L-Yesterday there was laid to rest the noblest figure among ^{the age} the statesmen, the world
- T.M. - the man who turned paper tally as all the post-hocery, except
the man who dwarfed by his sp. + intell. stature. The men who controlled the
destinies of nations during & after the World War -

A whole world seems to pay tribute to this man, who by sheer
integrity, character and by ^{his purpose} devotion to an ideal, carried out a nation
not ^{of} a commanding Empire, forward its institutions and laws, and
set it upon the high Road of Progress. His devotion to the cause, the
liberation, his people remained constant under every form of pol. pressure
and persecution. He fed the movement for the Std. of his people with his
mind, and heart, his enthusiasm and his sacrifices - until the great day
arrived - when his life's ~~last~~ labor was rewarded. To-day Chernovitz
a great, free nation, an island of stability in a th. world, a sea of
pol. chaos. There it lies in the path of all pol. invaders. And
it wraps the stones of T. Nagy - ^{art &c.} stands secure, firm
upon the foundations laid down for it by T.M. upheld by the unselfing
friends of his vision and his wife ~~Hannah~~ architectress.

Who, once having seen him, could ever forget the tall, erect, inflexible
figure, the man who caused himself to peacefully enter old age,
whose eye was not dimmed nor his intellectual powers abated 't the

were many, for he loved to surround himself with youth and to train
them for leadership - he appeared as a prophet of exalted faith & morality -
holding & truly & fearlessly to his vision of freedom, democracy
and brotherhood. He saw the rising tide of class warfare, of nat.
chauvinism, of racial hate and of militarism sweep this ample
fellowship ^{of the} moral collapse ~~after~~ / ^{just} peace after the war.

He, M. was at moral, an overwhelm'd, overawed - by the Nazis &c. he
is tor'd, fast terminat'd, w/ his faith, that all freedom were freedom, W. Men
wh - equally true of - public men & men seen th world - as
a thunderbolt to Hitlerism - or fascism - or tyranny - or death itself.
