Dear Dr. Silver:

I am enclosing a memorandum on the subject of The Forrestal Diaries together with notes of my recent conference with Senator Brewster on the same subject. This information represents historical facts -- facts which somehow ought to be put to their proper use.

I do not know whether you are preparing your memoirs or whether anybody else is now writing, or contemplates writing, a book about you. Whoever writes such a history ought to include reference to the fine job you did in bringing about United States and United Nations recognition of a free Palestine with the help and support of Bob Taft, Owen Brewster and others. I carried out your wishes. You were my commander and I your "sentry" in the field.

There is also George Sokolsky. You will recall the job he and I did at Philadelphia at the time of the GOP convention at your direction. These are facts which must become part of the historical record as later the Democratic National Convention only followed suit.

When my final conference with Truman to approve partition of Palestine and to disapprove of the trusteeship failed, I visited with Governor Dewey. He subsequently issued a statement in support of the partition plan. But the fact remains we tried to keep this whole question out of politics.

The question now is whether a magazine article should be written giving the highlights of the story. What is your suggestion?

I am sure George Sokolsky, in his column, can debate the subject. My views that Forrestal changed his mind and so indicated, are now confirmed by the statement of the former Israeli Ambassador, Elishu Elath. This is borne out by the enclosed copy of letter to the Editor, Chicago Daily News, of October 26, 1951. I am anxious to get your reaction and recommendation.

I am taking the liberty of sending copies of the enclosed material, marked confidential, to both Senators Taft and Brewster, and also to George Sokolsky.

P.S. Since dictating this letter I had the pleasure of talking to you on the telephone, and I am glad to learn that Dr. Neumann is writing a book. I think all these facts ought to be incorporated, and particularly pictures of the New York and Chicago parades of Jewish War Veterans who, at your direction, organized huge rallies for a free Palestine. This, and the story to keep the Palestine question out of American party politics, in which you and the rest of us played such an important part, should be given properly deserved space in Dr. Neumann's book.

I find that the stenographer's notes on my conference with Senator Brewster, referred to in the first paragraph of this letter, are not yet completed -- and rather than hold up this correspondence I shall let those notes follow in a few days.

(freight alongside ship) value, without a special import license or other formalities, if the articles are intended for the personal use of the recipient only. A maximum number of four such shipments totalling \$112.00 (\$120. Canadian) each may be received by any one family in Israel in one year.

GIFTS ABOVE \$112.00 (\$120. Canadian)

If you wish to send new or used gifts to Israel the value of which is more than \$112.00 (\$120. Canadian) f.a.s., you must first obtain an import license.

HOW TO APPLY FOR AN IMPORT LICENSE

Following is the procedure for applying for an import license:-

1. Complete the attached form.
 2. Have your signature notarized by a Notary Public and certified by the County Clerk in whose office the Notary Public's signature is registered.
 3. Mail the completed form with your own signature and that of the Notary Public and County Clerk to the Israel Consulate for authentication. Enclose check for \$2.00 for the Consular fee for authentication.
- NOTE: You may sign the statement at the Consulate, provided you can call in person between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, bringing with you some document of identification bearing your signature (passport, driver's license, social security card). If you call in person, you do not require the Notary or County Clerk signature on your document.
4. After authentication, the document will be mailed back to you.
 5. You should then mail the authenticated document to the person in Israel who is to receive the gift article.
 6. The recipient in Israel then applies for an import license to the licensing authorities in Israel, on the basis of the authenticated document.
 7. If an import license is granted, the recipient in Israel must inform you of the number of the import license.

8. After you have received the import license number from Israel, you may ship the article to Israel. The consignment must be clearly marked "Import License No.....Obtained". DO NOT SHIP CONSIGNMENT BEFORE RECEIPT OF IMPORT LICENSE NUMBER FROM ISRAEL.
9. After the consignment arrives in Israel, the recipient will be able to clear it through customs upon presentation of the actual import license document.

PAYMENT OF CUSTOMS DUTY

If you wish, you may prepay customs duty at the Israel Consulate for new articles only, provided:-

1. You have received the import license number from Israel for any article which costs more than \$112.00 (\$120. Canadian), AND
2. The article, whether under or over \$112.00 (\$120. Canadian) in value, can be assessed easily, such as electrical appliances.

For prepayment of customs duty at the Consulate, you must present, by mail or in person, a detailed invoice covering the cost of the article, packing, insurance and freight to Israel, the manufacturer's name, model number, and net weight. If you call at the Consulate in person for the purpose of prepaying customs duty, please note that the office hours of the Customs Department are 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

If you do not wish to prepay the customs duty at the Israel Consulate, the recipient of your gift can pay the duty in Israel upon arrival of the gift, unless otherwise specified on the import license.

