



TEACHER-PARENT ORGANIZATION

The Teacher-Parent Organization, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Morris S. Arnoff, has launched its first year program with an enthusiastic response. Mrs. Sam H. Goldman, secretary-treasurer, and Mrs. Benjamin B. Levy, chairman of the Membership Committee, report that 280 families have already enrolled in the T. P. O. With this excellent showing, plans for future educational activities are rapidly going forward.

The first Open House of the Religious School held under T. P. O. auspices on Sunday morning, February 16, 1936, was attended by approximately one hundred fathers and mothers of children enrolled in the Religious School Elementary Department. Our visitors sat in the classrooms with their children to observe at first hand the operations of the school.

T. P. O. parties for rooms achieving highest percentage of parents enrolled as T. P. O. members were held on Sunday morning, February 23, for the IA Class of Mrs. Eisenberg and Miss Moritz, the IIIA Class of Miss Ulevitch and Miss Goldberg, the IB Class of Miss Pearl Lieberman and Miss Faigin, and the IVB Class of Miss Goldberg and Miss Pearl Lieberman.

A large and enthusiastic crowd braved

the weather to hear Mr. A. L. Bittikofer on the latest innovation in child character training, "Human Engineering," on February 19. The speaker was introduced to our audience by Mrs. J. Goodsteen, chairman of the Program Committee. A short business meeting preceding the talk was climaxed by the announcement that "Yamelkas" were being presented by the T. P. O. to every boy in the Religious School for Synagogue worship. The musical program featuring the first public appearance of the newly organized Religious School Orchestra, under the direction of Mr. Harry Gold, presented a promising ten-piece group which is expected to add instrumental music to Sunday School Assemblies regularly in the future.

On Wednesday evening, March 11, a meeting of the teachers of the first three grades with the parents of children in the Elementary Department will be held in the Alumni Room at 8:00 p.m.

The success of the first Open House has induced the T. P. O. to sponsor a second Open House for the Intermediate Department, including the 4th, 5th, and 6th grades. Parents of children in these grades are invited to join with their children in attending their classes and meetings on Sunday morning, March 15, at 9:30 p. m.

A Message from the Rabbi Another Purim

T HE approach of another Purim, occurring Saturday evening, March 7, brings pangs of remorse to the realistic observer of the trend of Jewish life in America. For in few synagogues of our land shall we find happy throngs of Jews-hundreds of children who have come to recall a happy escape of the Jews of Persia from the oppressing hand of their Anti-Semitic Chancellor. In our mind's eye, we can picture the huge synagogues of America empty and still, sadly quiet because only a handful of old men and women and a few children will be found in themonly a few who still have the desire or understand the importance of preserving a Jewish holiday. The approach of Purim brings pangs of remorse because we know that Purim is not the only deserted form of Jewish life. What of the Sabbath? What of Passover and Shavuoth and what of Succoth? Fewer and fewer are those who return each year to recall the great historical episodes which the holidays commemorate and to derive therefrom teaching and inspiration for the future conduct of Jewish life.

The remorse gradually converts itself into bitterness, for, in direct proportion as our eyes behold the decline of Jewish forms, our ears hear the increasing crescendo of the babble about "Jewish problems," "programs in Jewish life," "organization," etc., ad nauseam. The less we seem to live like Jews, the more we seem to "talk Judaism."

But of what avail is bitterness? An embittered leader must be ineffective. Rather let exhortation be the clarion call to action! Let us then, as a great Congregation, act to revive this Purim as the first step in the revival of the inspiring traditional forms of Jewish living. Would you live the "Judaism" you talk about? Begin by attending the beautiful Purim Festival of our Congregation. We shall assemble on Saturday evening, March 7, in our Synagogue, parents and children alike, at 6:45. Let the prayers of the Mariv service rekindle the glow in dreary Jewish hearts! Let the Purim melodies of Cantor and Choir waken us to a warmer Jewish life! Let the Purim story give us new hope and faith that a kind Providence will again redeem us from Hitler as from Haman!
