// Round-Table - ~~Egypt~~ - wanted it for many years - ~~interfered~~ ~~refused~~ to rule - "divisa et impera." - ~~Intermediary~~ - Improvising from time to time as pressure was applied by one group or the other.

① Early determined not to carry out Mandate - ~~Russia~~ - same in 1920 as in 1939. = Imperial interests.
She did not wish to organize Arab world.
She issued B. Dec. - under stress of War needs - Lloyd George - Good will of Jews - large sections pro-German bee.
of Russia -

After War - ~~excuse~~ for claiming mandate over Pal.
Since then J. good will + cooperation are not as important as Arab.

Especc. since new Med Imperialism of Italy -

Muss. - ^{status in Syria} ~~Round Table~~ Journal of Islam "Mare Nostrum".

J. B. must win favor of Arab world to offset M's overtures.

It is to interest of Berlin-Rome Axis - to cause trouble both in Br. and French possession in Med.

Tunisia - Corsica - Italian demands - Embarrass them.

^{Troops in Syria -} Arab terrorists in Pal. + Syria - armed, financed and incited by Rome & Berlin.

It has been the policy for years to reward Arab terror.

Since Munich - "Appeasement" policy - dogma -

Br Govt. would like to ease up pressure on her imperial lines by sacrificing the Jew homeland

to Arabs - as Sudetenland to Germany.

(Simplify) the whole problem by scrapping Mandate and refurbishing Balf. Dec.

2). But this is not quite as easy as it seems.

There are close to 500,000 Jews in Pal - who can in the long run ~~veto~~ wrong any scheme not acceptable to them.

They are alert - determined - capable of self-defense - They have a just cause! They took Eng. at her word.

The J. Homeland was approved at San Remo by 52 nations. They came to Pal. on the assurance of G.B. + Mandate. Invested lives and fortunes. Built up a work land. Given to Pal. every-
thing that it has to-day. Paid for every foot of land they purchased - Hurt no one.

Dispossess no one -

They are not likely to submit to betrayal. To become a tolerated minority group in an

Arab State - as is now practically proposed.

Pressure from Diaspora
They will fight - and G.B. does not reheat the idea of shooting down Jews in Pal. Who came there at her own invitation and on the basis of her own promises and pledged word.

These there is still a world public opinion -
esp. in U.S. - which has to be reckoned with.
Nazi Gov. can plumb it. Forecast they too England,
counting the good-will, trust and cooperation of U.S.
can hardly do it.

(Also in England) - strong public opinion -
opposed to it.

It was no Round Table - Hardly ever met together -
Colonial Ministers met now with side - now with another
Occasionally Halifax-Chamberlain.

It was clear from very beg. that Jews had nothing to
expect - but a call for sacrifice. - And everything
to expect except sacrifices.

The real motive to serve R. Empire & to coerce Jews
into submissiveness was evidenced by the unwarranted
invitation extended by G.B. to neighboring Arab
Countries to send delegates to conference.

They had nothing to do with Pol - the Jews & Poles as if
the world were not entitled to sit in on conferences
bet. Eng. and Iraq, or Eng and Saudi Arabia, a Eng.
and Egypt.

But as a way of consolidating Arab nations
under G. B.'s aegis - and as a pressure group
upon Jews - it was a skillful diplom. move.
