1/ Close relation bet. bravery and freedom.  
Those who are brave ultimately win and retain their F.  
Those who lack courage " lose it.  
F. is never a gift bestowed - or something had for the asking.  
It must be fought for - and paid for by the greatest sacrifices -  
And after it is won - ~~we~~ must fight to retain it.  
For it is always threatened - like land reclaimed from the sea.

2/ Those who lack courage ultimately lose it.  
And not only physical courage - which is the cornerstone of all.  
But the harder and rarer courage - for the want of which great and  
prosperous people & empires have so often in the past gone down to defeat.  
I mean the C. to harden and toughen oneself in the midst of ever-changing  
influences of prosperity, ease and the illusion of security.  
To retain the keenness, ~~and~~ the alertness and the sharp awareness of  
danger - when all about is peace and 'indolent' calm.  
The C. to forego inner dissensions, class struggle and bitter party  
strife for the sake of the higher patriotism and the sp. unity of  
the nation.

In the last 5 years, our free country of the another, was conquered  
and enslaved not because its citizens lacked physical courage, or  
were insufficiently armed, but because their virtue and moral  
had been corroded <sup>and</sup> their inner strength sapped by a false sense of  
security and more esp. by bitter class conflicts wherein citizens put  
their ~~competing~~ econ. interests above their common duties of citizenship.

3/ We are engaged - in a struggle to save our liberties - against a foe  
who has avowed his intentions to enslave the world -  
We shall require in the long, hard struggle ahead of us - a full  
quota of C. - not only phys. fortitude - we have that - our men  
at Bataan & Corregidor - at Midway and the Coral Sea have  
demonstrated it - but that harder & rarer kind.  
Self-discipline, self-restraint, the subordination of class interests to  
nat. interests, & pol. partisanship to nat. loyalty, and the curbing  
of all forms of social and religious prejudices, in the name of the  
sp. unity.

It is in this sector where, in my judgement, the war will be won or lost. We are facing a desperate, cunning, ruthless foe. The axis nations have enforced unity upon their peoples by brute force, terror, espionage and lying propaganda. They have been coordinated by violent methods of dictatorialship - But they are coordinated. They act as a unit.

The free peoples fighting them must and can match that unity - not by brutal regimentation, nor thru the sacrifice of their cherished freedoms - but by voluntary self-restraint, which free people are capable to an amazing degree - by self-sacrifice, by challenging themselves in the name of their highest national ideals, by rediscovering their better selves and returning to the mountain-top, their original motivations. Towards lose their better selves as they come up against crises and new situations in which they are not a match. (Juste).

Brave men find their better selves - And so are we rediscovering to-day the Deed, Word - The Court, the U.S. - the vision of A. Lincoln the essential genius of America we had become <sup>not hostile but</sup> indifferent, slightly cynical, - slogans, "Give us liberty or give us death" - we had liberty - so why work any more about it -

But when the <sup>longing</sup> shadow of the sword fell on the face of the earth - + approached our own fair fields & shores - and the little brown hearts of Kipling began to observe our shore from the West - when we beheld the world rapidly falling off with concentration camps - and torbar chambers - and fleeing refugees - and the killing, & butchery - and the massacre of civilian populations - and ~~hate~~ and the working schemes after

few people - and both our best and maddest energies are ~~in~~ B  
earth - then ~~we~~ suddenly our heretofore, freedom and our  
accustomed way, life became suddenly strangely dear & precious  
and to us - and wonderfully new & fresh - and with joyful  
to-day for.

4/ It is on this C. which derives from our understanding of the  
great tradition which is a - of the great Sp. Smith which  
for 150 yrs. has been our torch to the world - that we  
shall have to rely for ultimate victory - a fighting that  
set ~~it~~ <sup>+ sustained</sup> ~~by~~ <sup>passionate</sup> a remembrance, ~~conviction~~ <sup>conviction</sup> in the rightness of our cause.  
Arms are not enough. ~~Abundant~~ Ships, tanks, planes, guns are  
not enough. The great empires, the port which were conquered  
and destroyed ~~had~~ <sup>had</sup> ~~been~~ <sup>been</sup> ~~far~~ <sup>far</sup> ~~better~~ <sup>better</sup> ~~equipped~~ <sup>equipped</sup> ~~richer~~ <sup>richer</sup> ~~and~~ <sup>and</sup> ~~numerically~~ <sup>numerically</sup>

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
