Dear Dr. Silver.

I have just received a copy of In The Time of Harvest, a beautiful Jubilee volume, which will have to be reviewed in the forthcoming "Abba Hillel Silver issue" of BITZARON. Harold Manson's article was translated and is being set up to appear together with your historic U. N. address, an article on Zionism by Dr. Max Nussbaum dedicated to you, and other appropriate material. It promises to be a most interesting issue.

As a Trustee of the Tarbuth Foundation, no doubt were informed that thus far two Hebrew publications other than Bitzaron were included for allocations. I am certain that you will want to intercede on our behalf so as to right this wrong. Your word will carry immense weight with Dr. Neumann and the Goodman brothers, especially since the matter is now under consideration.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I appreciate your friendly letter of June 14th and I highly value the sentiment which you so graciously express about the Silver issue of "Bitzaron."

You inquire whether we have heard from Dr. Neumann and the Tarbuth Foundation. I regret to state that to date we have not received any word about a significant allocation —or any allocation—to "Bitzaron" from that source. But indirectly I did learn that the matter will definitely come up at a meeting in the very near future (before the Zionist delegates to the Convention depart for Israel.) In fact, I deliberately withheld my reply to your kind inquiry for a few days in the hope of being able to report something positive, which, alas, has not yet happened.

In the meantime, however, something else happened. We received just now an ultimatum from our printer, which I am taking the liberty of enclosing. Something of significant nature must be done to help rescue our publication. I cannot tell you, Dr. Silver, how much we miss the allocation from the Jewish Agency which the Agency 2skipped" for the entire year from April 1962 to March 1963, representing two thousand dollars in all, and which according to Dr. Neumann cannot be reclaimed. This is the cause of our present crisis. Some Cleveland friend told me that in honor of your seventieth birthday your own community has placed some forty thousand dollars at your disposal for distribution at your personal discretion. It does not seem possible: Is there any truth to it? A significant allocation to "Bitzaron" from such a fund would certainly go a long way in solving our present situation!
