PERRY'S VICTORY PARADE

Head of Column—North side of Euclid at E. 21st St.
Route—West on Euclid to Public Square, north at Williamson Building to Superior, east to E. 6th St., north on E. 6th to disbanding points.

Reviewing Stand—North side of Superior between Public Library and Plain Dealer Bldg.

COLUMN IN DETAIL

Police Detail—North side of Euclid between 18th and 19th Sts. S. A. R.—Spirit of 1776.

U. S. Naval Reserves—Escort to Grand Marshal—between 19th and 20th Sts.

Grand Marshal and Staff (Lt. Com. C. D. Finn; John A. Bummhardt, Parade Chairman; Com. Frederick G. Robinson, Chief of Staff)—North sidewalk between 20th and 21st Sts.

FIRST DIVISION

Brig. Gen. L. S. Connelly, Marshal

All military units in order of rank—North side of Euclid, right resting at E. 21st St. heading west.

SECOND DIVISION—VETERANS

Walter K. Patterson, Marshal

G. A. R. and affiliated organizations—North side of Euclid at E. 24th St.

U. S. W. V. and Auxiliaries—North side of Euclid at 2600. Follow G. A. R.

V. F. W. and Auxiliaries—Form on E. 24th St. heading south—right at Euclid Ave.

D. A. V. and Auxiliaries, American Legion and Auxiliaries—Form on E. 21st heading south. right resting at Euclid Ave.

Jewish War Veterans, Army and Navy Union, Polish Legion of American Veterans, Canadian Legion, Italian Veterans, and Auxiliaries of these units will form on the south side of Chester Ave. in order named, the right resting at E. 21st St. heading west, and will follow the American Legion up 21st St.
