






This seal is displayed by television stations that subscribe to the Television Code. At one time or another, you may have seen it on your television screen. You may have wondered what it means and what it is supposed to accomplish. This booklet explains the purpose of the Television Code, how the Code functions, and what it means to you, the viewer.

Back in the fall of 1951, a special committee of the National Association of Broadcasters drafted the first Television Code. The Code went into effect in March, 1952—during the first year of full coast-to-coast television.



At that time 108 stations were on the air, and 89 of these stations and all networks subscribed to the Television Code.

Today, with 532 commercial stations broadcasting, the Code membership numbers 389 stations, all three networks, and 22 Code Film Affiliates.

Purpose of the Television Code

The Code's purpose is to establish guidelines which Code subscribers can use to determine what is and what is not acceptable for broadcast. In the words of the Code preamble:

In the voluntary and cooperative adherence to these regulations, broadcasters seek to maintain a level of television programming which gives full consideration to the educational, informational, cultural, economic, moral, and entertainment needs of the American public.

The Code contains guidelines for 14 distinct areas: eight of these areas deal with programming and production;

Advancement of Education and Culture

Responsibility Toward Children

Community Responsibility

General Program Standards

Treatment of News and Public Events

Controversial Public Issues

Political Telecasts

Religious Programs

Six of these guidelines deal with advertising:

General Advertising Standards

Presentation of Advertising

Advertising of Medical Products


Contests

Premiums and Offers

Time Standards for Advertising

How the Code Works

A comprehensive organizational setup has been cooperatively established by broadcasters to make the Television Code a living part of what you see on your television screen.



The Code Review Board acts as the appeals court of television broadcast practices. It also serves as the legislative branch to recommend changes in the provisions of the Code, subject to the approval of the National Association of Broadcasters' Television Board of Directors. This is a group of operating television broadcasters appointed by the President of the NAB and approved by the members of the Television Board of Directors.

The office of the Code Authority Director is filled by a former broadcast executive of more than 20 years' experience in network and station broadcasting.

Reporting to him are the heads of the Code Authority in three cities: Washington, New York, and Los Angeles.

In simplest terms: Broadcast executives cor-

respond to a board of directors; the Code Authority is the operating mechanism.

The Code Authority works in a number of ways:

1. It *consults* with stations and networks on questions involving interpretations of Code regulation.
2. It *advises* those concerned with creating material for television by discussing questions of acceptability of material and treatment with film producers, advertisers, advertising agencies.
3. It *maintains liaison* with responsible organizations and institutions, and the public at large to encourage comment from viewers.
4. It *monitors* Code subscribers' broadcast performance to guard against violations.


But one more fact before examining further how the Code works.

Every station and every network has people who are charged with the responsibility of deciding what is or is not acceptable to be broadcast over their station or network.

This activity is variously called "program practices and standards" or "continuity acceptance." The number of people engaged in this work ranges from as few as one or two at some stations to as many as 32 at one network—involved in an annual cost of some \$400,000.

Some Specific Provisions

A number of provisions of the Code are very clear-cut and require no interpretation.



For example: "The advertising of hard liquor

should not be accepted."

This is a prohibition that represents a multi-million dollar advertising rejection. And broadcasting is the *only* mass medium which observes this prohibition.

Similarly clear and explicit are the regulations that prohibit profanity, obscenity, and smut, and the one that says, "Contests may not constitute a lottery."

Equally specific are the regulations defining the amount of time that may be devoted to advertising.

This is limited to 13 per cent in prime evening time and rarely exceeds 20 per cent in other times and types of programs. By contrast, the amount of space devoted to advertising in newspapers averages 59 per cent, as reported in the magazine *Editor and Publisher*.

In provisions such as these, the Code's requirements are specific and even quantitative. Like standards that measure physical characteristics—either you can or you can't. It is either this much—which is permitted, or that much—which is not permitted.

Such provisions fall into the relatively narrow black-and-white areas of standards of taste as reflected in the television code. Many more provisions, by far, come within the larger gray area—allowing for individual interpretation, varying from community to community and from time to time.

In establishing guidelines for broadcast acceptability, two factors are considered: Content is one; treatment or manner of presentation is the other.

Is the *subject matter* suitable for presentation on television? And, if it is, is the *treatment* of the subject matter consonant with good taste considering the time of day and audience most likely to view it?

