# **Eisenhower Calls th**

### By the United Press.

troops began landing on the coast of northern France this morning. supreme Allied expeditionary force headquarters issued the following communique:

'Under the command of Gen. Eisenhower, Allied naval forces, supported by strong air forces, began landing operations this morning on the northern coast of France."

Gen. Eisenhower told his forces in an order of the day that they were embarking on a "great crusade" to destroy the Nazi war machine and establish a free world.

Text of Order of the Day.

The text of the order of the day:

"Soldiers, sailors and airmen of the Allied expeditionary force:

"You are about to embark upon the great crusade toward which we have striven these many months. The eyes of the world are upon The hopes and prayers of you. liberty-loving peoples everywhere march with you.

"You will bring about the destruction of the German war machine, the elimination of Nazi tyranny over the oppressed peoples of Europe and security for ourselves in a free world.

'Your task will not be an easy Your enemy is well trained. one. well equipped and battle hardened. He will fight savagely.

"But this is the year 1944. Much has happened since the Nazi triumphs of 1940-41.

flicted upon the Germans great LONDON. June 6 .- As Allied defeat in open battle man to man. Our air offensive has seriously reduced their strength in the air and their capacity to wage war on the ground.

> "Our home fronts have given us t an overwhelming superiority in n weapons and munitions of war t and placed at our disposal great reserves of trained fighting men. r

"The tide has turned.

"The free men of the world are b I marching together to victory. have full confidence in your cour-S age, devotion to duty and skill in d battle.

"We will accept nothing lesse than full victory.

"Good luck, and let us all be- U seech the blessing of Almighty t God upon this great and noble r undertaking."

The order was distributed to assault elements after their embarkation. It was read by appropriate commanders to all other troops in the Allied expeditionary forces.
