## Purim

The ritual of the Purim feast consists in reading the Book or Scroll of Esther, either in the original or in translation. In ancient days the reading of the narrative was accompanied by unrestricted comments of the congregation, gathered primarily for the purpose of hearing the fascinating story read from the pulpit. The mention of Queen Esther and Mordecai was an occasion for applause, while the trickeries of Haman were ridiculed and reviled by any noisy instrument.

This semi-mirthful treatment of the Biblical story, reflected the triumph of truth and righteousness over tyranny and vile oppression. Then, as is the case even in our day, the Jewish people were beset by opponents and daily their lives were threatened as they were in the story of Esther.
