

ACTIVITIES IN PALESTINE

Four hospitals and five dispensaries.
Medical service in fifty rural settlements.
Training School for Nurses.
X-Ray institute.
School and pre-school nursing.
Obstetric service.

Anti-tuberculosis, anti-smallpox.

Meier Shfeyah, a rural school for children, is maintained by Junior Hadassah.
Twenty-one health stations for Infant Welfare.
Pre-natal and post-natal work.
Campaigns against trachoma, typhoid, malaria.
Straus Health Centers, Jerusalem.

ACTIVITIES IN AMERICA

Participation in \$1,000,000 Hebrew University Hospital fund for Palestine.
Cultural groups to study Jewish history, current events, Hebrew and Zionism, and to arrange Jewish holiday celebrations.
Infant Welfare Fund, which raises \$35,000 annually by contribution to "milk bottle bags."
Palestine School Luncheon Fund, which is maintained chiefly by Religious School children. The 1929-1930 budget is \$18,000.
Eight hundred sewing circles, which furnishes linens and garments to the Hadassah Medical Organizations and other organizations.
Provision of scholarships in America for graduates of the Training School for Nurses in Palestine.
Text Book Fund for publication in Hebrew of text books for nurses.
Raising \$500,000 for the Hadassah Medical Health work.
Participation in the United Fund Raising effort—and co-operation with all general Zionist work.
Raising \$70,000 for Jewish National Fund.
Joint Seniors and Juniors effort toward redemption of Haifa Bay Land.

N PALESTINE today, as ever in history, men and women build in their own respective ways. Women nurse infant life into strength and maturity, whispering the while, tales of love and fantasy that take root in the souls of men. The prosaic dollars that we have collected in the drive which concludes today at this Luncheon, will be transformed by the alchemy of our souls into a fountain of strength for our people in Palestine, and the Luncheon in itself, a very usual affair in the life of New York women, will become not a matter of drink and food, but an event of spiritual significance. So, in the name of the New York Chapter of Hadassah, I again greet you and look forward to future occasions when we shall once more assemble to celebrate our growth in the land of our Fathers.

... GREETINGS ...

TO THOSE who have seen us working, working and weary, sometimes harassed, we can say:

You have seen us happy and strong, full of cheer and hope, because the fruit of our daily labor was a day of life for Hadassah in Palestine. Over the pathway hewn by our own efforts, the spirit of Jerusalem poured itself into our souls and brought us its inner quietude and strength.

That is why we are not tired. We are merely in training. We want to go on and on, doing more, doing it better. There is much that we have necessarily left undone. There is much that we could have done better. We can promise earnestly that the experience gained this year will show itself in the years to come through better organization, through elimination of duplicated appeals, through more extensive division of labor. To all those who have been troubled by our shortcomings, we plead that their judgment be tempered by our common love for Palestine and our common dedication to a great cause. We ask them to come to us, teach us and share our burden and our responsibility, and create out of what might be small personal annoyance, new strength.

For those things in which we have not failed, we wish here to express our gratitude. We are thankful for the wholehearted cooperation of Hadassah workers throughout the city. Selflessly, without friction, unremittingly and with joy has each task been done by the workers in every group of Hadassah. With an earnest sense of the difficulty and beauty of that achievement, we recognize it as a manifestation of the spiritual potency of Hadassah. It is a token of the reward immeasurably greater than the service that comes to the laborers in the vineyards of Zion.

We are proud and thankful too for what this year means in the history of Hadassah. It has been a very hard year in Palestine, and hard in America. But it has also been a wonderful year. Tranquil in agony, the people of Palestine have emerged from their great trial undaunted, more determined, more fit and more worthy in their historic role. Hadassah's merciful life-giving service in those dark hours will never be forgotten. The spiritual strength in Eretz Yisrael has its counterpart in the union of all Israel. The struggles of many generations and their dreams have found consummation in that union. It is Hadassah's great pride to be in the vanguard of the united Jewish effort for the restoration of Zion.

Our Hadassah Luncheon this year is a symbol and an expression of that determination. Gratefully we here record Hadassah's recognition of the leadership, steady helpfulness and generosity of the Chairman of the Patronesses Committee, Mrs. Felix M. Warburg. She has shared our work, our burden, our responsibility with a fullness that heartened and strengthened us, and inspired leaders of our people throughout the country to follow her example. All we can say is a heartfelt "Thank you". As Mrs. Warburg has shared our tasks, so she shares our reward, which we each know, humble though our task and achievements may be, is infinitely great.
