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THE DISASTROUS DECADE 1930-1940

The Balance Sheet of Ten Turbulent Years

On Sunday morning, December 31, 1939 For the world, my friends, this last decade has been one of the most disastrous in its annals. It was a decade shot through with wars, disorders, depression, suffering, tyranny. It was a decade of retreat and recession both in the material and in the spiritual field - in government, in economics, international relations, in human ideals. The last ten years witnessed a liquidation of many of the great ideals which were generated by the ideals of the last World War - rights of minorities, disarmament, outlawry of war and collective security.

The decade saw the collapse of the League of Nations, of all effort at world organization for peace. There was a sharp throwback, to regional pacts, to group alliances, to military axes, to a competitive balance of military power.

The last ten years witnessed the destruction of democratic governments, the discredit of the democratic principles of one country after another, the suppression of hard-won liberties and precious human rights, the enthronement of despotism over vast areas of the earth and the increasing subjugations of people by force, terrorism and espionage.

The last decade saw the steady surrender of the individual to the state, and the state to the dictator.

The last ten years witnessed an almost unbroken series of violated international pledges and covenants, of invasions, of conquest, of revolts and wars in Africa, Asia or Europe in which free governments were systematically destroyed, weaker nations ravaged and small nations annihilated. One need but mention the names - just the names - China, Ethiopia, Spain, Austria, Czecho-slovakia, Albania, Poland, Finland; and similarly, one need but mention the cities of Shanghai, Warsaw, Madrid - and their destrictuion - the destruction of men and women and cildren in them by bombing from the air to realize the utter shamelessness of this immoral and murderous era through which mankind passed.

Three names dominated the life of Europe, to an extent, the life of the

whole of mankind - Mussolini, Hitler, Stalin - and each of these three names has come to be associated in the minds of men with cruelty, deceit and double dealing, with purges, with persecution, with aggression. Each one has been the breeder of hate, the destroyer of liberties and the maker of war.

And as the sense of insecurity increased all over the earth during the last ten years, as for example with the abandonment of the League of Nations and of the agencies for the protection of nations against agression, a vast and ruinous race for armament set in all over the earth which has progressively impoverished the masses of mankind. And there also set in a disastrous policy of economic self-sufficiency on the part of nations as a military measure which policy has played havor with international trade and checked the revival of business and economic activity all over the earth.

During these last ten years as in no similar short period in the history of mankind, human ideals slumped lamentably, and powerful governments set about teaching their people to hold the classic ideals of mankind - liberty, freedom, peace, tolerance in utter contempt. Men were taught to hate men in the name of race. Men were taught to destroy men in the name of class. Nations were directed to exterminate weaker neighbors in the name of national destiny. The ideal of human brotherhood and the ideals of a federated world of free peoples held together by international law - those ideals were proclaimed anathema. Scourges were set over human thought. Intellectual freedom, academic freedom, was branded as the blackest heresy, and the ideal of law, impartial, objective, over-arching law as a force for justice and civilization, law too as a concept of human justice per se were scrapped in these totalitarian countries which cover more than half the earth. Education and human culture were prostituted in the last decade by political and economic despotisms and teachers, professors, lawyers, judges, writers and journalists, in their tens of thousands allowerthe earth, have been either frightened, cowered or

cajoled into a cowardly submissiveness, or silenced if not enlisted actually into an active conspiracy in this work of prostituting the human mind, of discrediting the ancient and classic ideals of human thought. In over ten thousand schools and universities in Italy, Germany, Russia, Japan, not a voice has been lifted against that tyranny which is destroying the sovereignty and the integrity of the human mind.

The spirit of man was brutally assaulted. The spirit of man was brutally attacked during the last ten years, and as a result the personal beliefs of man have been terribly shaken. There has been a degree of spiritual bafflement all over the world. People don't know what to believe in, what to cling to. People don't know what ideals are worth striving for, living for and dying for in the world.

Liberals and conservatives and reactioneries and radicals, all alike, have been confused and disillusioned as a result first of a failure of those governments which seem to be the embodiment of their ideals, of their ideals, and secondly as a result of the strange and baffling alliances which were made between these seemingly irreconcilable governments.

