History of Congregation Beth El

HE first Jewish settlers came to Steubenville about sixty years ago but it was not until thirty years later that a congregation was formed, which is still in existence. The Jewish community has grown rapidly within the last generation until there are now approximately two hundred families in the city. It was therefore natural for a movement to spring up favoring the establishment of a form of worship which, while retaining the cherished fundamentals of Judaism, would yet give expression to the more modern spirit and outlook and would interpret the ancient faith in the light of American appreciation. This movement, however, did not take concrete form until January, 1922, when Mr. and Mrs. S. L. Orenstein, M. B. Weinstein and Henry Greenberger canvassed the Jewish community and found a definite sentiment for the organization of a progressive Jewish congregation. Accordingly, a meeting was held at the Chamber of Commerce on Sunday, January 22, 1922, with forty people in attendance. Rabbi Hyman A. Iola and Mr. Leo Wolf, of Wheeling, came over for the meeting and assisted in the organization which was effected. The name BETH EL was adopted by the new congregation and the following officers elected: president, Martin Bayersdorfer; vice president, Samuel Reiner; secretary, M. I. Sugarman; treasurer, H. Mirkin; and members of the Board: Mrs. Harry Levinson, Mrs. S. J. Anathan, Mrs. Sam Orenstein, Harold Waxman, Louis K. Friedman, Joseph May, Isaac Brown, M. B. Weinstein and Henry Greenberger. A charter was secured and the congregation started out on its public, corporate existence.

Many enthusiastic meetings followed in rapid succession and by September arrangements had been completed with the Hebrew Union College for the assignment of a student as biweekly rabbi. Mr. Robert Lee Strauss, of Cincinnati, was sent up for the Holy Days, after which Mr. Abraham L. Feinberg continued to occupy the pulpit of Beth El until his ordination in June of this year and his election to a pulpit at Niagara Falls, N. Y. The Holy Day services in 1922 were the first Reformed Jewish devotions to be held in Steubenville. The choral arrangements were taken care of by Mrs. Harry Levinson, Mrs. Pauline Silverman, Mrs. M. M. Lincoff and Miss Rose A. Rothstein.

A Sabbath School was organized, with an enrollment of twenty-five and Jennie Lavine, Eva L. Lavine, Esther Greenberger, Reva Levinson, Rose A. Rothstein and L. M. Wachstein as teachers. The sessions of the school have continued

up to the present time when the enrollment is fifty-eight and there are a supervisor and six teachers on the staff.

THE SECOND YEAR

On April 29, 1923, the first annual congregational dinner was held in the ballroom of the Ft. Steuben Hotel. Harold Waxman, Louis K. Friedman and Henry Greenberger were on the arrangement committee. Mr. Friedman acted as toastmaster. Rabbis Goldenson, of Pittsburgh, Iola, of Wheeling, Feinberg, of Beth El and the presidents of the Wheeling and East Liverpool congregations were honored guests. Just prior to the annual meeting this same committee undertook the task of interviewing the various members of the congregation in person and securing their pledges and subscriptions to a building fund. As a result of this work and of the enthusiasm stimulated at the dinner it was decided that the congregation secure a house of worship of its own and in a short time \$28,990 was pledged. A site committee consisting of Henry Greenberger, lesse E. Cohen, Jacob Needles, Louis K. Friedman and Ralph Levinson was appointed, upon whose recommendation the present location was secured. Then a building committee consisting of Mone Anathan, I. Brown, Louis K. Friedman, Sidney L. Friedman, L. M. Leopold and Samuel Reiner was authorized to proceed with the construction of a suitable edifice and it is this simple but beautiful structure which we are dedicating tonight. Through the devoted efforts of this committee it has been possible to make this Temple more costly in actual value than the limited funds placed at their disposal by the congregation.

During the congregation's second year, with Mr. Feinberg continuing as rabbi, services were held bi-weekly. The religious school met on the Sabbath instead of Sunday morning, with the following teachers: Mrs. S. L. Friedman, Mrs. Stanley Bayersdorfer, Miss Rose A. Rothstein. The Temple Sisterhood which has since played such a significant role in the life and progress of Beth-El came into being during this year under the guidance of Mrs. Harry Levinson, president; Mrs. Jacob Needles, vice president; Mrs. Sidney L. Friedman, secretary and Mrs. Harold Waxman, treasurer. These officers are still at the helm and it is due to their untiring work and the gladsome cooperation of the Sisterhood women that many features of the Temple Building have been made possible. The Sisterhood also pledged itself to further the work of the Religious School and to assist in making it an up-to-date, effective department of the work.

