



Am I a German or a Jewish Writer?

I do not believe anyone capable of drawing distinct lines of demarcation between what is and what is not Jewish. There was a time when I thought I could. Because I was able to read the Jewishness of certain people in their faces, I assumed that I could recognize all people in that fashion. Because from the contents of certain books I concluded beyond peradventure their Jewish authorship, I ventured to contend that I had discovered a universal standard of Jewish physiognomy. I used to attribute Jewish characteristics to authors who knew not a word of Hebrew and who - like Heine - had had only a negligible familiarity with the Bible; in other words, I thought there was a sort of literary anatomy which can be discerned as Jewish. Only upon closer investigation did this conclusion prove to be no less fallacious than Goethe's short and toplofty dictum: "There is something pathetic in things Jewish."

To be sure, there are some Jewish authors who are pathetic, while others are sentimental. But I cannot find much that is pathetic in a work like, say, Karl Marx's "Capital." Similarly difficult would it be to discover anything of pathos or sentimentality in the geometrically constructed "Ethics" of Spinoza.

My own books strive not to be Jewish. They are, it seems to me, neither pathetic nor sentimental. Nor would it be an easy task, even upon subjecting them to the acid test, to ascribe to them anything tendentiously pro-Jewish. I have, for example, not minimized at all the sinister qualities and deeds of the Jew, Josef Oppenheimer; rather I have brought them to light without exaggeration. Have I depicted plausibly the vanity, cupidity, vaingloriousness and unscrupulousness of this Jew? Some say, rather too plausibly. On

the other hand, there are those who maintain that I glorified  
Jew Suss, that I made a hero of him; and it is the very manner in  
which I portray the destiny of the man that stirs the blood of  
Jew-haters.

One of my critics was probably right when he said to me:  
"Of course, you are objective. You are much too astute not to be.  
But, after all is said and done, you are a national Jewish inter-  
nationalist!"

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## Feuchtwanger Sees Jews Playing Leading Role in World's Technical Advance

New York, Sept. 13 (J. T. A.)—The Jews, because they have for centuries been more mobile than other peoples, not being bound to any particular soil, will in the future "take front rank in helping to do the work of construction in a world which has changed from a world of farmers to a world of

machines." On the other hand, the Jews being next to the Chinese the most literary people in the world and having conserved in its books the useful experiences of the white races for thousands of years back, will also in the future "make through the practice of literature, a heavy contribution to the memory of mankind" in an epoch which has less feeling for such matters than formerly.

This is the opinion expressed by Lion Feuchtwanger, famous German Jewish novelist and playwright, in an article entitled "The Trend of the Jews," which appeared in magazine section of yesterday's New York "Herald-Tribune." Speaking of the historical development of the Jews, Mr. Feuchtwanger says:

"Its early history, modeled the Jewish group into representatives of a strange organic blending of Asiatic renunciation and of European thirst for action. It is no accident that the white race's two fundamental books of doing and non-doing—the Old Testament and the New Testament—sprang from the Jewish intellectual spirit."

Of the Jewish role in the world today, Mr. Feuchtwanger says:

"What their enemies formerly reproached them with and condemned as their most contemptible characteristic—their cosmopolitan—their lack of roots in the soil, suddenly discloses itself as an immense superiority. That they were intrigued against for centuries, that they were obliged to adapt themselves always to new men and new conditions, makes them, in a quickly altered time of rapid communications, superior to those who can move only on their own soil. It is consequently their historic mission to take front rank in helping to do the work of construction in a world which has changed from a world of farmers to a world of machines."
