


For the first time, English readers have access to the famous 17th century Hebrew chronicle, “Yeven Metzulah” by Rabbi Nathan Hanover, who recorded the horrible account of the Chmielnicki massacres which swept over Russia and the Ukraine in 1648-9, a period considered at the time one of the darkest chapters in the life of Russian Jewry.

This first English translation of the “black book,” “Yeven Metzulah” is the result of painstaking efforts by Rabbi Abraham J. Mesch who undertook this work in commemoration of the 300th anniversary of the Chmielnicki massacres.

Rabbi Mesch has added great significance to this tragic historical chapter by including in *Abyss of Despair* a lengthy historical introduction, a biographical sketch of Rabbi Hanover, as

well as explanatory notes and facsimile portraits and a map. Dr. Solomon Grayzel, editor of the Jewish Publication Society of America, has written a Preface to the book from which the following is quoted:

"One must therefore admire the devotion of Rabbi Abraham J. Mesch and be grateful to him for his efforts in presenting us with this excellent translation of the "Yeven Metzulah." The literalness of his translation reproduces the tone and flavor of the original, its horror, its pathos, its piety. His introduction gives the essential facts needed for an understanding of the chronicle and his notes serve to remove obscurities. Otherwise he lets the author speak for himself. Rabbi Mesch has done well, and has unquestionably rendered a service to those who seek to understand the history of the Jewish people.

"One dares hope that, even as Chmielnitzki's hordes tried but failed to uproot Jewish life, so Hitler's even more bestial gangs will be proved to have left the roots of Jewish life untouched."





Rabbi Abraham J. Mesch, the translator of *Abyss of Despair*, has been the spiritual leader of Temple Beth-El, Birmingham, Ala., one of the largest congregations in the South, for the past 15 years. He received his rabbinical training at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Seminary in New York and the Hebrew Theological

College in Chicago, pursuing his secular education at the College of the City of New York, Lewis Institute of Chicago, and the University of Denver. He was ordained in 1934 in Jerusalem by the late Chief Rabbi Abraham Isaac Hacoen Kook after a period of study at Yeshivat Merkaz Harav.

Rabbi Mesch has written extensively on various Jewish subjects. He is now editing and translating sections of the "Sefer Hassidim" by Rabbi Judah Hechacid. His confirmation program, "*The Rebirth of Israel*" was recently published. He is also devoting some time to the revision of a manuscript he prepared some years ago on *Biographical Sketches of Pseudo-Messiahs*.