While questions of taste and morality are frustrating problems (and the answer in any single case is rarely satisfactory to everyone),

it is essential that the widest possible latitude for judgment be permitted.

As one church group put it:

"Morality must be distinguished from mathematics in its scientific method. Morality is a matter of approximation."

"Moralists are in unanimous agreement on the principles of morality, but they often disagree on the application of the principles to specific cases. . . . Taste is inevitably involved in the matter of judgment."

Some Actions under the Code

In its relatively brief history the Code Review Board has taken some very specific actions concerning some of the broad provisions of the Code itself.

For example, a few years ago a number of stations subscribing to the Code were carrying commercials for a medical preparation used in the treatment of hemorrhoids. The commercials were in good taste and were not shown during hours when they might have been offensive.

Yet because of the nature of the product and the special need that broadcasters recognize for extra care in advertising to a mixed group, it was decided that commercials for such products, along with personal products for feminine hygiene, should no longer be accepted by Code stations.

This decision was made without prejudice either to the product itself or to the advertising treatment of the product. It was a gray area decision that broadcasters invoked in their self-regulation efforts.

The Code Board has also eliminated two once-familiar advertising practices:

There was the "pitchman" technique, which you may recall from television's earliest days. It consisted of a continuous demonstration or sales presentation of perhaps 15 minutes in length. Such program-length commercials were ruled unacceptable by the Board in 1956.

And since the beginning of 1959, the Code has required that dramatized advertising involving statements by physicians, dentists, or nurses must be presented by accredited members of such professions. Thus, actors in laboratory coats, who only *seem* to be doctors, may no longer deliver commercial announcements.

But, in addition to the Code Authority, each station and network considers what it produces and broadcasts in the light of Code regulations.

In the area of programming, for example, there is the Code provision that says, "The detailed presentation of brutality or physical agony by sight or by sound are not permissible."

In the filming of one program in a popular western series, a scene turned up in which a spear was shown striking the victim and protruding from his back as he fell to the ground. After screening the preliminary print, the network decided that this scene was in violation both of the Code and of its own program practices.

The scene was altered. In its final form, the spear was seen being thrown, but the falling body was photographed only from the shoulders up.

Another example of enforcement of Code regulations by broadcasters involved a movie originally produced for theater showing. It contained a disrobing sequence that was considered to be in violation of the Code specification, "The costuming of all performers shall be within the bounds of propriety and shall avoid such exposure . . . as would embarrass or offend home viewers."

The scene was eliminated by the station before the film was broadcast.

Advertising Claims

The terminal responsibility for all advertising—whether in newspapers, radio, magazines, billboards, handbills, or television—goes back to

the advertiser. This is the law. The advertiser has access to the facts about his product; he knows what it will and will not do.

But broadcasters, under the Code, have assumed a substantial responsibility in their adherence to a Code regulation urging "that great care be exercised by the broadcaster to prevent the presentation of false, misleading or deceptive advertising."

Verification of some claims depends on the user's personal appraisal—such as "taste better" or "you'll feel proud to own."

Provided they are not misleading or in bad taste or disparage a competitor's product, such commercials are accepted.

Where claims are not self-evident on their face, the advertising agency is asked for supporting proof.



Most of the time the claims are supported, and you see the commercial. Quite frequently—through consultations with and suggestions made by the Code Authority or the broadcaster—the advertising agency changes language or action to eliminate questions of believability or accuracy.

In addition, there are other organizations that work to assure standards of accuracy in advertising: Better Business Bureaus, Federal Trade Commission, Food and Drug Administration, American Association of Advertising Agencies. The Code Authority and Code subscribers throughout the country supplement

their own efforts by maintaining continuing liaison with such groups.

In these and other ways, broadcasters have, over the years, taken steps to increase the acceptability of commercials to viewers without reducing the effectiveness of the advertising.

Advertisers, through their advertising agencies, have joined in this effort.


There has been an increase in the use of imaginative treatment in television commercials. There has also been a parallel decrease in the reliance on repetition or stepped-up sound to make an advertising point.

Encouragement of Thoughtful Drama

The Code is not to be construed as a limiting instrument—shutting off imaginative and perceptive writing that would illuminate the meaning of life for adult viewers. On the contrary, Code rulings and interpretations attempt to encourage such efforts.

Many of Shakespeare's plays and classic Greek dramas contain language and are based on themes that could be considered offensive by many people today.

For example, *Volpone*, a play by the Elizabethan dramatist Ben Jonson, was described by one critic as "adroit dirt." The adjoining columnist called it "a treasure of a play."



The problem grows more complex when the drama is the product of contemporary writers, setting familiar scenes in plays with a con-

troversial flavor.

Consider the Code regulations that require avoidance of profanity, elimination of scenes implying the prevalence of drunkenness, avoidance of scenes set in places associated with sexual sin.

Under a strict interpretation of these provisions, Eugene O'Neill's *The Iceman Cometh* could never have been shown on television. The Code Board ruling on this was made only after extensive consideration. The safest decision would have been "no."

However, the final decision—reflecting the conflict—said:

The Code Board believes that the play as presented will find widely differing audience responses. Some viewers will find the play to be a rich and exciting performance; others may regard it, because of its language and theme, sordid and offensive . . .

The Code Review Board believes that this particular presentation is acceptable for telecast, but only under special circumstances. "Special circumstances" covered, most specifically, time of broadcast, with late evening showings recommended.

An even more difficult decision faced broadcasters in *The Power and the Glory*—the Graham Greene story of the hunting down of a dissolute priest by an anticlerical government during the Mexican Revolution of the 1930's.

The decision as to its acceptability was made by the network's programming practices department, which viewed the question in the light of the Code and its own policy concerning the treatment of religious subjects and the clergy. A literal interpretation of the Code policy would seem to make this play unacceptable.

Yet, so sensitively drawn was the portrait of the priest, with all his weaknesses, and so profound the message—the Grace of God may be found in the least likely places—that the program was produced and broadcast. Praise

for it was virtually universal—not only among general newspapers throughout the country, but in the Roman Catholic press as well.

In the hands of less talented writers than Shakespeare, or Ben Jonson, O'Neill or Graham Greene, and without the most careful attention to production values, dramas featuring drunkenness, procurers, prostitutes, and libertines clearly would not be acceptable.

Judging Acceptability

The decisions that have been described are typical of the judgments made on a day-by-day basis by the Code Authority and by stations and networks that subscribe to the Television Code.

You may have disagreed with some of these judgments; perhaps you have seen other programs or advertising material on a station subscribing to the Code that you found distasteful or annoying—or both.

Some of it might have slipped by the Code authority or the network's or station's clearance department. This is inevitable in light of the hundreds of hours of television every week and the many sources from which programming and advertising material are drawn.

But—aside from errors in the screening process—it is also inevitable that *some* material will continue to appear with which you, as an individual, would quarrel. This is bound to occur so long as there are individual differences in taste among people and so long as television does not restrict itself to the wholly innocuous.

In passing judgment on acceptability of material for television, virtually all the needs and ambitions, hopes and fears of people are legitimate areas for portrayal.

Misery and tragedy, cold remedies and detergents, pretty girls and "private eyes," are no less valid subject matter for people watching television than for the same people reading popular magazines or newspapers.

All of which leads to the obvious conclusion:

How something is treated is the major determinant as to *what* can be treated.

And it is this question of treatment—which draws so heavily on creative resources of writing, acting, and directing—that represents the greatest challenge to those charged with the responsibility for what goes on the air.

For, as the United States Supreme Court put it:

What is good literature, what has educational value, what is refined public information, what is good art, varies with individuals as it does from one generation to another . . . A requirement that literature or art conform to some norm prescribed by an official smacks of an ideology foreign to our system.

Recognizing the need for flexibility, the Television Code seeks to sanction the aesthetic and suppress the meretricious, to support the honest—while weeding out the sensational.

Clearly, it does not always succeed.

Reflecting as it does the diversity in our society, it does not always please everyone.

But it does provide a standard for the true, the decent, and the reasonable in television.

Depending as it does on intangibles—good manners, good taste, good faith, and good sense—the Television Code enlists the support of broadcasters, advertisers, advertising agencies, program producers, and the public.

Television stations that display this seal show that they have, freely and voluntarily, pledged themselves to help achieve the true purpose of the Code: Television in the Greater Public Interest.

PREAMBLE



TERMS AND CONDITIONS
OF THE UNION
and
LAWS AND REGULATIONS

CLEVELAND, OHIO

*Adopted 1890
Revised and Amended to 1951*

PREAMBLE

THE Tiffereth Israel Congregation of Cleveland, Ohio, being the owner of two Cemeteries, one on Mayfield Road near Cleveland, Ohio, and one on Willet Street in Cleveland, Ohio; and the Anshe Chesed Congregation of Cleveland, Ohio, being the owner of a Cemetery on Willet Street, adjoining the one owned by the Tiffereth Israel Congregation; Committees consisting of Jacob Mandelbaum, Julius Feiss and Kaufman Hays from the Tiffereth Israel Congregation, and Meyer Weil, Moses Halle and Simon Newmark from the Anshe Chesed Congregation, reported to their respective Congregations, a proposition to unite the three above named Cemeteries and that said two Congregations operate them jointly.

At special meetings held for the consideration of said proposition, on July 6th, 1890, both Congregations resolved and determined to merge the ownership of the three Cemeteries aforesaid so that the same shall be owned and operated jointly by them; the debt resting against the Cemetery on Mayfield Road to be assumed by said Congregations, share and share alike, and the above named Committees were instructed by their respective Congregations to formulate the terms on which said union was effected and to draft Laws and Regulations under which said Cemeteries shall be governed.

The following terms and conditions of the union, laws and regulations, were reported by said Com-

mittees and duly approved by said Congregations.

Terms and Conditions of the Union

1. The Cemetery on Mayfield Road shall be known as the Mayfield Cemetery; the two Cemeteries on Willet Street shall be known as the Willet Street Cemetery.
2. The two Cemeteries shall be under the control and management of a Committee, to be known as and styled the Board of Governors of the United Jewish Cemeteries.
3. The Board of Governors shall have power to adopt such rules and regulations as they deem expedient for disposing of and conveying burial spaces; and to prescribe rules and regulations for interments and for the operation of the Cemeteries; and to establish rates and charges for the sale of spaces and for their upkeep, and for any other service which they may be called upon to perform incidental to the maintenance of such spaces. Only those ministers who are the Rabbis of Tiffereth Israel and Anshe Chesed Congregations shall conduct services at funerals held in the Mayfield or Willet Street Cemeteries unless permission is granted upon the express approval of both senior Rabbis of said congregations. The Board of Governors is also empowered to receive funds entrusted to them by space owners for Perpetual Service and to invest and reinvest such funds in such securities

as are authorized for trust funds or savings banks in this State.

4. The Board of Governors shall consist of ten members, viz: four members from and the active Rabbi of the Tiffereth Israel Congregation, and four members from and the active Rabbi of the Anshe Chesed Congregation.

5. The Board of Governors shall be elected as follows: At the Annual Meetings of the members of the Tiffereth Israel and Anshe Chesed Congregations, each President shall appoint, from its members, four Governors to serve two years and until their successors have qualified. If the office of any Governor becomes vacant from any cause, his successor (who must be a member of the same Congregation as the Governor whose office shall have become vacant) shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees of his Congregation for the unexpired term.

6. The Board of Governors shall keep an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements, and of their accounts and proceedings, and they shall make full reports of the operation of the Cemeteries and such other matters as they deem necessary, annually to the two Congregations for their approval.

7. Receipts from all sources except donations to the Endowment Fund shall be applied by the Board of Governors to the improvement and care of the Cemeteries and to the payment of all other obligations.

8. After all debts against the Cemeteries have been paid and cancelled, the Board of Governors shall annually, after reserving a sum sufficient in its judgment to meet the ordinary expenses for the improvement and care of the Cemeteries, for one year, divide all surplus funds equally between the Tiffereth Israel and Anshe Chesed Congregations.

9. The Board of Governors shall have power to sell and dispose of burial spaces in these Cemeteries to such individuals and organizations and on such terms and conditions as said Board in its discretion may determine. Deferred payments shall be evidenced by notes bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum.

Laws and Regulations of the Board of Governors of the United Jewish Cemeteries of Cleveland, O.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND OFFICERS

Section 1. The Board of Governors shall, at their Annual Meeting in January, elect the following Executive Officers: Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Treasurer, from their own number, and a Secretary who may or may not be one of their own number, all these Officers to serve one year or until their successors are elected and have qualified.

