

To the Stockholders of The Israel Corporation of America:

The merger of objectives and interests between The Israel Corporation of America ("ICA") and Palestine Economic Corporation ("PEC") has been consummated and ICA has been dissolved. As a result, each public stockholder is entitled to receive \$1 of PEC Common Stock (taken at the PEC offering price) for each \$1 of ICA stock (taken at the ICA offering price) paid for by such public stockholder. Since the PEC Common Stock is being offered and sold at \$28 per share and since the ICA stock was sold at \$25 per unit (each unit consisting of one Preferred Share and one Common Share), this means that each public stockholder is entitled to receive 25/28ths of a share of PEC Common Stock for each unit of ICA stock purchased by him.

Wherever an ICA stockholder is entitled to receive a fractional interest in one share, this fractional interest is evidenced by a scrip certificate. For example, if you hold six units of ICA stock, you are entitled to 5.3571 shares of PEC Common Stock. You will, therefore, receive a stock certificate for five full shares of PEC Common Stock and a scrip certificate representing an interest 3,571/ 10,000ths of one full share of PEC Common Stock.

Enclosed with this letter are the stock and scrip certificates for PEC Common Stock to which you are entitled on the foregoing basis. You will note that scrip certificates do not confer voting powers and do not entitle the holders to dividends until converted into stock certificates. The enclosed letter from PEC explains how you may round out your scrip certificate. Since by its terms, the scrip certificate expires on June 30, 1950, we urge you to take appropriate action before that time so as not to lose the value represented by the scrip certificate.

We have handled the liquidation of ICA so as to permit the distribution to you of your PEC stock certificates without your being required to go through the process of turning in your ICA certificates. The PEC certificates enclosed represent your full distributable share of ICA's assets and the ICA stock certificates which you hold are now wholly void and without value. Such ICA certificates should be destroyed by you at your convenience so as to prevent confusion in your own records.

However, we must view with alarm how successfully the politicians in both our countries have built up class legislation and class distinction, dividing our peoples. That is the most dangerous road man can travel.

England and America face the same problems. The liberty of man is in danger by State Socialism. Liberty is now revealed as the BREAD AND BUTTER DOCUMENT of "we, the people" in our countries. Liberty fostered the growth of our countries into world powers. Without such liberties, we become a socialized people. If we believe that God created man and endowed him with personality above other animals, then we cannot accept State Socialism, which is tyranny over the mind of man. It is time that Socialism be exposed for exactly what it is, and WHAT IT WILL DO TO THE PEOPLE, AND NOT FOR THE PEOPLE. It was the individual "know-how" - independent planning and financing in free markets, regulated but not controlled, which made England and America leading industrial powers. Bureaucracy, by Governmental direction, should not invade the fields of competitive enterprise and compete with business. Governments never have produced, nor can they produce, wealth. That is not their function or duty. They should police the laws, not control the functions of business. The only money Government has, or can get, is through taxing the people, and when it cannot get enough in taxes - directly - it hides them; and hidden taxes are deceptive and immoral.

Politicians have discovered that votes may be had cheaply when people are fooled and not told the facts about the consequences of policies that embrace Socialism. To have rabbit soup, first snare the rabbit. Socialism, to make headway, must ensare the people. It means the complete denial of the right and capacity of the people to manage themselves and the things they own. MANAGEMENT SHOULD EXPLAIN THAT TO THE PEOPLE.

God created man for HIS PURPOSE, to be free, and to be of service to his fellow man; not to any State. God created man for the purpose of the political State, says Socialism.

The present trends toward Governmental authority and less individual responsibility are more vicious precisely because they are hidden revolutionary acts, and hence imperceptible to the average citizen. The greater the number who profit from Governmental

benevolence, the lesser the public vigilance and the greater the public complacency. These are the erosive processes that wear down the rock of liberty, and then suddenly the rock is not there any more. In its place is the quicksend - political "authority, " and that soon hardens into concrete bands - "the ball and chain." Always remember, power, once usurped, is never voluntarily surrendered. Real power rests in the hands of the people, if we will only use it; and so our countries are in a race between EDUCATION and CATASTROPHE. We cannot expect the people to defend that which they do not understand. The people of our countries can do anything if they are only told why, but they must be told; otherwise they will accept State Socialism - the Welfare State - without realizing it is a sister of Communism. EUSINESS SHOULD EXPOSE THESE TRENDS.

