

She was indeed a mother in Israel — a queen among women. No mendicant was ever turned away empty handed from her door. She bore ten children and without the obstetrical aid now available. I was the youngest, all born in Cleveland; she also brought up two others of close relatives who were unable to care for them.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

You may often have glanced at a family of bereaved ones before you at a funeral service at which you were delivering a eulogy. The task is an unhappy one to say the least, and filled with emotional strain. The family before you is steeled to bear up at a time in which they know that the person they so loved will be discussed publicly.

This then, is an expression from one such family, as it sat before you, and we wish to say that your tribute to our father, Nathan Loeser, brought to our senses a somewhat unexpected reaction. Instead of a massive, overwhelming feeling of grief and loss, your voice had the effect of producing a feeling of comfort, finality of a good life led, knowledge of the departed one's wisdom, kindly traits and contributions to community life.

This feeling came to us, as your eulogy went on as a form of keen pride that we have been the family of such a man. We cannot but try to tell you how we felt, and hope that our feelings will convey to you the effectiveness of your words. They had beauty, dignity; they had charity, love, fullness and meaning. They had depth and sensitivity. They had the essence, therefore, of the life of our father.

Knowing of your long and close association with our father and our beloved mother as well, we found added comfort in your presence at this sad ceremony.

Thank you, Rabbi Silver, for helping so much to make the funeral services "one grand chord" of tribute.

יתר תנאי החכירה:

1. אין החוכר רשאי להעביר את זכות החכירה, כולה או מקצתה לאחר, או להרשות למישהו לעלות על הקרקע ולהפוש בה חזקה.
2. אין החוכר רשאי לבנות בנינים או לנסוע עצים או להשקיע בקרקע סיובים או להכינה לעונה שניה או לזבלה אחרי קציר העונה, ואם עשה זאת הרי תיחשב כל השקעה כזאת כתוספת לדמי החכירה וכל מה שהושקע בקרקע הממכרת יחשב כרכושו של המחכיר שפסור יהיה מלהחזיר לחוכר את השקעותיו או חלק מהן עם גמר תקופת חוזה החכירה הנוכחי.
3. אין רשות לחוכר להשתמש בשטחים הבלתי מעובדים שחוזה החכירה הנוכחי אינו חל עליהם והנמצאים בין חלקות הקרקע המעובדות, לצרכי מחצבות, הפקת חימום, מטרפות סיד או נצול אחר מאיזה מין שהוא שאינו נזכר בזכות השמוש בקרקע הנמכרת בחוזה זה.
4. החוכר מתחייב לעבד את החלקות הממכרות עבור חקלאי יעיל ולהוציא על חשבונו את כל הוצאות החריש, זריעה וקציר, ויתר העבודות החקלאיות, להוציא לפועל עבודות אלה בימות השבוע, ולשבות בשבת ובמועדי ישראל מכל עבודה ומלאכה. כן מתחייב החוכר לשמור ולהחזיק בסצב טוב את כל הגדרות, מדרגות, צנוורות, תעלות, בסדר ובסצב טוב.
5. המחכיר או בא כחו רשאים בכל עת שימצאו לנחוץ לבקר את החלקות הממכרות, לשלוח מודרים ופועלים לבצוע עבודותיו וכן לעבור בחלקות

דף 2 של כתב-חוזה לחכירת קרקע.

המעובדות הגובלות עם השטחים הבלתי מעובדים, בכל זמן שימצא לנחוץ לצרכיו.

6. החוכר מסכים לפנות את החלקות המכרות ולהחזירן למחכיר תוך תקופת החכירה. בכל זמן שיקבל הודעה של שבוע ימים מאת המחכיר, כתום מועד ההודעה רטאי יהיה המחכיר לתפוש בחלקות המכרות ולהשתמש בהן לצרכיו וכן להשחית את הזריעה או היבול אם יהיה צורך בכך. במקרה כזה יוחזרו לחוכר דמי החכירה וכל ההוצאות שהושקעו על ידו בהתאם להערכה שתאושר ע"י מחלקת ההתישבות של הסוכנות היהודית. זכותו של המחכיר להחזיר לעצמו את החזקה בקרקעות אינה מותנית בתשלום הפצויים לפני התפישה.

7. כתום תקופת החכירה חייב החוכר לפנות את החלקות שבחזקתו כשהן פנויות מכל מה שיכול להפריע את השמוש בהן מבלי שתהיה לו כל זכות לסעון טענות כרב או סיוב, אריסות או איזה טענה שהיא, והרשות בידי המחכיר לעלות על הקרקע כתום תקופת החכירה בלי כל צורך בהודעה מוקדמת.

8. אם יפר החוכר אחד מתנאי חוזה זה חייב יהיה לשלם למחכיר את כל הנזקים שנגרמו לו ע"י הפרת החוזה, אך אם יפר את התנאים המפורטים בסעיפים 6 ו-7 או יתנגד באיזו צורה שהיא להחזרת החזקה למחכיר במקרים המפורטים בסעיפים אלה, חייב יהיה לשלם למחכיר סך - 5 ל"י ליום בעד כל דונם קרקע שהמחכיר לא יוכל לקבלו בהתאם לזכויותיו בסעיפים 6 ו-7 הנ"ל, וזה בתור פצוי קבוע מראש, בלי צורך בהתראה, כי עצם העברה על תנאי הסעיפים הנ"ל או על איזה סעיף מסעיפי החוזה תיחשב כהתראה.



GRADE III - (Age 8)

- I. Jewish Personalities (with special emphasis on contributions of Jewish personalities throughout the ages to their "neighbors" - interfaith; music; arts; science; philanthropy). (Note: This would deal with stories of the Prophets; Psalmists; Jesus; Judah Halevy; Chasdai ibn Shaprut; Major Mordecai Noah; Einstein; Mendelsohn; Gershwin; Joseph Israels; Weizman; Rosenwald; etc., as examples).

Objective: To implement the desire of the Religious School Curriculum Committee to show relationship of Jew to his larger environment - in interfaith, intercultural aspects - in manner within scope of this age group. To show that Jewish life has always been part of a larger social structure - in simple terms, of course. To present the best in Jewish teaching that emphasizes the ideals of good will to all peoples.

Pupils' Activities: Scrapbooks; Biographical sketches, illuminated covers and illustrations. (Even on pattern of "comic books"). Dramatization of stories. Maps. Cut-outs. Collection of news stories dealing with interfaith activities, contributions, etc., not only of Jew to non-Jew but vice-versa. Programs on music by Jewish composers. Album of paintings, etc. by Jewish artists, builders, sculptors, etc.