The congregation proper, during this second year, was under the direction of the following officers and Board: Martin

Bayersdorfer, president; Sidney L. Friedman, vice president; Hyman Mirkin, treasurer; Stella Rosenthall, secretary; Mrs. Harry Levinson, Mrs. J. Needles, Mrs. Jesse E. Cohen, Isaac Brown, Louis K. Friedman, Henry Greenberger, L. M. Leopold, Samuel Reiner, Ralph Levinson, Harold Waxman, Mone Anathan, I. Sulzbacher, S. J. Anathan, H. L. May and Ralph B. Cohen.

THIRD YEAR

An event of outstanding importance was the laying of the cornerstone on May 23, 1924, when consecration ceremonies were carried out in a manner that has left its impress upon all those in attendance. Rabbi Goldenson, of Pittsburgh, Pres. Julian Morgenstern, of the Hebrew Union College, Rabbi Iola, of Wheeling, and Rabbi Feinberg were the principals on this occasion, following which there was a congregational dinner at the Ft. Steuben Hotel. Mr. Louis K. Friedman acted as toastmaster and addresses were made by the visiting rabbis and others. This being also the instance of Rabbi Feinberg's departure from Beth-El, he was presented with a gift as a testimonial of appreciation of his fine and loyal service during the two years of his association with the congregation.

The list of officers, trustees and members are noted elsewhere. The next event of significance was the opening of the Temple for divine services on the eve of Rosh Hashannah, Monday, September 29, 1924, with our newly assigned student-rabbi, William Franklin Rosenblum, in charge. The rabbi consecrated the edifice in an opening prayer of impressive simplicity and, although the structure was not complete in all its details, services have been held in unbroken succession. On alternate Friday evenings, when the rabbi is not here, devotions are led by laymen of the congregation. Another important feature this year is that the Religious School is again meeting on Sunday mornings. A Bible class has been organized for Sunday mornings and another has been meeting after services on Friday nights. At this time, also, the Sisterhood is completing plans for an Adult Child Study class, which will be under the leadership of Mrs. David Mendelsohn. A Temple orchestra has been organized by children of the Religious School.

On October 29, the Sisterhood staged a bazaar for the benefit of their congregational fund and about one thousand dollars was cleared. The work of the women was uniformly loval.

Several special services have thus far been held in our Temple. On Sunday evening, October 12th, a special harvest festival, arranged by the rabbi and teachers, was held. The services were read by members of the Confirmation class,

while offerings of fruits were made by each of the classes. The Sisterhood presented the children with boxes of candy. On Sunday evening, November 9, the members of the American Legion and Women's Auxiliary were guests at a service in commemoration of Armistice Day. A congregation that overflowed the Temple was in attendance and the rabbi preached on "THE ARMISTICE ETERNAL," a plea for universal cessation of hatreds and antagonisms. On Friday evening, November 21, members of the Sisterhood assisted the rabbi, this being Sisterhood Sabbath in Steubenville. Mrs. Harry Levinson gave the Sisterhood Talk, while Mrs. Sidney L. Friedman, Mrs. Stanley Bayersdorfer and Mrs. David Mendelsohn read the prayers and responsa.

Finally, the dedication exercises this evening mark the culmination to endeavors, which will always reflect glory upon the Jewish community of Steubenville. It is not because such a statement is conventional but because it is uniquely descriptive that we pay tribute to the manner in which, as the project progressed, the membership of Beth-El rallied to the cause. The membership list at the back hereof can be truly taken as a record of those whose encouragement and whose participation

have made Temple Beth-El a glorious realization.

Upon his grave may the amaranth grow, symbolic of the everlasting good that his life has done and upon his tomb may immortelles be strewn, emblematic of the undying love of the community in which he lived.

Congregation Beth El, to whose cause he devoted himself so earnestly, mourns with deep and sincere grief his passing and extends to his family its reverent sympathy.
