

son Emanuel.

As I gather from your letter of November 5,
1957, you had expected to hear from them in reply to your
letter in which you enclosed the inscription to appear on
the plaque, and then to communicate with me. Evidently they
did not respond.

The month of April, when you plan to visit
Israel, is rapidly approaching. From my personal experiences
in the past with Israeli institutions such as Keren Kayemet
and Israeli Kibbutzim, I am very much afraid that when you
will come to dedicate the plaque, you may find ~~the name~~,
~~And how Anna and I are anxious to have our dear son's name~~
perpetuated in Israel, in Kfar Silver!

If the proposed inscription
you mailed ~~them~~ was somehow misplaced, I am enclosing here
two duplicate copies. As I wrote you before, Emanuel's name,
mentioned in Mr. Daniel's letter to you of July 10, 1957,
was incorrect. I do hope that Kfar Silver will prove to be
the exception, and everything will be properly arranged and
prepared when you arrive there.

I am enclosing an editorial in last week's
National Jewish Post. Dr. Emanuel Cohen of Redwood City,
California, as chairman of the Welfare Fund in his community,
was one of the rare exceptions among physicians.

I have heard through the grapevine that you are honoring the Hillel Foundation of Cornell University with your presence on Sunday, January 12th, at 6:30 P.M.



I am now a senior at Princeton University and writing my thesis on the "Role of Jewish Community Relations Organizations in the United States during the Suez-Siani Crisis." Since this paper is being prepared for the Politics Department, my primary concern will necessarily be in that area.





I hope my previous letter, which surprisingly enough did not come into your hands in spite of the fact that I had sent it airmail-special delivery, has reached you by now.

You cannot imagine how happy I am that you have graciously consented to address our dinner in Toledo where preparations are in full swing. As promised, I shall keep you informed about the developments.

In the meantime, another interesting "problem" has come up and I would highly appreciate your kind advice on the following matter.

Professor Israel Reichert from the Hebrew University's School of Agriculture, is at present here in New York. I understand he is a personal friend of yours and most certainly he is one of your most fervent admirers. Professor Reichert has found and classified an edible mushroom which grows, apparently, only in the Middle East. He has found it in the Emek and in Hefzi Ba.

It is the intention of Professor Reichert to honor you in the most impressive way a scientist can honor an outstanding personality: by giving this newly found mushroom your name, calling it BOLETUS SILVERIANA.

It is, of course, his ambition to do this in some way which would call this honor to the attention of the Jewish community. I need not tell you that I am deeply moved by the honor which you have bestowed upon me today. I have, in the past, received, in many instances quite undeservedly, marks of recognition, but this is a unique experience for me and deeply appreciated.

I want to thank the eminent scientist, Professor Israel Reichart especially for having selected me to receive the honor ~~to have~~ ^a the new mushroom which he found and classified, named after me. This is the highest honor which ~~the~~ ^a scientist can bestow upon any one. I have, for years, enjoyed the privilege of his friendship, and that of Mrs. Reichart, and this, his latest expression of friendship, I shall deeply cherish.

To have one's name associated with a plant in Israel is a rare distinction indeed. Our people was always fond of associating precious things and high human values and ideals with growing things and with natural phenomena. Our Torah is likened to a tree of life. The good man is like a tree planted by streams of water. The life of man and of nations are likened to grass and flowers which flourish and pass away, while the word of God endures forever. My dear Rabbi Silver,

My name is under consideration by President Dwight D. Eisenhower for membership on the Civil Rights Commission. Any weight you could activate towards a favorable decision would be appreciated.

We had met as "delegates passing in the halls" at ZOA conventions in Pittsburgh and New York City.

My parents were Zionists in their philosophy and some of it remained with me. In 1941 I was President of the Hanita Camp of Bnai Zion and in 1948 I was vice president of the Stamford, Conn. section of ZOA. During those hectic years, I beat a regular path to Washington to beard our Senators and Congressmen about partition.

