ABSTRACT OF ADDRESS DELIVERED BY DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER
OF CLEVELAND, OHIO

The Jewish people will take care of their brethren who have been economically broken and impoverished by the Hitler regime in Germany and will also care for the tens of thousands who have been compelled to seek refuge in exile. This is a simple elementary responsibility which no Jew will wish to shirk. We will give our unfortunate brothers the sustaining confidence that they have not been forgotten. Our fellow Jews the world over will help them in their hour of tribulation. Their day of redemption from the brutal tyranny of the Nazi regime is bound to come and until that day comes they will be helped to maintain themselves economically and spiritually.

If you ask me what is the best method of checking anti-Semitism in this country I would say that it is through fighting incessantly, strenuously, relentlessly, each man in his sphere of influence, for the basic principles upon which our American government stands.

When these go under it will not be the Jew alone who will suffer. Remember that! It isn't merely 600,000 Jews in Germany who are being degraded. It is 65,000,000 Germans who are being degraded. Their educational system which was the pride of Germany has been regimented to such a degree that in a few years there will not be a foreign student who will wish to visit a German university. Their intellectual life has been shackled. Woman has been driven back to the Middle Ages. The labor movement has been crushed under the iron heel and by the mailed fist. Don't think for a moment that Jews are the only people in German concentration camps! Jews suffer along with the rest of the German people. The whole country has been defeated. When that country is saved, when it is permitted to express itself again through its best minds and not through its worst, the Jewish group too will be restored to the position of equality and worth which it occupied before.

Hitler has not written the last chapter of Jewish history in Germany. The Jews have lived in Germany for a thousand years. They endured the Crusades! Do you know the story of the Crusades as they affected the German Jews? Read it. What is happening in Germany today is nothing compared to that. Jews lived in Germany during the Black Plague, during the riots and the massacres. They lived there in the most miserable ghettos of Europe. Yet they endured!

Do you think that such a people is going to be licked by one year of Hitler? Goering a year ago said that he had wiped out the communists in Germany. Today he is saying that next year he is going to wipe them out. Hitler similarly declared that he has liquidated the Jewish question in Germany. He now knows that he has liquidated nothing but the world's good will.

I say to you my people: Go into the struggle with your eyes open and your courage high. You are fighting not for Jewish interests alone but for those indispensable rights which are vital to Jew and non-Jew alike. In this struggle you will have the help of all those who still believe in liberalism and cherish democracy and peace and good will and tolerance.

Patience, stoic patience, fortitude -- as becomes a great and old people, that is possessed of ancient wisdom -- and confidence in our future should be our spiritual weapons in this crisis. The future belongs, my friends, not to Naziism but to Democracy. The future belongs not militarism but to peace. The future belongs to tolerance, to good will, to freedom, to justice, to the rights of men. Don't be stampeded by what has happened in this age. Especially young you, my friends, don't be frightened by what your elders are saying. ~~your elders are a shellshocked generation.~~ Don't be swept off your feet by the intellectual and spiritual aberrations that are now sweeping over the world. They shall not abide. Fight for the enduring, precious ideals of mankind.

Cooperate with every movement that makes for social righteousness, for economic justice, for freedom, for tolerance, for religious and racial good will. Fight hopefully and fight aggressively. Don't waste your energies upon apologetics.

The world situation makes the upbuilding of Palestine an even more imperative and urgent task than ever before. We always envisaged Palestine as a haven of refuge for our persecuted brethren but we never imagined that it would come to pass so quickly on so large a scale, and of all people, for Jews of Western Europe where freedom and equality had to all appearances been ^{so} permanently established. Palestine is already one of the important Jewish centers in the world, and if the present rate of immigration is maintained it is destined to become in a few short years even numerically one of the largest Jewish communities in the world.

Palestine, however, will have to extend its boundaries beyond the Jordan properly to support a much larger Jewish population without creating abnormal and unsafe economic conditions within the country.

The remarkable tempo of Palestine's progress, the great influx of new settlers and the still larger incoming wave make it imperative to revise the territorial limitations under which Palestine has been developing until now. The frontiers of Palestine must be extended and restored to the original borders contemplated by the Mandate. The country must no longer remain cleft in twain, one half open to Jewish settlement, and the other half closed. Trans-Jordania, which is twice the size of Palestine, with but one-third of Palestine's population, must open its gates for Jewish settlement.

The opening of the doors of Trans-Jordania, whose separation from Palestine is a political fiction, will ease the strain in Palestine, will relieve the tension of the immigration problem and will check the land speculation

which threatens not only the prosperity of the country but the whole social program of the Zionist movement. It will open up new territory for colonization and productive enterprise which will increase the prosperity of the whole country, for the benefit of both Jews and Arabs.

The major political efforts of the Zionist movement at this time should be directed towards winning the cooperation of the Mandatory Power and of the leaders of the Trans-Jordanian Arabs for the opening up of Trans-Jordania.

Mr. Silberman's presentation of the Rabbi as toastmaster and Mr. Cohen's beautiful response to his guests in which he graciously and gallantly paid tribute to his wife - all this will be long remembered by the hundreds who were gathered together in our Community Center auditorium.

The committee announced that almost four thousand dollars had been turned over in cash to the United Jewish Appeal.
