MR. LIPSKY SPEAKS

At the last meeting of Bialik Chapter, held at the Hotel Astor, Mr. Louis Lipsky, honorary President of the Z.O.A. was our guest speaker.

Speaking in a purely informal manner, Mr. Lipsky opened his talk with a brief review of the psychological and national antecedents of Zionism. Stressing the important part Jewish youth will play, he spoke of the future of Zionism, here and abroad, and especially in Palestine; - of the great civilization whose seeds are being planted now. Idealizing and being practical at the same time, he told us of the expected growth of Palestine, of Jewish culture and civilization, which even under the worst hardships, has never failed to increase.

Inviting controversy and argument by the provocative manner of his presentation, he served to stimulate the audience to a good deal of open discussion, a thoroughly enjoyable conclusion to an inspiring speech.

EDITORIAL

Perhaps we might have called this paper the BIALIK BROADSIDE, but rather we have chosen BROADCAST, not because we prefer the sound of "broadcast" but because of a difference in definitions.

A broadside suggests a volley of shots and piercing darts to force and drive you into concerted action; action for the benefit of the Jewish people. This very action, we believe, can be produced by a much gentler, subtler method; namely, through the power of suggestion, not compulsion. A broadcast gives you bare, uncensored facts, to wax eloquent, the "unvarnished truth". That much is within our power. It is up to you to interpret our information, to see what it means to you as an individual and as a member of a group.

To particularize - our pledge of membership in the Bialik Chapter stresses the combat against anti-Semitism. Can we make our organization a potent factor in that battle, or shall we become merely a weakly protesting voice?

Remember, we force nothing upon you, but instead, give something to you, and hopefully, we ask, "WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO DO ABOUT IT?"