PLEASE NOTE: Customs duty for used articles can ONLY BE PAID IN ISRAEL, unless the duty rate is based on weight.

HOW TO MAIL GIFT PARCELS

Parcels sent through the U.S. post office via parcel post to Israel, may not weigh over 22 pounds, nor measure over 42 inches in length, nor have a combined length and girth of over 72 inches. Sealing is optional. These parcels cannot be registered or insured. Two customs declarations (Form 2966) which may be obtained from the post office, must be attached to each parcel post package. The package itself must be clearly marked "U.S. Bona Fide Gift Parcel". It costs \$5.90 to send a 22 pound parcel to Israel via parcel post.

Air parcel post service is available at \$1.42 for the first four ounces and 67¢ for each additional ounce.

Goods above 22 pounds in weight, should be sent by ship. There are two Israel shipping lines whose freighters ply regularly between the U.S.A., Canada, and Israel. They are:-




We no longer have any FB-64 ranges but we can supply our F7-64 which is a new version of the same range for export to Israel. Your price on this range would be \$119.66 net, F.A.S., New York, export packed. In view of the fact that Israel has a 2 wire, 220 Volt power supply, it would also be advisable for you to order our 2L-18 transformer to go with this range at a net price of \$17.50, F.A.S., New York. This transformer supplies the necessary amount of 110 Volt power required for the two lowest heats on the surface unit switches.

The only drawback to our excepting your order of this range would be that to the best of our knowledge an import license is required by the Israeli government, even though the range is shipped from this country as a gift. We would be unable to obtain your order until you have obtained the necessary import license.

We assume that ocean freight and Marine insurance on this range would not amount to more than \$25.00 and if this estimate is excessive, we would, of course, refund you any balance.

Please let me know if I can give you any further information on this.

Town and Village Dines

The pilgrims had very little choice. However, from all reports, the first Thanksgiving menu was neither sparse nor lacking in variety. This, despite the fact that the selection was confined almost wholly to indigenous food. For although many of the viands were familiar, both the turkey and the cranberry, borrowed from the Indian cuisine, were novelties.

If any of the settlers wept at having to eat this native fare, no complaint is on record. But human nature being what it is, doubtless there was a fellow like that present.

"If only we were back in England," he probably wailed, "we wouldn't have to eat this awful foreign food!"

The man's descendants are legion. Like him, they eye any except familiar things to eat with mistrust, anguish and suspicion. More adaptable folk, however, gratefully accept good food from all over the world. But liking it and being able to buy it are two different things.

This unhappy discovery was made recently by one of my students. He returned from a trip to his native Kansas City completely unnerved. And announced that a city-wide trudge encompassing groceries in foreign neighborhoods as well as in classy suburbs, had netted him few of the wares available on almost every corner here.

So a double thank you this year. The first for being American. And the second for living in NYC.

Unusual Edibles

Because New York boasts wares of the world, you may want to add some of the less familiar items to your Thanksgiving menu this year. Here are a few suggestions for making your holiday table a truly international affair.

Begin with the hors d'oeuvre. And consider the fat juley herring that Holland sends. Filets rolled around sour pickles will set a palate-whetting pace for the meal. Smoked eel, typical of the Scandinavian countries, makes a rich but

delicately-flavored addition to your tray. And you can also offer a heaping plate of the unctuous, treacled Greek olives. These are so inexpensive, that cultivating a taste for them is almost a practical economy.

Accent your first course fruit cup with pine nuts and currants. These sturdy, cheerfully-flavored ingredients of Balkan background go well with grapefruit or orange sections.

Tarragon, a native of southern Asia, can be the foreign touch you add to your turkey. Tuck a small amount of the herb into the turkey stuffing for exotic and unusual flavor.

Salute Hungary as you dapple your creamed onions with paprika. For its sweetness flavors and its fresh color attractively garnishes all pale foods.

World-Wide Coverage

Down to Switzerland with Gruyere cheese. Beat some that has been grated fine into a snowy drift of mashed potato. Pile into a casserole, sprinkle with additional cheese and bear the crusty-topped, even-browned dish proudly to the table.

If squash is the vegetable that invariably graces your Thanksgiving board, enliven it with dill seeds this year. A comestible common in India for centuries, the seeds delightfully announce their pungent presence.

Try enlivening your mixed green salad with thin slices of leek. A member of the onion family, the food-wise French use it widely for sprightly savor.

Of course your relish tray will hold cranberries, carrot sticks and celery. This year, add fennel. An Italian favorite, it's a vegetable with lively anise flavor.

