TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

"Hospital Service" is defined to mean receiving a subscriber upon recommendation of a physician or surgeon, as provided in Section 3 below, into a Participating or other Contracting Hospital or any other hospital as provided herein as a bed patient, and furnishing to such subscriber if needed for the period hereinafter set forth, the following:

1. Bed in the class of room provided for in his contract.
2. Meals, including special diets and infant feedings.
3. General nursing service.
4. Operating room, cystoscopic room, cast room and treatment room services.
5. All anesthesia equipment and supplies and the administration of anesthesia by an employee of the hospital.
6. X-ray examinations, when available in the hospital, including interpretation and professional supervision but excluding treatment.
7. Laboratory service, including interpretation and professional supervision.

8. Basal metabolism examinations, including interpretation and professional supervision.
9. Electrocardiograms, including interpretation and professional supervision.
10. Electroencephalograms, when available in the hospital, including interpretation and professional supervision.
11. Physical therapy, when available in the hospital, including administration and professional supervision.
12. Blood transfusions, including administration and blood typing, but excluding blood or blood plasma.
13. Oxygen and all drugs listed in the United States Pharmacopoeia (XIV); National Formulary (Ninth Edition); and New and Non-Official Remedies (1951), (including all supplements to these three publications made official prior to May 1, 1951).
14. Furnishing of radium and radioactive substances when owned by the hospital.
15. Preparation and use of gauze, cotton, fabrics, solutions, plaster and other materials in dressings or casts.

B. "Hospital Service" shall include maternity care, including the use of the delivery room and the care of the new born infant during the hospital stay of the mother, provided the mother has been enrolled under a family contract for 9 consecutive months next preceding the date of admission.

C. "Hospital Service" as provided for in this section shall be made available for a period not to exceed 30 days for each Hospital Confinement, and in case of hospitalization for more than 30 days, the subscriber shall receive a credit to apply on the charges of the hospital after such period in the amount of \$4.00 per day of hospital service to subscribers holding ward contracts and \$5.00 per day of hospital service in case of subscribers holding semi-private contracts, for a period of 90 days. "Hospital Confinement" means a continuous period of hospital confinement or successive periods of hospital confinement when the last date of discharge and the date of readmission are separated by less than 3 months. When more than 3 months separate the date of discharge and the date of readmission, another period of Hospital Confinement shall be available.

D. If, because of sudden illness or emergency, the subscriber is unable to reach one of the Participating or Contracting Hospitals and receives hospitalization as a bed patient in a hospital which has entered into a contract or arrangements with another approved Blue Cross hospital service plan, and provided there is then in effect a reciprocal agreement between such plan and this Association, the subscriber so hospitalized shall receive those hospital service benefits which subscribers of such Blue Cross Plan are entitled to receive, except that the periods during which such benefits shall be made available shall be as stated in this agreement.

E. If, because of sudden illness or emergency, the subscriber is unable to reach one of the Par-

participating or Contracting Hospitals and receives hospitalization as a bed patient in a hospital which has not entered into a contract or arrangements with another approved Blue Cross hospital service plan, or if the subscriber selects for hospital care any non-profit hospital in the State of Ohio which has no such contract or arrangement with another approved Blue Cross hospital service plan, then in either of such circumstances, the Service Association, upon receipt of notice and upon making said arrangements with such hospital for rendering service to the subscriber, will pay to such hospital the following sums:

1. The amount actually charged to the subscriber by such hospital for room, meals and general nursing services for each day of such hospital confinement, but not more than \$6.50 per day for subscribers holding semi-private contracts or \$5.00 per day for subscribers holding ward contracts during the first 30 days of each hospital confinement, and thereafter up to and including an additional 90 days at not more than \$5.00 per day for subscribers holding semi-private contracts or \$4.00 per day for subscribers holding ward contracts during such hospital confinement as defined in Section 2C of this contract.
2. The amount actually charged to the subscriber by such hospital for Hospital Services, as described in Section 2A of this contract, except room, meals and general nursing services, during such confinement, but not more than \$65.00 for subscribers holding semi-private contracts or \$50.00 for subscribers holding ward contracts, during any one confinement as defined in Section 2C of this contract.

If it is necessary that the subscriber avail himself of this provision, he should advise the hospital to which he is admitted to communicate with the Service Association immediately.

F. "Hospital Service" shall include in accident cases (not requiring hospital bed care) services of the character set forth above and excluding therefrom any fee of an attending physician or surgeon for services rendered, provided that such services shall be rendered within 24 hours of the accident, and further provided that such service is available at the hospital. In respect of accident services (not requiring hospital bed care) at a hospital that is not a Participating or Contracting Hospital, the benefit payable hereunder shall not exceed the amount of \$25.00.

G. "Hospital Service" does not include the following:

1. Services of a subscriber's attending physician, surgeons, or special nurses or their board, or other medical services except as described in this Section 2.
2. Ambulatory care, except as provided in Paragraph F of this section, which is defined to mean care rendered to one who is not regularly admitted to a hospital as a bed patient. Ambulatory care includes but is not limited to such services as hospital admissions solely for x-ray, laboratory and basal metabolism examinations, minor surgery, dentistry, elec-

trocardiograms, electroencephalograms, radiotherapy and physical therapy not incidental to necessary care as a bed patient.

3. Care in a health resort or rest home, or in an institution not providing constant care by registered nurses.
4. Care of industrial injuries or diseases if any hospital service is available to the subscriber under Workmen's Compensation Laws.
5. Care in veteran and marine hospitals.
6. Care provided by any governmental agency without cost to the subscriber.
7. Care of pulmonary tuberculosis or mental disease (psychosis) in hospitals operated by local, State or Federal governments.
8. Services of blood donors.
9. Special braces, appliances and ambulatory apparatus.

