SEVEN MEN TRAPPED IN COAL MINE

Rescuers Driving Way in
Explosion-Wrecked
Oklahoma Mine

NINE BODIES RECOVERED

One Miner Is Saved Alive;
Gas Thought to Have
Caused Blast

TAHONA, Okla.—Driving their way through a tunnel choked with wreckage, miners early today were making frantic efforts to reach a pit, 1,400 feet below the ground, where seven of their number may still live.

Officials of the Superior Smokeless Coal company, at whose mine the explosion occurred early yesterday, expressed slight belief that the men would be found alive but the miners, working in relays, clung to a scant hope.

Nine Bodies Recovered

Nine bodies already had been taken from the debris-filled entrance to the mine. Only one man, Lee Carter, who had gone into the pit with the night gang, so far has been rescued.

A blast, believed caused by gas seepage, came while 138 were at work below the surface. All but the 17 in one of the pits made their way to the ground. Some had been badly injured by flying bits of wreckage.

Had to Fight Flames

Flames followed the explosion and it was only after several hours' battle that workmen were able to cut their way through the tunnel leading toward the trapped miners. Fire fighting apparatus from Ft. Smith, Ark., assisted in conquering the blaze.

Crowds of white-faced relatives of missing miners were gathered about the pit mouth.

FASCIST HEEL GRINDS LABOR

Exploitation of Children and Women in Industry Is Charged

WORK IN PLANTS, MINES

Boys and Girls Hired for 20-Cent Wage, Report Declares

LUGANO, Switzer., (By Cable)—A strong denunciation of allegedly ghastly conditions of workers in Italy is contained in an uncensored report from that country to the Cleveland Times—N. Y. World Correspondent.

The report says children under 10 are employed in many Italian factories and paid from 20 to 30 cents for a 10-hour day. These are the conditions in a saw mill at Dastelgranco near Bologna. Twelve-year old girls do some of the most burdensome work in a big canning factory near Naples for 25 and 30 cents a day.

Boys in Sulphur Mines

Boys under 12 are employed in many Sicilian sulphur mines and several cases of children injured in this work are mentioned in the report.

Women workers get wages which in many cases do not represent a rock bottom standard of living. In the Taranto state tobacco factory women workers get less than three cents for every kilogram of prepared tobacco. Six lire (less than 25 cents) is the wage for a 10-hour day in a big nail factory in Piedmont.

The report also lists the following handicaps for Italian labor:

Arbitrary Exaction of Fines

Arbitrary exaction of fines, the forcing on workers of an extra hour's work without extra pay, the exaction of affiliation fees by Fascist trades unions from non-affiliated workers, abolition of old age pensions and inefficient medical assistance. While the cost of living shows an increase of 700 per cent, on the pre-war rates, wages have decreased 30 per cent.

Lately one of Premier Mussolini's press organs declared that attempts by foreign plutocracy to strangle Italy economically were doomed to failure "because Italy has, thank heaven, a standard of living still barbaric enough to enable her people to put up with further sacrifices if necessary."

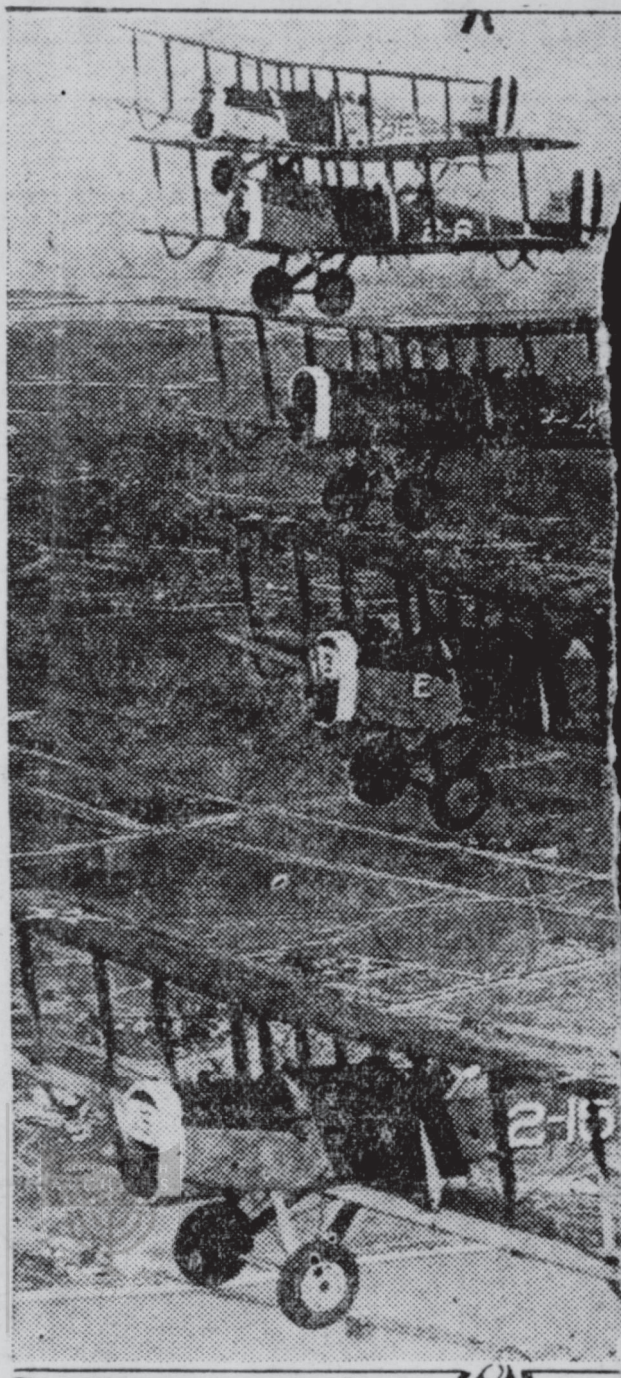

RICH MAN MURDERS BOND GIRL, KILLS SELF

Aged Kentuckian Kills Victim, While Sleeping With Woman Friend

LEXINGTON, Ky.—Awakened by a revolver shot to find her girl friend dead in bed beside her and witnessing the protracted suicide of the murderer, a wealthy Kentucky hotel man, Alma Gregory, of Brooklyn, has given the Lexington police details of the tragedy.

Kelly C. Kirtley, 70, shot and killed Miss Gregory's companion, Mildred McDaniel, also of Brooklyn, while the two girls lay asleep in the Lafayette hotel, yesterday.

Witnesses Death Agony

Kirtley then fired a bullet into his head, and later another through his ear. He thrashed about on the floor in his death agony, while Miss Gregory screamed for help.

The aged man, in a will, directed his victim's funeral expenses be paid from his estate "that is, if she is buried in my lot."

Miss McDaniel was a strikingly pretty telephone operator.
