the early years of the century and has since gradually won increasing recognition both locally and nationally, having exhibited in nationally competitive shows both in New York and Chicago.

Others will be seen as gay and joyous, so that in combination the show represents a triumph of the human spirits, a fitting display for the serious and also festive occasion of the dedication of Hillel's new center at the Ohio State University.

The Palestine Economic Corporation takes pleasure in sending you the enclosed check in payment of a dividend of one dollar (\$1.00) a share on the Common Stock of record in your name at the close of business, February 5, 1949. This represents the twenty-fifth dividend paid by this Corporation.

As you will see from the Condensed Statement printed on the reverse side, the P.E.C. had a net profit of \$297,814 for the year ended December 31, 1948, as compared with \$268,787 for 1947.

As Hon. Henry Morgenthau, Jr., Chairman of our Board of Directors, observed at the Board meeting at which this statement was presented: "This is a remarkable report, taking into account the events of 1948, with dislocation and war throughout the country. It is a happy augury for our future operations, as great masses of immigrants pour into the country and make Israel the center of one of the great economic potentials of the world."

The Annual Report of the Palestine Economic Corporation is now in preparation and will be mailed during the month of March.

As a stockholder, you undoubtedly share my pride in what has been accomplished and my great hopes that 1949 will enable the P.E.C. to make an outstanding contribution to the productive economy of the State of Israel.

ADVICE TO ANDREW JACKSON BY HIS MOTHER

Andrew, if I should not see you again I wish you to remember and treasure up some things I have already said to you: In this world you will have to make your own way. To do that you must have friends. You can make friends by being honest, and you can keep them by being steadfast. You must keep in mind that friends worth having will in the long run expect as much from you as they give to you. To forget an obligation or be ungrateful for a kindness is a base crime. Not merely a fault or a sin, but an actual crime. Men guilty of it sooner or later must suffer the penalty. In personal conduct be always polite but never obsequious. None will respect you more than you respect yourself. Avoid quarrels as long as you can without yielding to imposition. But sustain your manhood always. Never bring a suit in law for assault and battery or for defamation. The law affords no remedy for such outrages that can satisfy the feeling of a true man. Never wound the feelings of others. Never brook wanton outrage upon your own feelings. If you ever have to vindicate your feelings or defend your honor, do it calmly. If angry at first, wait till your wrath cools before you proceed.
