Oct. 29 - (Saturday) Attend services at Portuguese  
Synagogue of Nice. Rabbi - Schneebeli  
Sephardi - Orthodox - but organ.

Oct. 30. visit Monk Carlo.

Nov. 5. visit Cannes.

● Nov. 6-9 - Marseilles - Start our tour  
of the Provence - A busy, crowded city.  
Visit its markets and old streets.

Nov. 10 - Aix - fascinating Medieval city.  
See the remains, the Roman Theatre  
and Amphitheatre - as well as the

Musée Lapidaire (museum) - other antiquities  
and the beautiful portal of the St. Trophime  
church (12c)

Nov. 10 - Avignon - the most interesting  
city in the Provence. Near famous  
Pont d'Avignon where are still 2 narrow  
clinging streets, undoubtedly, the old Jewish  
quarters of A. named rue Vieille juiverie.  
Nearby is a street called rue de la  
mouette.

There is a small squeezes now in A.  
the interior circular and colonnaded - with  
a dome - probably orig. a church.

Visit the Palais des Papes - now  
being restored. (A. was the only city in  
Fr. from which Jews were never expelled.)

Very charming old streets & courts.

Nov. 11 - Nîmes - a busy city. Saw its  
famous Maison Carrée - one of the  
best preserved Roman Temples in ex-  
istence. (A.D. 1). Inside - an interesting  
collection of antiquities - esp. of old  
coins (saw a few coins - of time of  
Vespasian - Judaea captive)

Also visited the Roman Amphitheatre  
(les Arènes) (1c.). Remarkably well  
preserved - Romans were certainly  
master builders. This amph. as  
well as the one in Arles are frequently  
used for bull fights.

We motored from A.V. to Liroux. On our way there we stopped at the Pont du Gard - an old Roman aqueduct spanning the river Gard - a wonderful sight and an amazing engineering achievement. (1.C. B.C.) This aqueduct was part of a conduit 25 miles long which supplied the city of Nimes with water.

Nov. 12 - Fourvière - famous in medieval history. We took the automous to L. Tramped the old, labyrinthine streets. To-day a very unimportant town. Go on to Montpellier

Nov. 12 - Montpellier - (1232). Visit its Faculté de Médecine - the oldest medical school in Europe. On walls of Salle des Hôtes Hall are Commemorative Tablets carrying names of early Masters & allans of the School of Medicine. Among the names on the marble tablet giving the list of Masters, the first Scholastic Prof., Murt. 11-12 C. I found the name Le Rab Yehoudah ibn Tibbon de Lunel vers 1115

On the tablet, Les Chanoines Juges de l'Université de Montpellier ab Montpellier - I found the name ?

Just been making the Tbilissi, Marneille,<sup>13<sup>00</sup>,  
There are 200-300 Jewish students at M.  
University - mostly from Eastern Europe  
(numerous classes). Met one named  
Mugurter from Lodz, Poland. Lived in  
Hellen - speaking - Spent the evening with  
him at a small Jew. restaurant for students  
and later at a cafe -</sup>

Visit the Peyrou - large terrace with  
gardens - See the Arc de Triomphe (Tower  
~~the~~ <sup>XIV</sup>) as well as equestrian statue of him.

Nov. 13. Béziers - city found in J.  
best. for the massacre of Jews -  
nothing evident there but the  
former Cathedral of St. Nazaire (13-14c)  
which dominates city from top of hill  
in which city is built and overlooks  
the river Orb and the surrounding  
plain. - I go on to

Nov 14. Narbonne, rich in Jew. history  
Has the incompleteness but very  
large and impressive Cathedral of  
St. Just. (13-14c.)

Visit also the Musee and in  
it collections among Gallo-Roman  
antiquities and documents of

Saw 3 Hebrew inscriptions - one evidently  
marking the boundary of part or whole  
of a lot opposite after A.M. 5000.  
Street, N. are very well crowded and  
enriched than the cemeteries. Return to

Nov. 15 - Marseille - Visit a Jew-Algerian  
Hotel Restaurant. This city, as  
well as all others we visited in the  
Province has numerous Boucheries  
Chevaline. They eat horse and mule  
meat.

In most, the cities are "rue de  
la moraine". The Jew quarter  
was probably in the vice versa.

French restaurant "Les Croix de

des Parasitaires by Drs. Saint-Bonnet.  
The slogan of the Reformation - "Pro Tenebris  
Lux". Statues of 4 leading Reformers  
in Geneva - Calvin, Farel, Beze, Knox.

visit the Museum of Art  
Bourse "I do not know the method of  
drawing up an indictment against a  
whole people".