And so, most fittingly therefore, my friends, this evil decade ends in another World War. It is the logical denouement of a mad, vicious, of a kwless era. And the world must again atone in blood, in human suffering for the blunders of its leaders, for the blindness of its leaders, for the sins and the crimes of those powerful people and groups who control the destiny of mankind during this last decade.

In our own country, the United States, the decade began in the wake of a disastrous stock crash, in the midst of bank failures, unemployment, hard times and bread lines. The gildred, gaudy, giddy Twenties slithered into the dark,

dank, dreary Thirties when hunger and want and bankruptcy stalked over the land. At times during these last ten years, there were as many as ten million unemployed in these United States, in a rich and prosperous nation, the envy of the world whose stock houses bulged with the accumulation of the gold of the world and who found itself tottering on the brink of human ruin.

For ten years now it has been struggling to get out of this depression with only a fair measure of success. The problem of our economic disorganization, the problem of the catastrophic economic cycles, that problem is far from being solved.

Business within the year, within the last year of this decade received an artificial stimulus from the war raging overseas, but even business is under no illusion about the permanence of this improvement. And as regards the unemployment - there are still ten millions of them. And as regards the enormous problem of their relief - no adequate solution has yet been found. You recall the shameless break-down of relief measures in our own city, a situation unfortunately which our own press found necessary somehow to cover up in part. There is still the spectacle in this country of men, women and children hungry and shelterless.

This last decade saw the expose of many of its financial wizards, men who in the Twenties came to be looked upon as economic messiahs. The Thirties exposed them for the financial crooks that they were - the Insulls, the Eatons, the Whitneys, the Kruegers, the Stavitskys and the Mendelssohns, as racketeers on a large colossal scale.

This last decade was one of bitter industrial strife in the United States, of strikes and sit-down strikes, that internal strife and partition within the ranks of labor itself.

This decade witnessed the tail end of the Prohibition Era, with its cheap

gangsters, racketeers and speak-easies. It also witnessed the crime wave which followed its repeal.

The last years in the United States also saw an increased intolerance between Capital and Labor. There were incipient essays in Fascism and dictatorship in this country on the line of Huey Long, incipient movements which employed the same technique as the dictatorships abroad, the same slogans - "Share the Wealth", "Get Rich Quick", the Pot of Gold at the end of the Rainbow". This last decade saw quite a number of these dangerous crack-pot schemes for making one age section of our population secure by the taxation of other age groups - The Townsend Plan, the Bitelow Plan - all of which are the forerunners of democratic chais and dictatorship once they get into effect.

This last decade also witnessed increasing anti-democratic propaganda in the United States of the Nazi type and the Communist type. The anti-democratic type of the Nazis was directly tied up with anti-Semitism. For the first time in the history of the e United States there was present the spectacle of numerous groups, large and small, whose sole purpose was anti-Semitism.

This last decade in the United States also witnessed - and this should

be put on the credit side of the ledger - brave and courageous experiments to put

our economic house in order to avert disaster and to save democracy, experiments

which have come to be associated in the minds of American people with the New

Deal and with the name of President Roosevelt. Some of these measures were found

to be inoperative, some were invalid by our own Supreme Court. Some of them

remained as helpful measures for the protection of our people against the ravages

of economic disaster. Large scale help has been extended by our Federal Government,

in some instances by our State Governments to workers, farmers, the small home

owner, through large scale federal relief measures which were introduced in these

desperate years to keep our people from starvation and revolt. Large scale measures

of public works were introduced which have provided work for many of our unemployed and which have given to our country many important and necessary and beautiful institutions, buildings, schools, colleges, airports, roads, dams. Important measures for social security, insurance for the unemployed, insurance for the aged are now on our statute books and the ground work has been made for sound and sane wholesome measures of security for all the people of these United States—measures to adjust the increased conflict between employer and employee, such as the Wagner Labor Act; machinery for the amicable adjustment between employer and employee. None of these measures is perfect. None is in its final form. But all of these measures will contribute to the establishment of greater stability, greater security and greater will being in this country, where there is enough for all, and where the well-being of one need not be purchased at the expense of any one group for another group.

