1) Not a National Holiday - Histos. Holiday of Nature. YK-47 //

2). Not addressed to one nation, all nations, or Humanity.
But to ind. Man - He is central motif. Superb - great exhort.
Man! Every man!. Regardless of station or caste, class, merit
man in the trials of destroy - in his essential humanity, against
the background of Eternity, man, as God sees him.
More > in nature of any other holiday - idea of Man - people
His origin, mortality, suffering, sins, struggle, hopes -
his life + death, the perishable and imperishable -

3). When, .: you add up songs and prayers - even-tide - wiffring

He will conserve his time, his strength, his energies for those activities which enhance, express -

He will want his life to be abundant -

(a) He will look upon his work - whatever it is - as too important - to abuse it, to treat it indifferently, in a slip-shod manner - or to defile it, by deception, or dishonesty, or exalting others.

He will wish his work to be honorable - To do otherwise is to depreciate himself in his own estimation - and to destroy whatever his purpose it may have for Soc. or Ind.

Bec. his work is important - perfection - highest craftsmanship

(b) He will see his work as important beyond the utilitarian - the material is the practical.

An opportunity for spiritual fulfillment - to披 deep walls near to the reality of life - creative goodness, truth & beauty

(c) His neighbor. Crux is that all human life is important - not merely my life.
