I am very happy to address you again as President of the Temple at this occasion of the 40th year of the Rabbi's service with us. For 17 of these years I have had ample opportunity to observe the deep respect and admiration that you, as concregates and friends, have for our Rabbi *** many of you were confirmed as well as married by him and he has shared in the sorrows and joys that have come to all of us.

His 40 years as our spirtual leader were devoted not only to give comfort, but to share our civic responsibility. Leading us when the times demanded courageous leadership and always enriching us by his wisdom. No man in our times has been a greater force in the fight for good and justice. Few have had his foresight and shown his courage in speaking so clearly and ably for the establishment and continued economic development of the State of Israel.

His mind, spirit and great personality have gained him fame far beyond our Temple and city. His greatness is respected

As to my personal association with Rabbi Silver, this relationship has been one of the most beautiful and elevating I have ever had the good fortune to experience.

This great scholar - this man of social vision - this ardent supporter of our people, with his steadfast convictions and truth, has stirred me to greater accomplishments and, because of knowing and working with him, I am a better man.

We have been privileged to be so closely affiliated with the Rabbi. His 40 years at the Temple have benefited all of us. Because of him we have learned spirtual ideals and values. We have been truly blessed.