No unusual lily-gilding is necessary with our pumpkin pie, for it has always been spiced with all the riches of the Orient. And coffee is also a familiar foreign guest.

As for liquor, your before-dinner toast can be drunk in Scotch, vodka or Irish whiskey. You can wash the meal down with wine from almost any country in the world. And with the after-dinner fruit and nuts, for a special treat, sip a glass of smoky Chinese brandy. Oh, how those nations unite!

of its constitutionality.

(Another view of the constitutionality of this bill is reported on page 2.—Ed.)

"The bill would not have been written by those experts, or presented to the Council by the JTOC, if there were serious doubt about its constitutionality. Furthermore, there is no guarantee that any measure passed by a legislative body is constitutional; that is not for the legislative body to decide, but for the courts to decide.

"The important thing is that this bill is in the public interest, it is properly drafted, and it can be enacted — provided the tenants of Stuyvesant Town convince the City Council that they must support it, just as we convinced the Board of Estimates that they should reject Metropolitan's petition for an increase."

Asks Letters

The JTOC urged all tenants to write to the members of the General Welfare Committee, demanding that they take prompt and

favorable action on the bill. Each can be addressed at the City Council Chamber, City Hall, New York 7, N. Y.

The Committee members are Councilman Hugh Quinn, chairman, and Councilmen Frederick Schick, Edward Vogel, Edward Cunningham, Thomas J. Mirabile, Morris J. Stein, James J. Boland, John J. Merli and Stanley Isaacs.

"If every tenant will write to at least three of these Councilmen," Mr. Fowler said, "our work in persuading them to approve the bill will be helped immeasurably."

Two Councilmen have already expressed themselves in favor of controlling Stuyvesant Town rents; they are Robert Weisberger, of our own district, and Jeremiah B. Bloom.

The JTOC also continued to study the possibility of petitioning the City to move in court to reform the contract with Metropolitan. Reuben Schreiber, chairman of the JTOC's legal group reported that it is making a study along the lines suggested by Mr. Sharkey two weeks ago.

A JTOC delegation also visited Assemblyman Francis McGowan this week to discuss the possibility of action by the State Legislature to control Stuyvesant Town rents. In line with this, the City Council will be asking next month to memorialize the State Legislature in favor of such action.

Changes Name

At the JTOC Delegates' Council meeting last week, the name of the organization was officially changed from "Joint Tenants and Organizations Committee" to "Joint Tenants' Organizations Committee," since it was felt that the latter title more accurately represents

the nature of the group, which is composed of more than 50 building organizations, each of them representing tenants in those buildings.

It was incorrectly announced last week that David Mandel, building delegate of 624 East 20th Street, had been elected to the Delegate Council. Mr. Mandel is a JTOC sector captain, but was not elected to the Delegate Council.

The name of J. Harrington Harlow, building delegate of 6 Stuyvesant Oval, was omitted from the listing of executive committee members. Mr. Harlow was elected at the previous Delegate Council meeting.







Ten Indictments in Canton

CANTON, N. Y., Dec. 17 (AP)—Ten sealed indictments were returned today by the special grand jury investigating gambling and possible political corruption in St. Lawrence County.

Charles Del Vecchio, special prosecutor, would not disclose how many persons had been named or what the charges were. He said those indicted would be arraigned tomorrow before Justice Earle C. Bastow of the State Supreme Court.

The jury, which has heard testimony from 141 witnesses since Nov. 28, was adjourned until Jan. 21. The prosecutor reported that it had completed four phases of the investigation—slot machine operation, the financial assets of present and former Ogdensburg officials, horse-room operations and possible perjury.

The special inquiry was ordered by Governor Dewey after the State Crime Commission had held a public hearing last summer in Ogdensburg.







More and more of our boys are going away to service. We should like to keep in touch with them as we did during the war in a systematic way. They appreciate hearing from The Temple from time to time and on the occasion of holidays they were remembered by The Temple with gifts of one kind or another. The policy of our government being what it is, we may count upon a continuing draft of young people into the armed services for some years to come.

We have up to now inserted announcements in The Temple Bulletin asking parents to send in the names of sons (or daughters) who have joined the armed services, but we have found from past experience that this is not satisfactory. In the past the matter was handled systematically by a committee which followed up all reports of Temple boys away at service and kept a record of them. Such a committee, I believe, should now be appointed and it should have on it representatives from the Women's Association, the Men's Club, Mr. and Mrs. Club and Alumni Association. The committee need not be large, but should be active.

When you are here next, I should like to discuss the matter with you more fully.


Dear Dr. Silver:
