Dear Rabbi:

I am enclosing, herewith, my manuscript on Soviet anti-semitism. The title ends with a question mark, leaving it to the reader for his own final decision as to the existance of anti-semitism there.

This article is not based on assumptions, observations, or Soviet newspapers' clippings, it is rather taken from facts of Soviet Jewish life, as only a Russian born and Russian educated Jew could have had access to.

I believe, this is the first time an American Jew has had the opportunity and possibility to absorb thoroughly the life and status of Jews as citizens of the Soviet Union.

Rabbi, I am sending this manuscript to you, because I know that your opinion in regard to the Soviet anti-semitism, is not of the same as some of our leading Jewish organizations, and I would appreciate your comments about it.

Although, the local Jewish National Post gave some publicity to my article, I find it very difficult with other Jewish and non-Jewish publications. It seems to me that it is also the policy of our Government, to cry Russian anti-semitism for political reasons. We are doing an injustice to the Soviet Jews by taking such an attitude.

If possible, I would appreciate if you could, please, send it back to me after reading it, as this is the only way for circulating this report.
