A native of Rushville, Ind., General Brann had become deputy commander only on Oct. 29. His decorations included the Distinguished Service Medal, awarded for his work in supervising the planning of the Allies' landings at Salerno.

GERMAN WORKERS FOR SECRET VOTING

Readily Accept Allies' Plan to Organize-Soviet Picked Leader Idea Opposed

BERLIN, Oct. 25 (Delayed)-German labor has been quick fo take advantage of the permission to organize and hold shop elections in the United States zone of dccupation, Brig. Gen. Frank J. Mc Sherry, director of the Manpower Division of the Office of Military Government in Germany, said to

More than in any other class he said, there is evidence among the workers of an appreciation of the nation's collective guilt for the war and an understanding of the fundamental principles of democ-

The interesting thing about the trend of worker organization i the American zone, he said, is the almost complete lack of organization on craft lines. The movement is more than a tendency to or ganize along the vertical lines of Congress of Industrial Organizal tion's unions, General McSherry said, asserting that the workers were impressed with the necessity of solidarity.

It is too soon yet to say that out of the present activities a new German labor movement is being born in the political sense, but the general indicated that in his view it would be only natural, in the localities where the workers' or ganizations controlled the balance of electoral power, for them to go directly into politics.

Hope Seen in Labor Groups

The general added that if there were any chance of transforming the present-day Germany into a peace-loving democratic state, as envisaged at the Potsdam meeting, it would lay with the workers and the organizations being built now,

This insistence by American and British occupation authorities that labor organize from the bottom up and that leaders be chosen by secret ballot with as broad a base of voters as possible has brought the Anglo-Americans into a collision with the Russian views on the subject in Berlin. Here the Kommandatura has been unable to agree upon a formula whereby the workers could choose their

Text of the Testament by Ley

P)—The text of Robert Ley's political testament, "To My German People," follows:

Do I have a right to appeal to the German people after its singular catastrophe? been one of the responsible men, I was with Hitler in the good days, during the fulfillment of our plans and hopes and I want to be with him now in the black

I have learned to see in everything the hand of Providence. God led me in whatever I did, He led me up and now lets me I am torturing myself to find the reason for the downfall, and this is the result of my contemplations.

We have forsaken God, and therefore we were forsaken by God. We put our human volition in the place of His godly grace. In anti-Semitism we violated a basic commandment of His crea-

Anti-Semitism distorted our outlook, and we made grave errors. It is hard to admit mistakes, but the whole existence of our people is in question; we Nazis must have the courage to rid ourselves of anti-Semitism. We have to declare to the youth that it was a

The youth will not believe our opponents. Men may fall, parties and systems disappear, but the people must remain and live.

Calls for New Doctrine

In order to succeed we have to go all the way to tolerate the This is not enough. have to eradicate distrust. have to meet the Jews with open hearts and on a clear basis. have to clean up our mutual relationship.

A complete reconciliation has to be found, and a new modus vivendi. This doctrinal clarification has the priority over any economic or cultural reconstruction. We have to have the cour-

age to do this.

For the lack of any other ideal, youth will stick to National Socialism. The deported Jews will not be able to return carefree, they will find themselves opposed by a phalanx of defense and hate, the occupation troops will leave some day, new political constellations might give Germany new chances. Nothing is more unstable than peace agreements. Then anti-Semitism would flame up

NUREMBERG, Germany, Oct. 26 anew and rage much worse than ever before.

It is unwise to believe it possible to exterminate anti-Semitism with histrionic trials, no difference how skilfully they are conducted. On the contrary, one will achieve the opposite, one will steer world opinion to a problem that can only maintain itself in dark, unless one has courage to solve the Jewish problem by public discussions and enlightenment. One cannot stop the excited sea at once, but has to let her calm down gradually. Otherwise terrible repercussions will result.

Urges Accord with Jewry

German anti-Semitics taken the first step. They have to take the second step, too. Jewry has to reconcile herself with Germany and vice versa, for the sake of world peace and of world welfare. Not an armistice, but a peace built on logic, knowledge, clear rights and obligations is necessary. The Jew should make a friend out of Germany and Germany a friend out of the Jew. If humanity is not able to control again the stirred-up emotions, she will perish through

The emotions have to be subdued at the starting point, from Germany. They have to be calmed down. Here the outspoken anti-Semites have to become the first fighters for the new and yet so close idea. They have to find the courage to conquer themselves, they have to show their people the way. God has taught me that in my cell in Nuremberg, and now my plan:

(A) First, the creation of a board of Jews and anti-Semites, honestly prepared to travel this road and to find the conditions under which Jews and Germans can live together.

(B) An executive committee. again Jews and Germans together, to execute the agreed-upon arrangements.

(C) An organization for re-education and propaganda to disseminate these ideas down to the smallest village.

Admits He made Mistake

For the moment I have no more to say. Otherwise my plan will become obscure. Doubtless there is still plenty to be talked over. German people: Many of you might think me mad or a traitor. They do not realize that I am not

admitting a mistake, but that I

am merely coming to a logical conclusion. They cannot perceive that one must have been an anti-Semitic to come to this further step of knowledge. This is why only you, my German people, may dare to invite the Jews to make their future home with you. Is it not strange that nearly all Jews all over the world understand German? Hate and love lie close

together.

Who will help you rebuild, my German people? It is a question of confidence. The prerequisite is and remains the solution to the Jewish problem in Germany, German people: Be a good family father, make an honest balance. You have been totally defeated, yet you possess a marvelous logic, idea, and are a great people. God shows you the way. Learn from your downfall. Reconcile yourself with the Jew. Invite him to make his home with you.

Is the Jew prepared to go along? If he is intelligent-yes. If not, then I cannot change that. At least I have done my duty by showing humanity the road. God showed me. If the Jews refuse my plan, then the depicted world catastrophe will take its inev-

itable course.

Puts His Faith in God

Should Germany solve the Jewish problem, and grow healthy through it, the whole world would benefit from it. This most burn-ing problem of the whole world would be solved once and for all. Zionism in its present form is not a permanent solution. Germany is ripe to solve the Jewish prob-

I know my plan is bold, almost audacious. If one should ask me what the Fuehrer would have said, my answer would be: "This singular genius, a commander in chief like Hannibal, would not want Germany to Carthage perished." perish as

All I can say is that I dared it, I put it now into the hands of God, from Whom I believe I have received the inspiration and rev-

Only a few weeks ago, I did not dare to touch the subject of anti-Semitism. Today, it is entirely clear to me. I am possessed with this idea, now God has to help me to bring my thoughts to the appropriate place. I have confidence in Him. He will find the right way.
