



My dear Abba:

I am enclosing copy of a letter relative to the Long Island Zionist Region's pleage of \$1,000.00 to Kfar Silver on the occasion of my Sixtieth Birthday. Subsequently, the Long Island Region received an acknowledgment from Dr. Sidney Marks that the \$1,000.00 has been so earmarked.

In light of past experiences, that is where it will end. I do not believe the \$1,000.00 will be transmitted for the earmarked purpose nor will an inscription ever be in K'far Silver. Dr. Harris J. Levire spoke to me about the way the Administration mishandled the whole K'far Silver project, and how enraged you are about the entire shameful procedure. It is simply outrageous!

Your address at the Z.O.A. convention was one of the greatest and inspiring you have delivered. And you have delivered so many great addresses. I was deeply moved by your reference to the days of our youth 50 years ago. Maybe we purselves, as actors in the drama, never sensed its full historic importance. After all, the founding of the Herzl Club by you, and your brother Maxwell, under the spiritual guidance and leadership of your father, of sainted memory, really marks the founding of the Zionist Youth movement in America.

Morning Journal", the literary magazine of "The American Zionist", "Dos Yiddishe Folk", Abe Feldman's Hartford "Jewish Ledger", the "Jewish Ledger" of Newark, and many other Anglo-Jewish weeklies, would be more than anxious to dedicate one of their issues to the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the Zionist Youth movement in America.

Abe Feldman wrote me twice about celebrating sometimes in the fall this important milestone in American Jewish life. Emanuel Neumann, on several occasions, told me that we should do something about celebrating this event.

I have met a number of Herzl boys, delegates at the last Z.O.A. convention, who heard your address and your reference to the Herzl Club fifty years ago, and all urged me to initiate some plans about celebrating that important event. They all felt that, perhaps for the last time, we should meet in reunion. They all felt that a great event like the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the Zionist Youth movement should not pass unnoticed.

Dear Rabbi Silver,

On may I3, I95I, I wrote to your brother Dr. maxwell Silver and asked him to let me have a sum of IL. 200 for the Hevra Kadisha in settlement of their bill in connection with the death of your parents.

On June 5, 1951, you wrote me with reference to my above letter, stating that on June 27, 1949 you sent an additional cheque Of \$1000 for the late Hr. Eliash to reimburse him for all expenses incurred in connection with settling of the Estate of your late father.

on July 19, 1949, I acknowledged the receipt of the cheque, but in the same letter I informed you that I have cancelled the cheque, which is since then kept cancelled with Messes Alexander Eliash & Co., in view of the fact that nothing was then due to the late Mr. Eliash. The bill of the Hevra Kadisha was forwarded to me after my letter of July 19, 1949.

The No. of the cheque is 1066 drawn on the Cleveland Trust Co., and you will find that your bank did not, of course, debit you with amount of the said chaue.

As the Hevra Kadisha has approached me again asking the payment of the sum of IL.200, I would appreciate the sending of this sum to me for them.

Mr. Moses Kahaty, Advocate of Mitzpa House, Jerusalem, informed me under date of August 16 that the sum of IL.200 is due the Hevra Kadisha in settlement of the bill in connection with the burials of my parents Moses and Dirah Silver. I would appreciate if you would pay this amount to the Hevra Kadisha through Mr. Moses Kehaty, and I have notified the latter that I have authorized you to do so. My dear Maxwell:

I'm sorry to have delayed writing to you, but I have but recently returned to me desk, and my correspondence has been unfortunately delayed. There are two matters which I should take up with you:

One has to do with a temporary headstone for Father's grave in Jerusalem. Rose told me of the absence of any adequate marker on the grave because the grave was to be a temporary one. However, it looks now as though considerable time will elapse before the Mount Olive Cemetery will be available for internment. Hose informed me that marold's new father—in—law is prepared to a ttend to the matter. I wish that you would get in touch with Rose and have her communicate with Harold so that the matter can be attended to without further delay. I believe that the cost was mentioned, and I shall be pleased to pay for the headstone. All that the stone need carry is the name of Dad and the date of his birth which is the 13th of Adar

The second matter has to do with the balance of your account in Jerusalem. I received a copy of the letter which notified me that your account and your securities have been transferred to me. From your earlier correspondence I was under the impression that the amount of IL. 6,000 was transferred. It now turns out to be over IL. 8,000. This is really more than I had intended to take over. Again, the rate of exchange which you mentioned in your letter of July 22, namely, one dollar to the pound, is not at all the rate at which monies which I have been sending to Jerusalem has been exchanged. The Temple recently sent a contribution of \$400.00 to the Kfar Silver and received IL. 130. A bond which I recently send to Israel for the same project received an exchange of IL. 160. Please look into the matter further. At the rate of IL. 130 I shall tray to find such funds destined for Israel which will warrant my taking over the full account.

I have today sent IL. 200 to Mr. Moses Kehaty in payment of the claim of the Hevra Kadisha in Jerusalem.

