An essential service to the workers of Ohio is being jeopardized by the failure of the Legislature to vote the necessary funds to keep open the offices of the Ohio State Employment Service. This Service, one of the finest in the country, and the first to be established, has found jobs annually for tens of thousands of people, who are unable to go to private employment agencies and pay the required fee for the service. Especially in view of the operations of the State Unemployment Insurance Law which begin in 1939, and which will make necessary the registry of all the insured unemployed with some public employment office, it is important to keep the Ohio State Employment Service, equipped as it is with proper records, personnel and machinery, going. We earnestly hope that the Legislature will see the wisdom and need for making the proper appropriations to save this valuable agency for the State of Ohio and for its working people.