Dec. 6. Attend morning and afternoon sessions of the Assembly of the League called into extraordinary session to take up Sino-Japanese difficulties. Impromptu gathering - Have lunch at Ban-Ho-Ye with Malcolm Wailes - meet Helen Hoy Greeley. The Big Four are holding secret sessions at hotel on this arrangement.

Also the Palazzo dei Conservatori (Spinario = boy extracting thorn from his foot) (The Capitoline Wolf)

Also the Pinacoteca - paintings - Rubens - Velasquez, Veronese, Titian, Tintoretto etc.

In the evening visit the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary "Mostra della Rivoluzione Fascista" large exhibition hall. Features designs - 20 rooms - traces history of Fascism. From 1914 to 1918 the war

and from 1919-1922 the Red Fascism.

Stresses M's role throughout - his founding  
of "Il Popolo d'Italia", urging intervention.

The org. of the former combatants in 1919  
dissolves parties with terms of peace treaties.

Fiume - P.R. & Com. dissolving, country  
in 1920 ff. Spread of Bolshevism - Fascism  
becomes strong anti-Bolshevik party. "Non  
contro il proletariato, ma contro il  
Bolshevismo".

The various episodes culminate in  
the "La Marcia su Roma" Oct. 28-1922.

In first chamber - figure of man  
crushed under load of 5 huge  
stones - ① Karl Marx' ~~the~~ Capital  
② ~~the~~ Works, Angels and Devil ③ Bassad  
④ Class War ⑤ Inflation.

In another sala is huge bloody  
beast = Bolsheviks with an arrow  
piercing it marked "Il Popolo d'Italia"  
<sup>year 1919</sup>

Only when quotations from speeches &  
writings of Mr. numerous portraits -  
his ~~old~~ editorial office of "Il  
Popolo d'Italia". Also huge  
figure of M. holding  
pen and book - called Lux.

March on Rome (painting) - led by M.  
= Savio: m. mother holding up children

Dec. 30. Call on Rabbi Sacerdote in Tempio  
Israeleto. Has been called by  
Grandi at order of M. in re report  
of my speech which appeared in  
Italian papers attacking P. and  
defending democracy.

Dec. 31. V.A. arrives from Nice. Visit Forum  
and St. Peter's. In afternoon go to Baths  
of Caracalla and along Appian Way to  
Catacombs of St. Callixtus.

Jan. 1-3. (Monday). Visit Basilica; St. Paul  
(marked. See baptism of infant son here  
now). Then to S. Giovanni in Laterano.  
(former palace of Pop. - Cloisters.)

Jan. 2: Our tenth Wedding Anniversary.  
Visit American Embassy. See Coenciller.  
Visit Am. Academy ~~of~~ in Rome.  
Go to Jewish catacombs. (found some  
scribblings on tomb stones).  
Visit San Clemente (3 levels)  
Visit Synagogue, impressive building  
wall through old Jewish ghetto.

Jan. 3. Leave 7 A.M. for Naples and Pompei  
Spend day at Pompei and at  
Naples' Museum. Return Rome  
8 P.M.

Jan. 4. Visited Vatican Library. Receive  
permission to work there.  
In afternoon - visit St. Peter's in  
Vatican (Michelangelo's "Moses"). Also  
Parthenon, the most important structure.  
In Rome, St. Peter's not completed.  
In evening. We go to Rome Opera.  
Hear Verdi's "Macbeth". Grandiose,  
some effects. Great formality at  
entrance and ushering.

Jan. 5. Visited the Lateran Museum.  
Saw the room of inscriptions from  
Jew's catacombs of Montecatini.  
Received word place where can  
embassy and Italian Foreign Office  
that Mussolini would grant me  
an audience next Tuesday at 10:30.  
View open-air fair on Piazza  
Navona - the size of Christopher  
Buy books at L. I. Sestini, Via  
del Babuino, 61.

Jan. 6. Slightly indisposed. Stay in-door  
all day. See Va. off to train.

Jan. 7. Go to Synagogue - Re-visit ghetto.  
Read Emil Fuehrer's "Talks with  
Mussolini". Get pair of shoes  
from Attilio Lucattoni, Via Veneto, 20.

Jan. 8. Slight cold.

Jan. 9. - Visit the Roman National Museum  
in the Thermae of Diocletian. "The  
Fedorini Throne" "The Daughters  
of Niobe" "The Fedorini Junes" "The  
Venus of Cyrene" "Head of a Young  
Person" "The Palatine Junes"

Jan. 10. - Meet Thomas B. MacLean, of the United  
Press, & Umberto 184. Also John Evans  
of the Assoc. Press, via Propaganda File.