H. "Semi-private room" is defined to be a room containing two or three beds.

I. "Ward room" is defined to be a room containing four or more beds.

J. "Day of Hospital Service," as used herein, is defined to mean the period, or any part thereof, between the census taking hours of two successive days. The "census taking hour" is defined to be the hour fixed by the Participating or other Contracting Hospital for counting the patients to whom it is rendering hospital care. In computing the number of days of hospital service furnished by the Participating or other Contracting Hospital to the subscriber, the day of the subscriber's admission shall be counted, but the day of discharge shall not be counted unless the subscriber is discharged upon the same day on which he or she is admitted.

K. By the acceptance of the delivery of this agreement, the subscriber hereby designates the hospital furnishing services to him or eligible family members as his agent to pay those charges incurred during the hospitalization defined under the terms of this section, and authorizes such hospital to seek reimbursement for such payment from the Service Association.

Section 3

Admission To Hospital

Hospital Service will be rendered to the subscriber only upon the recommendation of a physician or surgeon who is licensed to practice medicine by the State of Ohio and who is acceptable for practice in the Participating or other Contracting Hospital to which such recommendation is directed, and only during such time as the subscriber is under the treatment and care of such a physician or surgeon.

Section 4

Discharge By A Doctor

Hospital Service will not be rendered to the subscriber after notice to the Participating or other Contracting Hospital rendering such service by the physician or surgeon attending the subscriber that further hospitalization is unnecessary.

Section 5

Hospital Rules

Both the subscriber and the Physician or Surgeon attending the subscriber agree to conform to the rules and regulations, including the rules and regulations governing admittance and discharge, of the Participating or other Contracting Hospital to which the subscriber applies for admission or is admitted.

Section 6

Identification

The subscriber when required shall present his receipt to date or card of identification when applying for hospital service.

Section 7

More Expensive Accommodations

When a patient who is a subscriber to the Service Association requests more expensive accommodations, he may occupy such accommodations, if available, by paying the difference between the established room rates in the accommodations provided for in his contract and the more expensive accommodations.

The subscriber to the Service Association in paying the difference between established rates for the accommodations provided in his contract and the established rates for better accommodations, will carry with him into his better accommodations all the provisions of his contract which he would receive if he occupied the accommodations provided for in his contract.

Section 8

Accommodations Not Available

If, upon request by the subscriber for admission to any Participating or other Contracting Hospitals, all beds in the class of service provided for in his contract of such hospital should be filled, the subscriber agrees temporarily to accept accommodations of a different classification, which may be either less expensive or more expensive until a bed in the class of service provided for in his contract is available at which time the subscriber agrees to be moved into such bed. If all beds of such Participating or other Contracting Hospital are occupied, the subscriber agrees to accept a bed in the class of service provided for in his contract of another Participating or other Contracting Hospital to be selected by him or her, having such a bed available. If a bed in the class of service provided for in his contract is not available in any other Participating or other Contracting Hospital, the subscriber agrees to accept accommodations of a different classification, which may be either less expensive, or more expensive, in a Participating or other Contracting Hospital, to be selected by him or her, having such accommodations available, until a bed in the class of service provided for in his contract of such Participating or other Contracting Hospital is available, at which time the subscriber agrees to be moved into such bed. If all beds of every classification in all Participating or other Contracting Hospitals are filled at the time, the Service Association will refund to the subscriber a sum equal to twice the amount of the annual charge under this service contract, and the

subscriber agrees to accept said sum as liquidated damages in full and final discharge of the obligations and liabilities of each and all of the Participating or other Contracting Hospitals hereunder.

Section 9

Selection of Physician or Surgeon

This contract does not confer upon any Participating or other Contracting Hospital any right to select a physician or surgeon for the subscriber. The subscriber shall be at liberty to select his or her physician or surgeon, provided only that such physician or surgeon be licensed to practice medicine by the State of Ohio and be acceptable for practice in the Participating or other Contracting Hospital to which the subscriber is admitted, and nothing contained in this contract shall interfere with the ordinary relationship between the subscriber and any such physician or surgeon selected by the subscriber.

Section 10

Contract Not Transferable

No person other than the subscriber or his spouse or members of his family if entitled to hospital service hereunder, are entitled to any benefits under this contract. It is not transferable, and shall be forfeited if the subscriber attempts to transfer it, or aids or attempts to aid any other person in obtaining any benefits under it.

Section 11

Grace Period

This contract shall be forfeited if the subscriber fails to make any payment within thirty (30) days after the same becomes due and payable as provided in Section 1 above.

Section 12

Association Is Agent Only

This contract is executed by the Service Association solely as agent of the Participating or other Contracting Hospitals and nothing herein contained shall confer upon the subscriber or his spouse or any member of his family if entitled to hospital service hereunder, any claim, right, action or cause of action, either at law or in equity, against the Service Association except for its own acts and omissions.

Section 13

General Conditions

All service contracts shall be on printed forms which shall be provided by the Service Association. Neither the Service Association nor any of its agents or employees is authorized to vary or change the form or intent of such contract in any manner or degree except to make necessary and proper insertions in blank spaces. No service contract shall bind the Participating or other Contracting Hospitals to render Hospital Service for a period extending beyond one year after the date of its execution or renewal. Any notice herein provided for shall be conveyed to, and shall have been deemed to have been received by the party entitled to receive such notice, if the same is deposited in the United States mails, with postage prepaid, addressed to the home, principal office or place of business of such party.