During these ten years, especially during the last part of the decade, there has been an aroused and growing devotion on the part of American people for America, for the American way of life, for American democracy, and an increased resolve to defend it. There has been rekindled an active enthusiasm for American institutions and American ideals. What has happened abroad and what is happening abroad has startled the American out of his complacency. He has come to know that his way of life is precious to him and he is determined to defend himself against all forms of intolerance and Old World propaganda. He is organizing the Americans, all groups and all classes to appreciate the American ideals of human equality, liberty and human freedom. So that for the United States, this last decade has not been an altogether lost decade.

For our people, the Jews, it has been a decade of agony, one of the blackest in our history. One-third of our people were shattered. One need but thing of the Jewish communities in Austria, Czecho-slovakia, Poland, Germany, to

realize just what has happened in ten short years. The Jewish people in the neighboring countries of those I have mentioned were terribly deteriorated. Was it really a case of persecution? Was it really a case of subjecting Jews to certain disabilities? It was something far more horrible. It was a case of Jews, of five million Jews having been declared outlawed, entitled to no consideration of law or of human compassion. They were not merely deprived of their citizenship. They were deprived of the right to live, deprived of the right to own their own homes, their own possessions and given the choice of exile or of slow death or of quick suicide.

The last ten years saw the world suddenly filled with tens of thousands of Jewish refugees, homeless. You know the stories of how they were cast about on sea and on land knocking at doors which refused to open, begging a chance for a foot of ground upon which to stand on God's earth.

The last ten years saw anti-Semitism becoming a world movement and a political program of many nations or parties within nations.

During the last ten years Jewries throughout the world - those Jewries which were not persecuted had to take care of those who were persecuted, and their chief concern has been a relief concern - to provide foot raiment and shelter for them. During the last ten years instead of permitting ourselves and devoting our the betterment of substances to/our own lives, we had to devote most of our energies to an unnecessary cause, man-made, so futile, so purposeless.

During these last ten years one can report perhaps two bright spots in the Jewish picture: One was the steady upbuilding of the Jewish community in Palestine which in these ten years rose from a population of two hundred thousand to a population of over five hundred thousand... And even that community had to pass through serious disturbances, riots, political checks and disorders of all kinds.

The second bright spot was the growing and evolving Jewish community in the United States which evidenced fine community-self-consciousness, fine community leadership and good community organization, and a sense of Jewish solidarity and responsibility which is a credit to the Jews of this country.

And history records, and I am not trying to explain it, I can only record as our history records, that whenever one large Jewish center of Jewish life was destroyed, somehow another center of Jewish life arose to carry on the life of the Jews. When Palestine was destroyed, Babylon became a powerful Jewish center of Jewish life. When Babylon declined, and the Jewish community disintegrated, that marvelous Spanish center of Jewish life sprung up, and for a hundred years it was the pride of the Jewish people. It gave us poets, scholars and statesmen. When that center of Jewish life was destroyed, the great Eastern Polish and Russian centers of Jewish life appeared and for hundreds of years it was the citadel of Jewish life which produced splendid scholars. Now that the Jewish communities of Europe are being destroyed, there is growing up a great Jewish center, numerically and spiritually, in these United States.

So, my friends, if one takes a hasty survey of these last ten years, one does not encounter a very cheerful picture. It was not a happy decade we have lived through - you and I and others. "This, too, shall pass over".

Of two things you can be sure, and in that assurance you can find great comfort, namely, that the human mind, assailed and attacked though it has been, and fettered though it is in many parts of the world, that human mind has not ceased to function, to think, to quest, to adventure, to explore, to invent. It has never stopt its eternal activity. That human mind will ultimately break through every confining bar. Even during these hard and cruel years, the human mind was active, unfortunately not in the field of the spirit, but in the fields of science, invention.

I know three great world fairs in the last few years which I had the opportunity to visit which showed in concrete form the amazing progress which the human mind made in human technology, in the arts, sciences, physics, chemistry and medicine. New healing drugs have been discovered. Life expectancy has been increased. Trans-oceanic passenger services have been established in the last ten years. Great water dams have been built - the TVA and Boulder Dams. Progress has been recorded in the fields of radio. The human mind has not stopped thinking.