We are all well. Virginia and I send you our best wishes,





ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE COURTHOUSE

By MICHAEL A. MUSMANNO

Returning home in September, 1948, after six years in the Navy, Captain Michael A. Musmanno was more than astonished to find that a nest of conspirators planning the overthrow of the United States Government was operating directly across the street from the Courthouse. But what astonished him even more was that officialdom apparently was coing nothing to break up this advance post of the Red Army. This book is the story of what Musmanno did. He personally led a raid on the Communist headquarters, he brought about the arrest of Steve Nelson, (field general of the Communist forces in America and atom bomb spy), and took the witness stand, testifying for 31 days. Musmanno's knowledge of the Communist conspiracy, its ideology and plans for world conquest continually awed and at times electrified the courtroom. Nelson and his two major lieutenants were all convicted.

Following World War II, General Mark W. Clark had appointed Musmanno as president of the United States-Soviet Board of Forcible Repatriation in Austria. In this capacity Musmanno passed on the demands of the Soviet Union for the forcible return of Russian refugees. Musmanno's narrative of his daily tugs-of-war with Russian officers to save innocent, helpless, displaced persons from Sovie: wrath which meant the firing squad, Siberia or slave labor camps, is as exciting as a murder trial.

While military governor in Southern Italy, Musmanno defied Andrei Vishinsky, Soviet foreign minister, who was already attempting during the war to sabotage Italy.

The author's passionate hatred of Communism and all its works began a quartercentury ago when, as a young lawyer, he

fought at the side of the great labor leader, Philip Murray, against agents sent into the Western Permsylvania coal fields by Stalin to destroy the United Mine Workers of America and set up a Kremlin-directed union. As the youthful Abraham Lincoln had resolved not to rest until slavery was smashed in America, so Musmanno in 1928 yowed that Communism had to be driven from American soil. A generation later, in 1951, he succeeded in having the Pennsylvania Legislature outlaw the Communist Party from that State.

Musmanno's battles against Communism overseas, in the coal fields, in the courts and the legislature are all thrillingly related. With the narrative of his exciting personal experiences, the author interweaves also the absorbing story of congressional committees investigating Communism, the Red spies in the Nation's capital, and the all-out offensive on the part of international Communism to destroy the Church and universal faith in religion.

Congressman Martin Dies, famous anti-Red crusader, and first chairman of the House Un-American Activities Committee, has referred to Musuranno as one of the most aggressive antagonists of Communism in the United States as well as one of the "outstanding authorities" on the subject.



Dr. WESLEY R. FISHEL is Associate Professor of Political Science and Assistant Director of the Governmental Research Bureau at Michigan State College.

A native of Cleveland, O., Dr. Fishel attended Cleveland and Cleveland Heights public schools, graduating in 1937 from Heights High School. His undergraduate college training was taken at the School of Foreign Service of Georgetown university and at Northwestern University. He received his B.S. in International Relations from Northwestern in 1941.

Dr. Fishel is a Far Eastern specialist. He did graduate work in Japanese studies at the Harvard University Yenching Institute and the University of Mchigan, and received his Ph.D. in International Relations from the University of Chicago in 1948.

Before coming to Michigan State in 1951, he taught at the Military Intelligence Service Language School, the School of Military Government, and the University of California at Los Angeles.

During World War II, Dr. Fishel served in the Pacific theatre as a Japanese-speaking Army intelligence officer. He saw combat duty as commanding officer of an intelligence unit assigned to naval and marine units at Guam and Iwo Jima, and received a letter of commendation from Gen. Graves B. Erskine for his work at Iwo, where he and his men captured over 100 Japanese prisoners.

At the start of the Korean War, he was called from a program of teaching and research in Japan and Korea to serve as an Asian expert in the Military Intelligence Division of Gen. MacArthur's headquarters.

In 1952 he left his teaching duties to serve as a Consultant on Far Eastern politics to the U. S. Government in Washington.

1953 found him on his fourth visit to the Far East (his first was as representative from Northwestern University to the America-Japan Student Conference, held in Tokyo in 1940). This time he headed a special mission for the Operations Research Office (Department of the Army) in Japan and Korea. His duties took him into the POW camps on Koje-do, into the front lines with both American and Korean tropps, and to the Truce Negotiations at Panmunjom. He had two interviews with Syngman Rhee, sat in on a special meeting of President Rhee's war cabinet, and talked with most of South Korea's top military and civilian leaders.

In mid-July of this year he flew to Paris and Geneva at the request of Prime Minister Ngo Dinh Diem of Vietnam, a personal friend, to serve as expert consultant to the Vietnamese Delegation to the Geneva Conference.

Dr. Fishel is the author of The End of Extraterritoriality in China (a volume which describes and analyzes the decline of foreign special privileges in China, Communist Atrocity Propaganda in the Korean War, 1950-1952 (report of an intensive propaganda analysis), and of numerous articles and reviews. From 1949 to 1951 he served as Far Eastern and East European Editor of YEAR, the pictorial News annual.

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

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
