OUR NEW NATIONAL BOARD MEMBER

Most of the sessions at the convention were long, the presentations heated. Even after meetings adjourned, delegates still debated and argued. But there was one session that all the delegates from Cleveland left in the same frame of mind. That was the one on Sunday, when the nominating committee brought in its report. We all rejoiced when Mrs. Abraham Strauss, our own past president, was elected to the National Board. We know that she genuinely deserves this honor! We also know that she will continue to serve the Cleveland Chapter and the general cause of Zionism in greater measure than ever before! We congratulate her and we congratulate ourselves!

THE ANSWER IS YES!

Repeatedly during the Donor Campaign we workers are asked; "Does the money really get to Palestine?" We answer unequivocally; "Yes!" It is held in trust and cabled when needed. We can go further than this and declare that not only does the money reach there but all the supplies, too. It is an interesting fact that in 26 years only one shipment of supplies has been lost—the one that went down with the S.S. Zam Zam, and for this Hadassah was insured.

Then the next question is: "Is there really any use pouring all these dollars into such a danger spot?" And again our answer is "Yes!" Why? Because it is a danger spot, and our people must be and remain prepared; because what we have built in Palestine must be mainwhat we have built in Palestine must be maintained and developed. We are still supporting all the projects and agencies we have supported in the past: the hospitals with their war emergency expansions; Child Welfare with its 25,000 children to be fed daily; the Palestine Supplies Department with its increased need for hospital supplies and pretries. creased need for hospital supplies and materia medica; and Youth Aliyah which despite the ever widening war theater received 1250 Aliyah children and 500 Palestinian youth for training this year, among which latter group were figure of national and international importance, 150 from the ill-fated S.S. Patria.

Far from reducing our activities we are taking on more responsibility. We are making a grant to the Anti-tuberculosis League for extra beds in Haifa and Jerusalem. We are including in our budget this year a committment to the Hebrew University for a Pharmaceutical Department. And we are establishing a trade school for girls in the name of Alice Seligsberg. Thus we do our share to help th Yishuv develop, conserve and organize its strength.

They are building-the Jews of Palestineand will continue to build, not for today alone, but, for the long future. They may be embattled. They have been bombed, and more bombs may fall. But there are 10,000 of our men in the English army, and we would gladly put 10 times 10,000 into service, for they will fight with the last vestige of their strength for their homeland which is not only their homeland but the very survival of the Jewish people.

"Can we buy more land?" "Yes! We are limited only by limited funds. We not only can but must buy land so that there will be room for the millions who will trek there after

Can we live peacefully with the Arabs? We have so demonstrated in the past, as well as of late. Since German and Italian propaganda has virtually ceased, so have the riots. And, post war, if England lives up to her promises, there will be peace in Palestine. As a matter of fact, the Palestinian Arab has suffered from the Arab terrorists even more than the Jew. They have benefitted physically economically and culturally by the Jews's re-

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CONVENTION

In her opening words at the Twenty-seventh Annual Convention of Hadassah in Pittsburgh, our national president, Mrs. David De Sola Pool, outlined the 1941-1942 policy, to strengthen and expand Hadassah's projects in Palestine, and to participate on the American scene in Zionist political activities as well as in American affairs;—"No longer can we take our Americanism for granted and leave the defense of democracy to specialists. Every individual, every group, every organization must make its contribution to the continuance of our way of life. That is the true essence of our American Affairs program."

"Hadassah takes its place in Zionist inter-relations and public relations with earnestness, forthrightness, and determination. We are going to study world problems, keep in touch with bodies and groups devoted to the study of peace and post war settlement, help mobilize to the utmost of our power American public opinion in support of our cause, for without that support any attempt at a solution of the Jewish problem may well end in despair or defeat . . . To be a part of a stream of thought, energy and devotion, to be dedicated to the creation of such a pattern of peace, is the aim and purpose of Hadassah's political activity, as a Zionist body, as a group of free Americans, as heirs of the Jewish moral tradition."

In a session devoted exclusively to political affairs, Dr. Nahum Goldmann, representative to the League of Nations for the Jewish Agency for Palestine, emphasized, "There is a desire today among the statesmen of the world to think in terms of a radical solution of the Jewish problem. Our job is to see that this desire is canalized into the channels of Zionism and that no illusions of other radical solutions, outside of Palestine, are permitted to crystallize."

