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Succoth, 1945.

For the Lord thy God bringeth thee into a good land, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and depths, springing forth in valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, and vines and fig-trees and pomegranates; a land of olive-trees and honey; a land wherein thou shalt eat bread without ~~scarce~~ness, thou shalt not lack anything in it; a land whose stones are iron, and out of whose hills thou mayest dig brass. And thou shalt eat and be satisfied, and bless the Lord thy God, for the good land which He hath given thee.

Among the Arabs there are no distinctions, traditional or natural except the unconscious power given a famous ~~skeikh~~^{MES} by virtue of his accomplishments: and they taught me that no man could be their leader except he ate the ranks' food, wore their clothes, lived level with them, and yet appeared better in himself.

Among nomads the poorest is actually the equal of the richest: all alike partake of the same food, wear the same coarse clothing, and inhabit the same primitively furnished dwelling, the tent