1933 27. Have a talk with American  
Consul on economic conditions in  
Italy

→ 6:30 P.M. Interview with Munozini  
in Palazzo Venezia. Very cordially re-  
ceived. First exchanged generalities.  
Told him I was going to Russia, M. that  
that I said that I was just come from R.  
His face lit up with eager interest  
of what I had visited Moscow and was  
impressed with artistic effect. Mr. Baroni  
back in great and evident satisfaction.

I asked him what he regarded as  
outstanding achievement of fascism of last  
(its first) decade. M. answered - Agricul-  
tural achievements and Education. i.e.  
national physical and religious educa-  
tion. This led to comments on  
religion in Italy under fascism.

M. dwelt on Tolerance which exists in Italy.  
No anti-semitism. Jewish Community officially  
recognized. Jews prominent in important  
positions. Disgrace of Anholt in part  
result of econ. disorganization. Will occur -  
ever in Germany when econ. conditions will  
be normalized.

I asked him whether central economic  
planning was possible in a democratic like  
the U.S. M. answered - Yes; possibly and necessary.  
Very. Capitalism is ill. Must be nat.  
controlled like army very, very, education,  
no state socialism, but state interven-  
tion where ever necessary Capital &  
labor both must be directed, with  
equal rights to both.

I asked whether a single master mind  
was a prerequisite to achieve this. He  
laughed. Of course. I believe that first  
must come the man, then the institution  
and the people etc.

I asked him about Technocracy.  
Technology, yes! he answered. Technocracy -  
no! Man is more than technology. Man  
is an artistic, patriotic and moral  
being. Tech. is only a section of moral  
life. The whole life of man must be satis-  
fied.

I asked - what shall we do on such  
an occasion. Ideal has fallen on  
evil days. M. answered: Technocracy is not

anti-democratic. This is not our situation. My father was a socialist. But we need a strong democracy of discipline & order.

I asked - Has th world too much or too little of nationalism. I answered - The right kind of Nat. is not opposed to international cooperation.

Had dinner at Regina with Thomas G. Morgan - and left home 7:20 P.M. for Nice.

Jan. 21. Leave Nice for Berlin. Arrive Sunday night 10 P.M. Jan. 22. During the day Hitlerites and Communists had set-to. Nazis marched thru square where Comm lodges are located on way to memorial service for one of their men. Regarded as provocation. Police every where along line of march. Hence no large scale riots. 3 shot. Many arrested. Berliners regarded that as great day.

Jan. 23. - By the cold. Spent most of day indoors reading.

Jan. 24. Met representatives of J.T.O. Gs with him to opening of "Das Judische Museum". Meet many interesting people - Ravindra, Persian artist Isenstein who makes sketches of me, K. Harold Isenstein.

Jan. 25 - Visit "Altes Museum" where Iseustein accompanies me thru the Museum. Remarkable Egyptian collection. - In evening we go to Städtische Oper - where "Die Freischütz" is sung. Mrs. Goldman telephones.

Jan. 26. Saw Dr. J. Williams - of Ch. Sc. Muster v. d. Kindergarten - and his friend discussed German pol. situations. Visited office of J.T.A. - Mr. Leibbrandt Eisengasse 6 - Had afternoon tea there with Mr. W. and his wife. Spoke of World Journal Congress. Visited Hochschule für die Wissen - Schrift des Generalstabs, Artilleriest. 14 Attended 9 P.M. gathering in studio of Iseustein where an interesting group of artists, professors etc. was present.

Jan. 27 - Went to the American Embassy. Spoke with the Secy. who suggested certain people to see. They will give me a letter to get into Reichstag next Tuesday. Saw Mr. Arthur E. Wauking, '67 Secy. of Am. Chamber, Commerce in Germany. He will arrange interview with Curtius. Had lunch with Mr. Goldmann. Spoke of World J. Congress & present affairs. In the afternoon Mr. Frederick Kuh, correspondent of the United Press of

America, U. S. Linden 17, 18. Gave me a picture of present very confused status of German politics, according to the leaders. Spoke at great length of Hitler. His power recently increased. Is very popular with masses. Will "cut hedge" or retreat on his Anti-Semitic program. Would be forced if one in power, to carry out anti-Jew. action, violence not excluded. "Freedom of Streets for 3 days." - "All Angriff" is now again carrying on violent Anti-Semitic agitation.

Jan. 28 - 1933. Am 40 years old to-day. I begin life's last stage. Went to New Synagogue # 30 Oranienburgstr. this morning. Dr. Warshausen preached on N.T. 26:11, 13, 15.  
Heard Bar Mitzvah boy read the Hafotah which I read 27 years ago on the Sabbath of my Bar Mitzvah... How much water has passed under the bridge! -

Jan. 29 - Visited Alte National Museum, Pergamon Museum and Kaiser Friedrich Museum. The frieze of the Pergamon Altar is a vast Gigantomachy - the struggle bet. heat-gods and man-gods.