Section 2. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings and perform such other duties as usually appertain to the office.

Section 3. The Vice Chairman shall, during the absence or disability of the Chairman, act in his place, be clothed with all his powers and perform all his duties.

Section 4. The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Board of Governors, issue all notices of meetings and permits for interments and entombments and improvements on spaces under regulations hereinafter provided; make out all bills for dues and other charges and pay all money received to the Treasurer; draw all orders on the Treasurer, render a quarterly report to the Board of Governors of all transactions; keep a register giving the name, age, residence, place of nativity, whether married or single, and cause of death of person to be interred or entombed, also the number and location of the space, and perform such other duties as the office demands.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall receive all the moneys collected on account of the Cemeteries; disbursement of funds shall be by check only, signed by two of the four Executive Officers and supported by a requisition duly approved by one of the Executive Officers in respect to any individual purchase or contracts exceeding \$25.00 in amount. Every expenditure of any amount shall be supported by requisition through the office.

Section 6. The Chairman shall appoint such com-

mittees as may from time to time be authorized by the Board of Governors.

Section 7. Any officers or employees having custody of moneys, securities or other valuable property of the Cemeteries shall give surety bonds in such amount as may be prescribed by the Board of Governors.

Section 8. All books and papers relative to the Cemeteries shall always be open to inspection by the Board and to Committees of the Tiffereth Israel and Anshe Chesed Congregations.

Section 9. The regular annual meetings shall be held in the month of January and special meetings may be called from time to time either by the Chairman or upon the request of two members of the Board. Five members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting for the transaction of business.

Section 10. All funerals shall be subject to such rules and regulations as the Board of Governors may prescribe. No denominational service or ritual other than the Jewish shall be permitted at funerals held in the Mayfield or Willet Street Cemeteries, provided, however, that Masonic ritual or the ritual of any other fraternal organization, not inconsistent with the Jewish ritual, shall be permitted.

DEEDS AND TRUST FUND AGREEMENTS

Section 11. Upon full payments for Cemetery or Mausoleum space, the owner shall be given documentary evidence of his right, title and interest therein and shall also be given a Trust Fund Agree-

ment providing for the Perpetual Care thereof. No transfer of such space may be made while there is any indebtedness against it and shall not be made without the written consent of the Board.

Section 12. (a) Owners of space, whether or not arrangements for perpetual care have been made, shall pay annually a congregational tax upon ceasing to be members of either Tiffereth Israel or Anshe Chesed Congregations.

(b) Non residents, not members of either Tiffereth Israel or Anshe Chesed Congregations, shall pay annually a congregational tax.

Section 13. The congregational tax shall be an amount equal to the minimum dues for regular membership in the congregation of which said owner was last a member.

Section 14. (a) The congregational tax referred to in Section 13 shall be remitted to the congregation of which the space owner was last a member and shall be paid when and as collection thereof has been made.

(b) Owners of space, resident or non resident, upon ceasing to be members of either Tiffereth Israel or Anshe Chesed Congregations shall arrange for the perpetual care of the space owned, at the established rates, in the event such arrangement has not been made previously.

(c) On and after November 1, 1928, no space in Mayfield Cemetery shall be sold for burial or entombment of any person who, at the time of

death, is not a member in good standing of either Tiffereth Israel or Anshe Chesed Congregations.

(d) Nothing in Section 14 (c) contained is intended to prohibit the burial of non members of Tiffereth Israel or Anshe Chesed Congregations who belong to the immediate family of one whose space was purchased prior to November 1, 1928, but as a condition precedent to such burial the sum of \$100.00 shall be paid for such interment or entombment.

(e) Space in the cemetery and mausoleum, sold since November 1, 1928, shall be for the exclusive use of members of Tiffereth Israel and Anshe Chesed Congregations and their immediate families. The Board of Governors may, in their sole judgment, make an exception in the case of dependent relatives living with such member, or dependent parents of such member.

(f) The term "immediate family," wherever used, shall be construed to mean husband, wife and unmarried dependent children living in the household of the member purchasing space.

