

HISTORY OF THE CLEVELAND POST OFFICE

While this territory was first settled in 1796, no regular mail route was established in the Western Reserve until 1801. In 1801 a mail route extended from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, to Warren, Ohio, via Youngstown. For a period of two years a fortnightly mail was carried, mostly on foot. This route was extended in 1803 to Cleveland, via Ravenna and Hudson.

The roads at that time were largely Indian trails through dense forests and over rivers and streams which had to be forded. The forests were full of wolves, bears and other wild animals. It took several weeks to bring news from New York to Cleveland.

In 1805, Elisha Norton was appointed the first Postmaster of Cleveland, Ohio, by Gideon Granger, Postmaster General. Norton remained in office only a short time and was succeeded by John Walworth. Walworth held the office of Postmaster until 1812. During his time as Postmaster, he also held positions of Justice of the Peace, Collector for the District of Erie, Inspector of Revenue for the Port of Cuyahoga, Clerk of Court, and County Recorder, also Associate Judge of the Court of Common Pleas. Although holding most of these positions at the same time, it is recorded that the business of each was so small that he did not neglect any of them. Postal receipts for the first quarter of 1806 were \$2.83.

After the War of 1812 mail was carried on horseback during good weather and on foot in bad weather, by two sons of Joseph Burke. This method of carrying the mail continued until 1820 when it was carried by stage-coach. "Post-haste mail" carried by relay riders in 1812, made the distance from Washington, D. C., to Cleveland in one week.

The first Post Office was located in an upper part of a frame building on the north side of Superior Street near

Water Street. It was later moved to a small frame office on the south side of Superior Street where the American House stood. A Government building was completed on the Public Square in 1860 on the site of the present Federal Building. The cornerstone for the present Federal Building was laid on May 20, 1905. During the time that this building was under construction, the Post Office and other Government activities were housed in the Wiltshire Building on the north side of Superior Avenue between West 3rd and West 6th Streets.

In 1863, Joseph William Briggs conceived the city delivery system and acted as the first letter-carrier in the city. There is a tablet of bronze to his honor, designed by the Ohio Society of New York, and presented to the Cleveland Post Office and the Cleveland public. This tablet was installed and unveiled in honor of Mr. Briggs, on December 9, 1921, and hangs on the south wall of the main lobby of the present Federal Building. Mr. Briggs was called the author of the present nation-wide free city delivery and collection system.

Contrast the volume of mail of the first Post Office with receipts of \$2.83 for the first quarter of 1806, with receipts of \$461,854.63 for the year 1890; and also with those of the year 1929 of \$10,122,212.97, the largest in the history of the Cleveland Post Office. This contrast is further enlarged when one considers that Mr. Walworth not only conducted the Post Office by himself, but also conducted numerous other duties at the same time, and now twenty-two hundred employees give their entire time to the mail service of Cleveland and community.

Carrying of mail by aeroplane was established in May, 1919. Today, mail can be carried in volume and with regularity, from Cleveland to Washington, D. C., by plane in three hours, over a distance which took seven days in 1812, by relay riders.