Nor has the human heart stopped feeling. The eternal ideals of goodness, compassion, and sympathy have not been killed from the human heart. And even during these years of widespread intolerance and cruelty, there have been so many fine manifestations of deep human understanding and compassion and self-sacrifice on the part of so many many millions of people in all parts of the earth that one need not despair that the human mind and the human heart will score the last, the ultimate victory.

And so one feels like repeating with more fervor than in any previous years, the words:

Ring out the old, ring in the new,
Ring, happy bells, across the snow:
The year is going, let him go;
Ring out the false, ring in the true.

Ring out a slowly dying cause,
And ancient forms of party strife;
Ring in the nobler modes of life,
With sweeter manners, purer laws.

Ring out false pride in place and blood,

The civic slander and the spite;

Ring in the love of truth and right,

Ring in the common love of good.

Ring out old shapes of foul disease;
Ring out the narrowing lust of gold;
Ring out the thousand wars of old,

For the world this has been one of the most disastrous decades in its annals. It saw the steady surrender of the individual to the state, and the state to the dictator.

The last decade recorded an almost unbroken series of violated international covenants, of invasions, conquests and wars in which weak nations were ravaged, and small nations destroyed.

Three names dominated the life of Europe, and to an extent, the life of the world - Hitler, Mussolini and Stalin - and each is associated with cruelty, deceit, double-dealing, purges, persecutions and aggressions. Each has been a breeder of hate, a destroyer of liberties and a maker of wars.

Human ideals slumped lamentably during the last decade. Powerful governments taught men to hold the classic ideals of mankind - liberty, freedom, peace, tolerance - in contempt. They were taught to hate men in the name of race.

They were taught to destroy men in the name of class. They were directed to exterminate weaker neighbors in the name of national destiny. Scourges were set over human thought. Intellectual freedom was branded as blackest

Law as a force for justice and civilization ceased. Education and culture were prostituted in the interests of political and economic despotism. The spirit of man was brutally assaulted, and as a result, the foundations of belief and conviction have been dangerously shaken. There is an increasing sense of spiritual insecurity and bafflement in the world.

Most fittingly, therefore, does this evil decade end in another world war. It is the logical denouement of a mad, vicious and lawless era. In the United States, the decade began on the heels of a disastrous stock crash and in the wake of bank failures, unemployment and hard times. The gilded, gaudy, giddy Twenties slithered into the dark, dank, dreary Thirties when hunger, want and bankruptcies stalked the land.

It was a decade of bitter industrial strife, of strikes and sit-down strikes as well as of strife and partition within the ranks of labor itself. It witnessed increasing intolerance in the relations between capital and labor, incipient essays in dictatorship of the Huey Long variety, fantastic and crack-pot schemes for making people rich, and increasing anti-democratic propaganda on the part of Nazis and Communists.

But the decade also witnessed brave experiments in setting our economic house in order which are associated with the New Deal and with the name of President Roosevelt. Some of these measures were found inoperative, or were otherwise invalidated. Others have remained as helpful factors in a rational organization in American economic life. Towards the close of the decade has there also been an effort and an aroused devotion on the part of the American people for democracy and for the American way of life, and an earnest resolution to defend them against all forms of intolerance and Old World propaganda. For the United States this has not been an altogether lost decade.

For the Jews this decade has been one long agony. One-third of our people were shattered. Mil ions were not merely persecuted but outlawed, and homeless, stripped and impoverished wanderers filled the highways of the war world seeking new homes. The moral collapse of mankind was nowhere more tragically apparent than in the fate of these millions of human beings.

While the general picture is certainly depressing, one should remember that in spite of all that has happened, that human mind heart have not stopped their eternal activities. The mind of man is still questing, adventuring, exploring and int inventing, and will not remain forever enshackled even in the lands of despotism. Nor has the human heart permanently surrendered its eternal ideals of justice and kindness. There have been inspiring manifestations during these cruel years of boundless sympathy, compassion and self-sacrifice on the part of countless men of good will throughout the earth. The undefeated mind and heart of man will yet claim the ultimate victory.
