Section 18 If any employer, employe or other person shall violate any provisions of this act or shall do any Act prohibited by this Act or shall fail or refuse to perform any duty lawfully enjoined, within the time prescribed by the commission, for which no penalty has been specifically provided, or fail, neglect or refuse to obey any lawful order given or made by the commission, or any judgment or decree made by any court in connection with the provisions of this Act, for each such violation, failure or refusal such employer or other person shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars, nor more than One Thousand Dollars for the first offense and not less than One Hundred nor more than Five Thousand Dollars for each subsequent offense.

Section 19. Every day during which any person, persons or corporations, or any officer, agent, or employe thereof shall fail to observe and comply with any order of the commission, or to perform any duty enjoined by this Act shall consitutue a separate and distinct violation of such order or said section as the case may be.

Section 20. The sections of this Act, and every part of such sections are hereby declared to be independent sections, and parts of sections and the holding of any section or part thereof to be void or ineffective shall not affect any other section or part thereof.

Section 21. This Act shall be in effect on an after July 1st, 1931; but no premiums shall be payable by employees or employers until on and after January 1st, 1932.

I hear the most pitiful stories as to the condition in which some of the Jewish children refugees are arriving in this Country, and what I repeat now is authentic information. Apart from the deplorable condition of health in which these children arrive, several of them have been branded with the "Swastika" mark, and one child had such a brand mark on her face, which it is hoped plastic surgery will now remove. No adult, apparently, can leave Germany without paying the equivalent of 180 pounds, but people in Holland have, through bribing the guards, been able to secure the release of several from the concentration camps. I know of one case where 5000 pounds was paid and the man was released and is now in hiding in Germany but for the moment it has been impossible to remove him into Holland. I am sure we shall never really know what is happening over there, and I have no doubt that information reaches your ears which is equally abhorring. However, retribution will come when Hitler and his complete entourage will suffer at the hands of the German nation.

I am, however, convinced that War cannot be averted for such longer. The recent incidents in Italy against France, which unquestionably have been instigated by Italian officialdom and are now supported by the Nazis is in itself sufficient evidence that a quarrel is intended. The trouble is that War will break out without anyone knowing at what hour it will commence.

I do not understand our Government declining to put into operation a compulsory register. I don't think that any steps they could take now could be sufficient to protect the Nation in a time of emergency. There is, however, an official indication that the Government will assume control of property in time of war and we may yet find ourselves more entirely socialized as a nation than we at present contemplate, but unless the Government does take control of men, women and offects, they will not be able to act in time of stress as one individual mind.

CITATION:

"For distinguished service in the line of his profession on the northern coast of Guadalcanal Island on August 10, 1942. While a member of a patrol advancing through enemy territory, HAGGARD, with utter disregard for his own personal safety fearlessly faced the accurate rifle fire of numerous enemy snipers to treat the wounds of incapacitated marines. Largely as a result of his valorous action the lives of several of the wounded were saved, and he set a fine example of courage to the members of his company."
