# SOME IMPORTANT DATES IN CLEVELAND JEWISH HISTORY

- 1837—Simson Thorman, first Jewish settler, arrived in Cleveland.
- 1839—Samson Hoffman brought the first Jewish family to the city.
- 1839—The Israelitische Society, first Jewish congregation, was formed.
- 1840-First Jewish cemetery purchased, on Willet Street.
- 1846—The Eagle Street Temple, first Jewish synagogue, was built.
- 1850—Formal Jewish education begun by Tifereth Israel Congregation.
- 1853—First B'nai B'rith Lodge organized.
- 1857—First Jewish social service agency established, Hebrew Relief Association.
- 1868—Jewish Orphan Home established.
- 1888—Hebrew Observer, first Jewish newspaper, established.
- 1895—Council of Jewish Women organized.
- 1903—Jewish Welfare Federation formed.
- 1904—National Zionist Conference held in Cleveland.
- 1923—Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations formed.
- 1924—Bureau of Jewish Education established.
- 1926—Hebrew Cultural Gardens created.
- 1931—Jewish Welfare Fund formed.
- 1935—Jewish Community Council organized.
