

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



My dear Dr. Silver,

Permit me to wish you a real Happy and Prosperous New Year, in every respect.

I didn't want to bother you until now, knowing that you were away during the Summer, and then how occupied a rabbi is during the high holidays. But I hope that you will find a few minutes to read this letter and answer it.

Did you hear from our friends in Israel whether they have received the tractor, and was it in good condition? While I was bothering for several months, expending time, energy and money in arranging the shipment of the tractor, they were continously in contact with me. But the moment the tractor was finally shipped, no one even bothered as much as to send me a word of thanks, nor to inform me whether or not it had arrived in good shape.

You may know it or not, but after almost two years of hard and devoted work for the General Zionists of Israel, I received some time ago a letter of some ten words, signed by an undersecretary, informing me that I have been fired.

Well and good, but they remained owing me \$180 for expenses here which I have advanced and which I can ill afford. I don't want to embarrass our friends there by asking them to pay me the \$180 here, because the censor may open the letter and gain the impression that they have hidden dollar funds in the U.S. So, when Mr. Eerlin arrived here last June, I sent him a detailed account, but he never even bothered to answer. I then wrote him again, and still no answer.

Now, I ask you, Dr. Silver, is that fair? You can be sure that I am not going to publicize the matter. But why should I be treated in such a manner?

Some day I may tell you about the intrigues that led to my being fired, but that is besides the point now.

Thirty some-odd years have now passed since my first acquaintance with you and your temile. In this space of time my husband and I were married by you.

I cannot help but remember in the past and now in the present, the great humanitarian work you have accomplished. This has always filled my family as well as myself with creat pride. Dear Dr. Silver:

In reply to your letter of November 6, Mr. Leonard Siegel first indicated interest in the Hebrew Union College in a long distance telephone call this August. He was invited to come down for an interview and was seen briefly by Dr. Marcus and myself. We said he would be given the opportunity of appearing before the Admissions Committee at its final meeting in October. In the meantime, at his request, he was given provisional draft deferment until the time his application would be acted upon regularly.

Mr. Siegel's application was rejected because in the opinion of the Committee and in the judgment of the College psychiatrist, he was not emotionally ready to come into the College. His academic record was just average. It was also observed by the Committee that Mr. Siegel had floundered in a number of fields of interest from pre-medical studies to optometry, etc. In general, the College cannot undertake to explain to each candidate the reason for its rejection, particularly when personality factors are involved.

We have had numerous long distance calls and letters regarding this applicant. It is possible that one of the reasons for Mrs. Siegel's anxiety is the fact that the College found it necessary to withdraw Leonard's provisional theological deferment.

Mr. Siegel has been informed that he may resubmit his application for next year. At the same time he was advised to consider other vocational choices.

The threats made to Mr. Siegel by authorities of Western Reserve University for his alleged failure to join the Communist Party are obscure. We have no documents concerning this and have found it difficult to understand Mr. Siegel's highly emotionalized attitude.

From our cwn observations, Mr. Siegel has been going through a very difficult period. His rejection by the College climaxed a previous rejection to medical school.

In the present situation it would appear that no explanation would be acceptable to the Siegel family. They have gone so far as to lodge complaints against Rabbi Philip Lipis of the Highland Park Conservative Congregation and others in their feeling that their son has been blacklisted.

More information can be given to you over the telephone or perhaps next week if you are in the city for the board meeting.

However, I am sorry to say that this is a truthful description of my present situation. Between the Emergency Council and Israel Bonds I was unemployed for 13 months. Now I am again without a job since June 15th, when my department at Bonds was scuttled. For months I was keeping an upper stiff lip, while Eban has warmly encouraged me in my plans for a large-scale Middle East public relations program. Then, Irving took over the ZOA administration, and he in turn was very hopeful that my plans would be integrated in the program of the revitalized and reorganized Zionist Council. I do not have to tell you that thus far nothing came of it and that there is no certainty whatsoever that anything tangible would materialize in the near future. In the meantime. I reached the end of my rope - both financially and morally. Again, please forgive my writing to you in this vein, but I consider myself your friend and hope that I may count on your friendly feelings towards me. I was unsuccessful in numerous efforts to land a job in different spheres. The plain truth is that it is not easy, indeed almost impossible, to break into a new field after having spent all of one's thoughts and energies for 30 years in promoting Zionism. May I in this situation turn to a friend with an urgent request for help? The Republican Administration might be able to make good use of my services in any of several capacities. There is no need for me to enlarge on my background and qualifications, but I wish to point to my first-hand knowledge of many lands and peoples and to the fact that I know several languages, including Russian which is my mother-tongue. For two years 1937-1939 - I was the London Correspondent of two Russian

Dear Dr. Silver:

Many thanks for your letter of December 4th. Yes, I saw Dr. Clinchy. He was very cordial - because of your letter to him - but he had nothing to offer me. Nor did I have any bright ideas with regard to the National Conference of Christians and Jews. It is definitely not my cup of tea.

For a few days, following your conferences with Mr. Goodman and Irving Miller, Harold and I were optimistic with regard to the program of the Middle East Commission and the part I was going to play in it. However, judging by what Herold told me yesterday, all I can expect is a temporary assignment. Strictly entre nous, it amears that the ZOA leadership is nainly interested in a few stunts which would convey the impression of political-public relations activities, rather than in undertaking a systematic program in this field.

Similarly, what I hear of the negotiations for the reorganization and enlargement of the Zionist Council does not sound promising at all.

Such is the sad state of affairs at this moment, and I cannot tell you how much I appreciate your interest. In recent months, I have had ample opportunity to learn the truth of the popular saying: "A friend in need is a friend indeed." There (pas not many true friends around.

In view of the fact that the ZOA and the Council are poor prospects for me, I see few other organizations in the Zionist-Israeli orbit where I could find something suitable: the UJA, or possibly a mission overseas on behalf of the Zionist funds. I therefore expect more of possibilities in the field mentioned in my previous letter - the new Republican Administration. I shall be exteremely grateful for anything you may do in whatever direction you consider feasible.

We have, therefore, a profound desire to establish a memorial in the remembrance of this friend, and we feel certain that your group will want to participate in this effort. At one time, he served his country as a Lieutenant in the Engineer Corps. Prior to his entrance to the School of Social Administration, he was a teacher in the Cleveland Public School System. Victor's untimely death occurred in an automobile accident while he was doing his field work with the United Appeal Campaign of Columbus, part of his work leading to the degree of Master of Arts in Social Administration. He is survived by his wife, Thelma Zisenwine Bloomfield, of Columbus, an infant daughter, Victoria, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Sol Bloomfield of Cleveland, a brother, James Arthur Bloomfield of Philadelphia, and a sister, Hannah R. Bloomfield, of Cleveland, Ohio.
