Head of Column-North side of Euclid at E. 21st St.

Route—West on Euclid to Public Square, north at Williamson Building to Superior, east to E. 6th St., north on E. 6th to disbanding points.

Reviewing Stand—North side of Superior between Public Library and Plain Dealer Bldg.

Police Detail-North side of Euclid between 18th and 19th Sts. S. A. R.—Spirit of 1776. U. S. Naval Reserves—Escort to Grand Marshal—

U. S. W. V. and Auxiliaries—North side of Euclid at 2600. Follow G. A. R.
V. F. W. and Auxiliaries—Form on E. 24th St. head-

D. A. V. and Auxiliaries, American Legion and Auxiliaries—Form on E. 21st heading south. right resting at Euclid Ave.
