## ANNOUNCEMENT OF SERVICES

The speaker for next Sunday, May 22nd, will be Miss Marion Cuthbert, former dean of women at Talladega College. Miss Cuthbert received her education in the University of Minnesota, Boston University, and Columbia University. After having taught at Burrell Normal School, one of the schools under the auspices of the American Missionary Association, she served as principal of this school from 1925-1927, going from there in 1927 to Talladega College to be dean of women. Resigning this position in 1930, Miss Cuthbert accepted the Charles Foster Kent Fellowship given by the National Council on Religion in Higher Education and is studying at Columbia University. Miss Cuthbert has been an active participant in many student movements. In the summer of 1925 she went to Europe as a member of the first Student Pilgrimage conducted by the Y.W.C.A. Since that time she has attended student conferences in various parts of the country, the last most important ones being the Student-Faculty Conference in Detroit in December, 1930, and the first American conference of International Student Service held at Mt. Holyoke College in August, 1931. At both of these conferences Miss Cuthbert was a speaker of unusual charm.