In the afternoon large Socialist open-air demonstration <sup>at the</sup> Lustgarten, bet. Schloss and Alter Museum. 100,000. Uniformed men, young & old, in professor

"die Fasching Front"

"Front, banners, a gun-less army." Berlin  
bleibt rot! Speakers. Police every where  
on foot, horse, bicycle, trucks, on roofs  
steps of surrounding public bldgs. Man  
uncovered and sings "Internationale". Speaker  
Franz Karsch, strenze "Orthodox" scolds.

Jan. 30 - Hitler was to-day made Chancellor  
of Germany. Cabinet of Harzburg Front.  
Saw Foreigner of Associated Press in re  
getting statement of new govt on Jewish  
policy. He volunteered to see Hausstaat  
- chief of Hitler's Foreign Press Bureau.  
Also Frank, press chief of new cabinet  
(arrested anti-semitic).

At 7:30 P.M. huge Torch-light procession  
of Nazis and Steel helmets from Branden-  
burger Tor thru Wilhelmstrasse.

Heavily Policed - uniforms, flags w/  
swastika, bands, songs. Box collectors  
(pushers). Town is displaying few  
flags all the "Wer Angriß" called for  
them "Deutsches Berlin: Fabius  
heraus!"

Late in evening attended meeting  
arranged by the "Jüdisch-liberalen  
Zentrum" in the Cafe Leon.

400-500 present. Chairman Mr. Martin  
Lerner. Jewish editors & writers  
are speakers. Among them Julius  
Bach, author; Geo. Goetz, editor

of J.H.G.; etc. Mood of gathering far from  
one of nervousness or depression. Speakers  
emphasize comp. duty, pride, past achievements  
and hope for future. Prof. Julius  
Bach. German Jews seem to be facing their  
problems intelligently.

The Jews to be a bi-annual celebrators  
this evening. For some reason it did not  
take place. [Mentioned just now - I fear of risk.]

Jan. 31 - Berlin is quiet. - Last night  
one isolated set-to but S.G. and Corcoran  
met in which one German son S.G.  
killed. To-day small set-to in front  
of University and the Stock Exchange -  
of protest <sup>against</sup> attacking some Jewish  
students <sup>throwing them out, threatening</sup> and calling <sup>them</sup> Juden <sup>Verdammte</sup> b.  
for forces.

Visited the Hochschule für die Wissenschaft  
des Judentums. Met Mr. Guttmann and  
Mr. Tocqueville.

Spoke and addressed the American  
Chaplain of Corcoran which met 1<sup>st</sup> M.  
at Kren & Hinske, 25 Leibnizstr.

Had dinner with Mr. Goldmann and  
went to Theatre am Westen - Play = "Kom-  
parative"

Feb. 1 - Spoke with Louis P. Lockner of A.P.  
Suggests that I write to Mr. Ernst

Hausstaengl, Hotel Kaiserhof, in rechts.  
View - which I did. Representative of  
Jewish paper called and interviewed  
me.

Had dinner at <sup>my</sup> Helper's home,  
Lietzenburgerstr. 17. - After dinner was.

Solowitch and Goldmann came. Mr. Landau  
of <sup>the</sup> <sup>new</sup> <sup>perhaps</sup> was also at dinner. Discussed  
the new political situation in Germany.  
The Reichstag was dissolved today by  
Fob. ordering Pres. Hindenburg and new elections  
called for March 5<sup>th</sup>.







# DICTATORSHIP TALK VOGUE LIKE YO-YO, HERRIOT ASSERTS

A reporter for the "Petit Journal" yesterday asked Edouard Herriot, former premier, whether or not he feels France needs a dictator. M. Herriot replied: "No."

Politicians of the Right, he believes, are trying to exploit uneasiness, which the former premier asserts is imaginary. "There is no relation between the political agitation and the economic difficulties," he pointed out.

"Conversation about a dictatorship is having a vogue. It has replaced yo-yo and people were tiring of yo-yo, if I am not mistaken.

"I only see a dictator as a pose for persons who need to get back in the good graces of their concierge. I happily, have no need of that. My concierge is a Republican.

"In 1913 we were told the Republic was incapable of organizing for war. Today we are told the Republic is not capable of arranging peace.

"Happily for us—I repeat 'happily'—during the war we had parliamentary institutions. It was the spirit of liberty which won for us.

"The serious side of the question is that the few persons who speculate on the idea overlook that with a dictatorship like the one of Napoleon III there would be war in isolation.

"It was the same policy which lost us in 1870. We have had enough of a Napoleon III; and we do not want a Napoleon IV."