Dr. Emanuel Neumann, of the Emergency Committee for Zionist Affairs, dealing with the same problem, stated that the final security of Palestine could only come through the addition of several hundred thousand seettlers immediately at the close of the war. He favored Youth Aliyah on a gigantic scale. "These carefully chosen young people, between the ages of 17 and 25, should be brought in at one stroke en masse, housed in tents and cantonments, organized as work camps, and then integrated into the economic life of the country with the concomitant expansion of agriculture and industry."

Dr. L. M. Birkhead, national director of Friends of Democracy, Inc., made an impassioned plea for action, "We must face the fact that our system of government is threatened by a wealthy, organized, intelligent enemy We confront the greatest crisis in our history. We must not permit ourselves to be bewildered and confused by the anti-democratic propaganda. We must support loyally and enthusiastically the program of our government. We must defend democracy on all fronts, anywhere in the world!"

Climaxing the discussion, the delegates at the convention unanimously adopted a resolution, a copy of which went to President Roosevelt, pledging the hearty support of Hadassah, and the active participation of its members in established organizations for the defense of democracy."

The HAIFA Technical Institute is being called upon to repair vital military instruments and motors for the British Army?

Of the first 100 survivors of the PATRIA, 82 at once volunteered for service in the British forces?

To date, over \$5,500,000 has been invested in dairy animals and over \$15,000,000 in building and irrigation systems on dairy farms in PALESTINE?

Two refugee Jewish physicians, working in ENGLAND, invented a new and improved method of producing anesthesia?

Military orders placed and executed in PALESTINIAN factories during the first 4 months of 1941 totalled one million pounds?

After nearly two years of war, TEL AVIV has 15 miles of NEW roads, a NEW Central Market wing, development of NEW beach areas with a NEW promenade.

The validity of ALL outstanding immigration certificates (unused because of the difficulty of war travel) has been extended, and 750 new certificates have been issued?

In the past 12 months, THIRTY-ONE shipments of supplies have been sent to Palestine by Hadassah; only one has been lost (that on the Zam Zam) and that was covered by insurance?

The first book in Hebrew on Prime Minister Winston Churchill was recently published in Tel Aviv?

A shipment of 220 tons of Palestinian bananas was sent to Russia this season by the "Tnuvah," Central Marketing Cooperative Association of Palestine?

CONVENTION NEWS

Convention trends and decisions as usual set the tone and pace for our work of the year to come. The emphasis, the supreme stress, fell upon Zionist Youth Education. Its importance for a well orientated American Youth and for the future of Zionism. Money is needed for such a program and subtle techniques that will intrigue the practical imagination of young Americans and offer it to them, in forms, and among groups that please them.

There was heavy stress on co-operation on the American scene which culminated in a Resolution to President Roosevelt offering our strength in behalf of democracy.

But even greater stress was laid on the political aspect of Zionism in relation to probable eventual settlements with the implication that it is up to the Zionists to develop, change, and unify Jewish opinion, so that there shall be an unbroken front at the peace table.

Quotas were high, but relatively little higher than last year. Nearly \$2,000,000 went to Palestine from National Hadassah this year.

The quota for Hadassah Medical Organization will again be \$535, 000. Child Welfare is boosted considerably because of the influx of refugees whose needs are desperate.

New grants were made for Hadassah's share in the new Pharmaceutical Institute and for The New Trade School for Girls.

The quota for Youth Aliyah went from \$250,000 last year to \$300,000 because all the funds held here in escrow have been used up in the transfer and training of the 1250 who entered Palestine this year under the aegis of Youth Aliyah. And in as much as children from other groups than the Youth Aliyah are receiving this training—500 this year—extra monies will be needed.

Of course the cry of more land! more land! was loud. And we accepted a quota of \$200,000 for Jewish National Fund which we must all help to fulfill.

DRAMA

The Dramatic Group in Hadassah from a small unimportant little factor, has emerged as a strong vital body. Under Mrs. Annan's direction, the group has met regularly and faithfully. They have written skits for and about Hadassah, and many amusing acts about themselves, which have been given to the hilarious amusement of the group.