As a director of my Synagogue, I was active in the direction of our Hebrew School and helped organize the drives for UJA and Food for Israel.

Elected to the School Board at Stamford Connecticut, The four years of membership merited distinction and decisions of integrity for all people.

Another contribution to improve Jewish-Christian relations was as Cubmaster of a new Boy Scout Group at an Episcopal Church. There were 27 Catholic, 27 Protestant and one Jewish boy, my own. He was the first boy, to date, to win a Ner Tamid award from our Synagogue.

These items are enumerated only to indicate a breadth of interest and participation in community affairs.

What contributions can I make to the Civil Rights Commission? There are many.

As a Construction Superintendent and twelve years in the building industry coupled with fifteen years as an Industrial Engineer with firms of national repute have enabled me to work with people of many creeds and colors. What I've learned is not theory, but the knowledge of day by day working with them.

After graduation from Brooklyn Law School, I took evening courses for five years in electrical and industrial engineering. In my own profession, I've risen to become Chief Manufacturing Engineer, at Raytheon Mfg. Co. (we make guided missiles.)

I would bring to the Commission the mature judgement of an engineer trained in Law and tempered by the understanding of our own Talmud.

All these I offer freely. I need your help.







Memorial Tribute Is Paid to Judge Blythin

"But his memorial remains riveted into the language, the sharp, clear prism of his mind."

Dox Passoa wrote that about Veblen, controversial economic theorist, and possibly it is wrong to mention Veblen here the day after Common Pleas Judge Edward Blythin was buried.

But they all said that about Judge Blythin yesterday: the judges of the county and the lawyers and the politicians who sat in Parma South Presbyterian Church, 6155 Pearl Road, Parma Heights, before the Lake View Cemetery burial. In one way, or another, they all said it.

Like Veblen, Judge Blythin suffered the chronic inability to say "yes" to compromise. It was this inability to accept outside temptation that his colleagues in law and friends had come to honor, they said, as

much as the man who was buried.

The cleric in the pulpit said it, though not in those words. He used Judge Blythin's own words in recalling the straight course the slim, ascetic-faced Welshman had riven through a lifetime of work, law and honorable living.

"There is no substitute for moral and intellectual integrity," said the Rev. Harry V. Parrot, pastor of Garfield Trinity Baptist Church and an intimate friend of the one-time Cleve and mayor.

These words were Judge Blythin's, he said, a part of the 73-year-old jurist's personal creed.

The politicians said it loudly. The friends of the one-time penniless immigrant said it without speaking a word. The touch of the hand, brushing, hesitatingly, against the coffin,

and true sorrow in the eyes, said it for them.

As funerals go, this was a splendid one, ostensibly simple, with two ministers intoning mournful oration.

Solemn black cloth and the volatile white hands of lawyers still-held respectfully announced the burial of an important man.

To an outsider, looking beyond the grave faces of uniform, prescribed grief, into the sloped shoulders, the deep-lined tightness of lips and the pathetic gesture of farewell that hands made touching, as if of their own accord, the casket on the flowered trestle, it was a funeral of a man who never considered himself important but was esteemed by others.

Conducting the services beside the Rev. Mr. Parrot was the Rev. Howard B. Withers, minister of the Parma Heights church.

Representing the Cleveland Bar Association were Chief Justice Samuel L. Silbert of Common Pleas Court and judges of that court.

Mayor Anthony J. Celebrezze represented Cleveland in saying goodbye to one of the city's elder statesmen.

Judge Blythin's court, as were all other courts, was closed yesterday in tribute.

City Council last night unanimously passed a resolution of condolence "acknowledging gratefully the debt of this city" to the life and service of Judge Blythin.

He "brought to all the problems of a cosmopolitan city in this land of opportunity a bold and forthright approach, a vigorous and enlightened dedication and a capacity to give unselfishly of himself to their solution."
