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National Conference for Palestine, 1939.

my dear friends:

The annual conference of the United Palestine Appeal is now in session here in the city of Washington. Hundreds of delegates from all parts of the country have assembled to consider the grave problem of Jewish refugees and how Palestine may serve as a haven for many of them.

For more than half a century now Jews have been pioneering and building in Palestine at the behest of a great historic necessity - now made doubly imperative - to reconstruct their national life in their national home. For many centuries the Jewish people, as such, has been without a national center and a normal national existence, though many Jews as individuals have found homes in ~~many~~ parts of the world where they are enjoying the privileges and sharing in the responsibilities of loyal citizenship along with the rest of the population. The lack of a national homeland and national status, such as all other peoples possess, has tragically disadvantaged the Jewish people throughout the centuries of their dispersion. Everywhere a minority, Jews have frequently shared the fate of all minorities, which is to be saddled with the guilt for whatever misfortune befalls the majority. Lacking a voice in the councils of nations and possessed of no fatherland to champion their cause, the plight of the Jewish minority was oftentimes far more desperate than that of any other ~~minority~~. Thus the hope and desire to rebuild their national life in Palestine and to put an end to their national exile, have always been very strong and ~~active~~ among Jews.

Little, however, could be done to achieve these ends through the long centuries of persecution. Towards the close of the last century, however, under the compulsion of events in Western Europe which clearly demonstrated the hopelessness of finding a solution for Jewish disabilities and discriminations as long as the Jewish people remained nationally homeless, and under the impulse of inspired leadership, the work of rebuilding Palestine as ~~the national homeland~~ began in earnest. The story of that work, carried on under the most difficult and discouraging conditions, in a land which had been neglected for centuries

and which had become the prey of waste, ruin, disease and unspeakable poverty, constitutes one of the truly noble epics of modern times, a matchless saga of physical courage and spiritual vision.

In 1917, during the World War, the Balfour Declaration was issued by Great Britain. This placed the official seal of approval of that great empire upon the labor and aspirations of these nation builders in Palestine, and proclaimed to the world that Great Britain looked with favor upon the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people. At the conclusion of the World War the mandate over Palestine was awarded to Great Britain by the League of Nations and, by its terms, Great Britain pledged itself to carry out the letter and spirit of the Balfour Declaration and to assist in the upbuilding of the Jewish homeland by facilitating Jewish immigration into Palestine and the close settlement of the Jews upon the soil.

The last five years have again demonstrated ~~and~~ even more forcibly the indispensability of Palestine in Jewish life and vindicated anew the vision and the sacrifices of the pioneers who opened up the land for settlement. As civilization in Europe began its plunge downward into darkness and chaos, with the rise of the Nazis to power, the plight of the Jewish people in Central and Eastern Europe became increasingly more desperate and tragic. The ghastly story of the Jews in Germany is too well known and too fresh in the ~~public~~ mind to need recounting. That great community, so rich in history, culture and achievements, ~~among whom the dream of a free, creative and tolerant humanity, was most ardently cherished,~~ lies utterly shattered today, and hundreds of thousands of German Jews, broken, stripped and impoverished, are scattering all over the world as exiles, seeking new havens ^{in which} ~~to begin life all over again.~~ Should the plague of diseased ideas, whose focal point of infection is Nazi Germany, spread to the neighboring countries which, since Munich, have come under its ideology ~~in the wake of~~ ^{as well as} its political and economic influence, many other Jewish communities might share a

similar fate.

Whither these refugees are to go has been the grave concern of many *earnest* and sympathetic minds. Our own government, through its great, humanitarian President, has taken commendable initiative by convoking an international conference to discuss this tragic problem. Suggestions have been made for the settlement of many of these refugees as colonists in new territories to be opened up to them in Tanganyika, British Guiana and elsewhere.


These proposals may be found to have merit, but for the immediate future they offer little prospect for any large-scale settlement. Palestine alone offers such a prospect. Palestine is prepared today, because of the preparatory pioneer-
already done ing work, and the labor and capital already invested in it, to absorb 100,000 Jewish settlers immediately and tens of thousands more annually thereafter. There is no longer any need for preliminary and prolonged surveys ~~studies~~, for the initial, costly and difficult work of clearing jungles or draining marshes or constructing roads or bringing into existence the health and educational facilities which a large-scale immigration requires. All this has already been done. The country is already prepared to receive immigrants in large numbers. In the last five years Palestine absorbed nearly a quarter of a million new settlers - half of the total world Jewish immigration.

A ^{free} policy on the part of Great Britain favoring a free and unrestricted admission of Jewish refugees into Palestine, in view of the unprecedented disasters which have overtaken large Jewish communities in Europe and which threaten to engulf many others, will be welcomed and applauded by all the fair-minded governments of the world. Such a policy would be predicated not only on obligations freely and publicly assumed by Great Britain under the terms of the Balfour Declaration and the mandate, but also on the even stronger moral basis - the emergency which confronts hundreds of thousands of helpless human beings and the mandates of humanity and justice. The intransigence of Arab political extremism which has been fostered in recent years ^{by} totalitarian governments, as hostile to Great Britain as to the

Jews, should not be permitted to stand in the way of this great human service of rescue and salvation, especially since the coming of Jews into Palestine has been shown to bring increased prosperity and well being to the Arabs.

It is unbelievable that at a time when some nations, like the United States, which have serious unemployment problems of their own, are willing out of sympathy and human compassion to admit a substantial number of ~~these~~ refugees, these exiles' way of refuge to the Jewish homeland should be barred by Great Britain, which undertook to facilitate Jewish immigration into it and proclaimed that Jews may come to Palestine as of right and not on sufferance.

The Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees, all well-intentioned governments and public opinion throughout the world should concentrate on this task of ~~urgency~~
~~and humanity~~
bringing moral pressure on Great Britain to do its clear duty, and ~~to~~ open wide the doors of Palestine to receive these refugees who are fleeing from persecution and terror.



To the everlasting credit of this sorely-tried generation of Jews be it said, that in spite of the tragedies which were piled up upon it, Ossa on Pelion, in spite of the frightful disruption of numerous old centers of Jewish life, in spite of the impoverishment, exhaustion and persecutions which made of the whole household of Israel one vast hostelry of pain, it nevertheless was able to find within itself the energy, the courage and the resources to build in Palestine in twenty short years a new and resplendent center of Jewish life, already the fifth largest Jewish center in the world, and first and foremost in the richness and vitality of its intrinsic Jewish spirit and culture. Here in Palestine a new and powerful bulwark for the survival of the Jew and of Judaism has been established, as great and as rich in promise, and to be sure, under as great difficulties, as in the days of Ezra and Nehemiah. Regardless of any future developments, something great and heartening and re-assuring has already been achieved there.

And much more will be achieved in the days to come. The Jewish people has set its hand to the task and will not desist until it will have achieved that for which our people has yearned and hoped through the ages - a free and independent Jewish life in its own home.
