Mr. Fifield had 8000 people at his Easter service in the Grand Rapids Civic Auditorium and also has a wide radio hearing. He is a graduate and now on the Board of Directors of the Chicago Theological Seminary, also a trustee of Olivet College.

PROFESSOR ARTHUR H. COMPTON, of the University of Chicago, "The Quest of the Cosmic Ray." This will be illustrated by appropriate physical apparatus. This is designed to be our "Young Peoples Evening," and members are urged to bring their children or young friends of High School or College age.

MONDAY EVENING, JANUARY 15

MR. WILLIAM LOVELL FINLEY, naturalist and photographer of birds and animals. A lecture illustrated with motion pictures on "The Adventures of a Naturalist in Alaska." Mr. Finley is an old college friend of Dr. and Mrs. Palmer at the University of California.

MONDAY EVENING, FEBRUARY 19

PROFESSOR PAUL DOUGLAS—"The Significance of the National Recovery Act." We really asked Prof. Douglas to speak on "Is the Blue Eagle Headed Toward Socialism or Facism?" He has stated the theme more conservatively, but perhaps he will answer the question anyway. He has great art and wisdom in combining religion and psychology in the solution of the problem of practical life.