NON-PAYMENT OF ASSESSMENTS AND TAXES

Section 15. Owners neglecting or refusing to pay the annual congregational tax or other assessments levied for the period of three consecutive years, or failing to provide for perpetual care of their space as provided in Section 14 (b), may, within thirty days after the accrued arrearage above specified, be

notified by the Secretary of said arrearage, by a registered letter sent to their last known address as shown by the records of the Cemetery Board, and provided said arrearages are not paid on or before thirty days after date of mailing such letter, which letter shall be deemed sufficient notice, then such space owner shall forfeit all right, title and interest in and to such space and title of same shall immediately revert to and vest in the Board of Governors of the United Jewish Cemeteries, without any further notice or action, legal or otherwise, on its part and said space owner is forever debarred from asserting any interest in or to said space.

PERMITS

Section 16. No entombments nor interments may be made nor work of any kind done in or about the Cemetery without an order in writing from the Secretary, and no such orders may be issued for space against which any charges have accrued.

LOT IMPROVEMENTS

Section 17. No headstone, monument or mausoleum may be erected in the Cemeteries until sketches, drawings and plans indicating materials, design, finish, size and proposed inscription thereon have been first submitted to and approved by the Superintendent or the Board of Governors. No mausoleum plot shall be sold to a prospective purchaser until such approval of plans for the mausoleum has been granted by the Board of Governors.

All foundations for headstones and monuments shall be constructed by the Cemeteries, upon order of the lot owner, and charged to him at the established prices.

FREE BURIAL

Section 18. When circumstances warrant, free burial may be provided the members of the Congregations or to non-members at the discretion of the Board of Governors.

Section 19. The Superintendent or his assistant must be present at every interment and entombment and it shall be his duty to open and close the spaces.

CEMETERY AND MAUSOLEUM TRUST FUNDS

Section 20. (a) There shall be established and maintained upon the books of the United Jewish Cemeteries the following accounts: (a) general fund; (b) perpetual care trust fund; (c) capital assets account; and (d) surplus fund. Included in the capital assets account shall be all unsold salable lots, all unsold space in the Mayfield mausoleum, and the improved and unimproved real estate in the Mayfield and Willet Street cemeteries.

(b) All receipts from the sale of lots, after first deducting therefrom the amount charged for perpetual care, shall be divided equally between the general fund and surplus fund. The amount charged and received for perpetual care shall be credited to the perpetual care trust fund.

(c) All receipts from the sale of space in the Mayfield mausoleum shall be divided as follows: seventy-five percent (75%) therefrom to the general fund, and twenty-five percent (25%) therefrom to the perpetual care trust fund.

(d) All income realized from securities and investments belonging to the perpetual care trust fund shall be paid to the general fund.

Section 21. (a) The general fund shall be used for the care and maintenance of lots and graves and the mausoleum and their environment, and for any unusual construction or repair that may, in the judgment of the Governors, be required.

(b) Care and maintenance of lots and graves shall consist of cutting, sprinkling and re-sodding of graves, filling in graves when sunken, keeping headstones and corner stones vertical and in general keeping the cemeteries in good order.

(c) Care and maintenance of the mausoleum shall consist of proper cleaning, heating and repair of the building as well as the care of the grounds and approaches surrounding and adjacent to said building.

Section 22. (a) The amounts to be added from time to time to the sales price of lots and graves in the cemeteries, for their perpetual care and maintenance, shall be upon such basis as the Board of Governors shall determine and shall apply to all lots or graves sold thereafter.

(b) The Board of Governors may from time to time and upon request establish rates for other special services incident to the decoration or care of lots, graves or space in the mausoleum.

Section 23. (a) The general fund, perpetual care trust fund, capital assets account, and surplus fund shall be under the direction of the Board of Governors. Moneys belonging to each of said funds shall be deposited or invested separately. Investments and reinvestments shall be made by the Executive Officers of the Board upon the approval of said Board and in accordance with the provisions of these regulations as now existing or as may hereafter be adopted.

(b) The Board of Governors may enter into an arrangement with a Fiduciary Agent for the care and investment of said Trust Funds in accordance with such an agreement as will be satisfactory to the Boards of Trustees of the two Temples.

AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Regulations may be proposed at any meeting of the Board of Governors and if adopted by them shall be submitted to the Trustees of Tiffereth Israel and Arshe Chesed Congregations for approval. The affirmative vote of the Board of Trustees of both Congregations shall be necessary to adopt the amendments.
