

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, re-elected National Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal in January, has now been elevated to a new honor and responsibility, — National Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal—the newly-formed union of all fund-raising agencies for Refugees and Overseas Needs both in Europe and Palestine.

In France during the World War, **Dr. Silver** received a decoration from the French government. He has served as university preacher at Harvard, Cornell, Syracuse, Purdue, and the University of Chicago.

"ANOTHER SELLOUT"

(A leading editorial in the Chicago Daily News of Monday, March 9, 4930)

"As to Great Britain's readiness to jettison her solemn obligations to the Jews of Palestine in pursuance of the suicidal "appeasement policy," the world's worst suspicions seem now to have been fully confirmed.

"... What is called for is a stiff formal protest (by our government). The Balfour Declaration, as cannot too emphatically be reiterated, is not a purely British concern. This pledge, assuring Jews of all nations a safe refuge from bigotry and persecution, was set up with the full co-operation and assent of the United States govern-

ment. Our moral obligation to see that it is in no wise abrogated is no less imperative than that of the British."

WORLD JEWRY WARNS BRITAIN

Typical of the determination of the Yishub to resist any attempt to impose a minority status upon them is the resolution of the Histadruth at Jerusalem, warning that "We shall not yield, nor shall we accept any plan designed to stifle us. We shall continue to enter Palestine, and with all the forces at our command we shall frustrate every attempt at Arab domination."

American Jewry, too, has courageously declared: "British statesmen should think carefully before they rob the last hope of millions slowly being driven to desperation. The Jews of America, aided by the sympathetic in-

terest of their fellow - American non-Jews, will resist with every means at their command such intolerable injustice."