Management is paid its salary by those whose moneys are in the business - so-called shareholders. They expect a return so-called dividends - for the use of their moneys: their expectation is a reasonable assumption. Management in our countries are the trustees, guardians and administrators of the savings of the people, and they should assume their obligations to public and moral issues. Socialism is a moral issue. If management have not the stomach for a fight to protect their rights to remain as menagers of our profit and loss and competitive systems, whom do they PROPOSE SHOULD DO THIS FOR THEM? The <u>vast majority</u> in both our countries are neglecting that responsibility. They have been overstressing the value of silence. They fight like a pack of wildcats to protect their competitive positions, while maintaining a platform of silence and aloofness in

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defense of their rights to remain in business. Silence may be golden, but todaye it is cowardly and suicidal, when witnessing the undermining of the very foundations of our freedoms and wealth creating systems. There are volumes on the theories of Socialism going into plants, practically nothing on the theories of a sound, Free society!

National and local advertisers spend billions yearly promoting sales for their products. If we are to remain solvent nations, we must <u>RESELL</u> to our people Liberty, which is our BREAD AND BUTTER DOCUMENT, and has more value than all the assets and good will of all our productive institutions. If we lose Liberty, we lose these assets. They become worthless because they become the property of a Socialized State. Then we are ensnared in a socialized millennium. EXPLAIN THAT TO THE PEOPLE.

Not long ago, in political campaigns in both our countries, there was sprung the theory of "SOMETHING FOR NOTHING." A new day dawned in our Republic, and in England. It is an undebatable fact that the public psychology changed. The results have been far-spread, the production of wealth per individual has been lessened sharply. The initiative of both our peoples formed the habit of napping loafing on the job. The citizen, himself, changed, and there is no evidence that he changed for the better. Thoughtful people in our countries feel that the acceptance of an UNEXPLAINED SECURITY is rapidly destroying any hope of their security; - yet Sgeialism now called the Welfare State - has not been explained.

Today we are financing Governments by taxes upon the backs of the people. They are prefinanced by Government Bonds. Much

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is made of the security of Government Bonds; little is said of the things too many such Bonds can created. Billions poured into such Bonds have a tendency to remove VENTURE CAPITAL from industry and commerce. Our Governments produce no wealth, and that is the only source which can yield taxes. To docalize industry is to cripple industry in order to EXPAND SOCIALISM. The aims of Socialism should be explained to those who work with their hands in plain and simple words, which bounce along the sidewalk. Our dollars, and the English pounds, which are withdrawn from industry, are taxes for big Government, and the dollars and pounds are LOST TO PRODUCTION. In other words, Government, lacking business ingenuity, returns nothing to the taxpayer as interest on his money, as private industry must do to keep the shareholders' moneys in the business. The reverse of this situation is that Government takes the moneys from the people to compete against business activities, without the "know-how" to return some rent for the taxpayers' money.

Ponder this: should not this be explained to those who work with their hands; or should they be continually and insidiously indoctrinated that Government can run industry better than the industrialists run it themselves?

By continuing wasteful Governmental spending, and increasing bureaucracy, the nation's business is being taxed INTO WEAKNESS. These man-made trends, unless checked and reversed, will make business and those who work with their hands slaves to Government.

The strength of our Governments is the productivity of the

people. It is no more, no less than that. When a Socialized State provides man's security by doing for him that which he could, and should, do for himself, it assails his best work, destroys his initiative, stultifies his inspirations and arrests his imagination. The Socialized State would stuff our nations with a wax managerie of automatons. The politicians pull the string and we jump accordingly. It would still the lathe, stop the plough and sink the future. It would make cringing beggars of proud men, cowards of strong men and serfs of our peoples. It is well we think - write - talk of these things upon all occasions if we are to think about our children. This, in my humble opinion, is the obligation of management of our industrial activities, because they are the trustees and the administrators of the people's moneys at work, which are in the **busi**nesses which built our countries.

When freedom is weakened, - Socialism takes over; - the people's moneys at work are out of business, - SO IS MANAGEMENT - Management should carry the torch - to enlighten and inform all the people. A few are doing it; all should be doing it.
